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


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

Executive Summary

CALIFORNIA PUBLIC RESOURCES CODE AND REGULATIONS

Executive Summary

Overview of the Mattress Recycling Council California, LLC

California's Used Mattress Recovery & Recycling Act, SB 254 (as amended), requires that mattress producers, through a certified "mattress recycling organization," develop, implement and administer a statewide recycling program for mattresses and foundations (collectively mattresses or units) discarded in the state and combat illegal mattress dumping.

The International Sleep Products Association (ISPA) created the Mattress Recycling Council (the Council) as a Section 501(c)(3) nonprofit corporation for this purpose. The California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) certified the Council as the mattress recycling organization and approved its statewide mattress recycling plan. The Council launched the program on December 30, 2015.

In addition to operating in California, the Council also administers similar statewide mattress recycling programs in Connecticut, Rhode Island and Oregon. Each of these state-specific mattress recycling organizations are separate nonprofit limited liability companies. The California organization is called Mattress Recycling Council California, LLC (MRC), which is now the certified mattress recycling organization. To promote each of these state programs, MRC created a consumer brand known as Bye Bye Mattress.

Year Nine Program Highlights

In 2024, MRC demonstrated consistent and meaningful improvements to achieve plan objectives and goals set by CalRecycle. The program's most notable achievements included:

- Despite declining sales, the program recycled 1,560,655 units in 2024 while providing statewide collection opportunities for residents, retailers and other businesses for the ninth consecutive year, surpassing CalRecycle's 2024 goal.
- MRC recyclers diverted from disposal 73.7% of materials sent outbound from their facilities by weight (including reuse, recycling and biomass); making more than 60 million pounds of steel, foam, fiber and wood available for use in new products.
- MRC's multichannel, multilingual consumer education strategy remains effective, generating 745 million impressions and boosting awareness of mattress recycling, retailers take back obligations and how to recycle discarded mattresses.

- MRC's Industry Workgroup on Circular Design and Industry Workgroup on New Materials met to collaborate and share information across the mattress value chain. This workgroup discusses component materials, design and construction types that may affect mattress recycling.
- MRC funded two illegally dumped mattress mitigation projects and continued to fund research projects to make mattress collection, transportation and deconstruction more efficient and to find new and better uses for recycled mattress materials.
- An important research project previously funded by MRC creating new uses for postconsumer polyurethane foam has demonstrated viability and continues to gather momentum.

Collection Network

MRC provides households and businesses with opportunities to access recycling. We continue to recruit new drop-off locations, curbside bulky item collection programs, host events and provide direct pick-up service to commercial volume generators.

Residential Collection

In 2024, residents could access mattress recycling through 242 permanent drop-off collection sites, 86 curbside bulky item collection programs, and 105 collection events.

Retail and Commercial Volumes

MRC's Commercial Volume Program (CVP) serves mattress retailers, lodging establishments, educational facilities, military bases and healthcare facilities. These entities may drop off their mattresses at designated collection sites or a recycler. Entities with at least 100 units may request no-cost transportation to a participating recycling facility.

In 2024, MRC expanded no-cost drop-off access for small volume commercial sources with less than 100 units through MRC's existing permanent drop-off collection network. During the year, 172 permanent collection sites accepted small volume drop-off from commercial sources—an increase from 154 locations in 2023.

MRC also provided on-site trailers and recurring pickups to 70 entities that consistently generated at least 100 discarded units per month, an increase from 60 in 2023.

Eligible entities that reach the 100 unit minimum less frequently than monthly may request live load pickups at their convenience. MRC conducted 290 live load pickups in 2024, an increase from 257 in 2023. Additionally, there are five regional consolidation sites for small volume generators to access a trailer at no cost.

Program Access

MRC annually measures the percentage of residents and retailers who can conveniently access the collection network. MRC evaluates program access for the general population, rural counties and environmental justice communities. We use these results to determine where to focus resources and expansion efforts.

Residential Access

Geographic analysis shows that 97.7% of California's population lived within 15 miles of MRC's permanent collection network (an MRC recycler, collection site or curbside bulky item collection program) in 2024.

Retailer Access

CalRecycle's goals require that MRC demonstrate by January 1, 2024, that 95% of rural retailers and 80% of urban retailers have convenient access to the collection network.

For these purposes, retailer access is measured as the percentage of households within a reasonable driving distance of a commercial volume drop-off location, since the discarded mattress originates at a consumer's home, not a mattress retailer's storefront.

Based on retailer feedback, CalRecycle set a 20-mile radius for urban areas and 40-mile radius for rural areas. Using this methodology, MRC found that 99.5% of rural households and 99.4% of urban households are within range of a location accepting commercial volume, surpassing the 2024 goals.

Program Collection and Disposition

The number of mattresses sold in California decreased by 3.5%, from 3,383,382 in 2023 to 3,265,445 in 2024. Despite this reduction in sales, MRC collected 1,560,655 units in 2024, a 6.1% increase from 2023. MRC attributes the increased units collected to the fact that MRC made the program more accessible to consumers and businesses.

MRC's recyclers generated 88,394,995 pounds of material, of which they diverted 65,115,035 pounds of material and units from landfill through reuse, recycling and biomass, representing a 73.7% recovery rate.

Mitigation of Illegal Dumping

In 2024, MRC continued to track illegal mattress dumping across California through its Illegally Dumped Mattress Collection Initiative. While participation remained the same, MRC recruited two new entities— one urban and one rural—and over 60,000 illegally dumped mattresses were reported.

Using Initiative data, MRC analyzed possible correlations between illegal mattress dumping and various factors, including demographics and opportunities for no-cost mattress recycling. The analysis suggests that zip codes within 15-miles of collection sites report less illegal dumping.

MRC also invited Initiative participants and all California municipalities, nonprofits and solid waste facilities that had at least one year of baseline data for illegal mattress dumping from 2023 or later to apply for MRC funding of projects to reduce illegal mattress dumping in their community. In 2024, MRC funded projects in San Benito County and Daly City.

In conjunction with these efforts, MRC attended conferences, actively participated in relevant working groups and promoted its resources on strategies for mitigating illegal dumping. In April 2024, MRC hosted a workshop facilitated by MRC and Gigantic

Idea Studio, a third-party consulting firm, at the 4th Annual Statewide Illegal Dumping Conference. The report titled "In This Together: Collaborating for Best Practices" was published in November 2024 and is available on MRC's website.

The Mitigation of Illegal Mattress Dumping chapter contains more detail on MRC's accomplishments in 2024.

Research

MRC's research program focuses on increasing mattress collection, transportation, deconstruction efficiency and identifying new and better markets for recycled mattress materials. To meet these objectives, MRC:

- Funded operational improvements to collection sites to increase landfill diversion, protect units from wet weather, decrease mattress loading times and improve worker safety when handling mattresses. Completed fire assessments at each contracted recycling facility to evaluate fire risk reduction opportunities and code compliance.
- Completed a multi-year study characterizing post-consumer foam to understand and describe a variety of characteristics, including the chemistry and physical property variation, extractable additives, residual compounds and presence of bacteria and mold.
- Completed an important study demonstrating that flexible polyurethane foam can be
 converted into moldable <u>elastomers</u> that can be used in a wide variety of consumer
 and commercial applications. Continued to foster innovation, cooperation and
 communication among suppliers, manufacturers, retailers, recyclers and end-market
 commodity buyers around the world by working with industry experts and sharing
 information on efforts to develop a circular economy for polyurethane foam.
- Continued to collaborate with mattress associations and stewardship organizations from around the world to share best practices and technological advancements to improve MRC's California recycling program.

Circularity and Sustainability

MRC's program is consistent with California's waste management hierarchy and actively addresses source reduction by focusing on reducing the environmental footprint of the mattress manufacturing process, encouraging the mattress supply chain to consider end-of-life design issues when creating new products, and encouraging consumers to maintain their mattresses properly to extend its useful life.

MRC encourages manufacturers to implement internal continuous improvement processes that will help them measure and reduce both the amount of resources consumed in manufacturing new mattresses and the waste generated from those activities. In addition, MRC created two workgroups that facilitate information sharing across the mattress industry value chain, including mattress manufacturers, component suppliers and recyclers, to improve the circularity of mattress materials.

Industry Workgroup on Circular Design and New Materials

The objective of these Industry Workgroups is to help members of the value chain take end-of-life deconstruction and recycling challenges into account when choosing new material construction types and design decisions. MRC shares lessons learned from mattress deconstruction and recycling with the industry at ISPA's annual sustainability conference where MRC's work is featured.


Sleep Products Sustainability Program

To encourage mattress manufacturers to reduce the environmental impact of their mattress assembly operations (and thereby support California's source reduction goals), MRC's Sleep Products Sustainability Program (SP2) offers a proactive approach that California mattress manufacturers may use to reduce waste and increase operational efficiencies. SP2 helps companies establish an environmental management system that identifies steps for reducing environmental impacts, developing best practices and defining metrics to track progress. SP2 can also serve as a foundation for pursuing an ISO 14001 certification, the international standard for effective environmental management systems. Training, program resources and certification are all offered at no-cost to eligible California mattress manufacturers.

Consumer Education and Outreach

Throughout the life of the program, MRC has built a consumer-facing brand known as Bye Bye Mattress. It is supported by a multichannel, multilingual consumer education and outreach strategy focused on promoting the collection network, raising awareness of the retailer take-back requirement and discouraging illegal dumping.

In 2024, MRC's consumer advertising campaigns, public service announcement, media coverage and social media content generated over 745 million impressions. We supplemented these efforts by providing mattress retailers, collection sites, recyclers and public officials with tools they can use to promote retailer take back and mattress recycling in their communities. Program Collection, Transportation and Processing

Mattress Collection

In 2024, MRC continued to recruit mattress collection sites, making it more convenient for California consumers and businesses to have their mattresses recycled at no charge by MRC, either by dropping their units off at a collection site or by otherwise accessing the network. Table 6 summarizes MRC's collection network in 2024 and Figure 1 geographically illustrates the network. Refer to Appendix B for a list of all the locations.

Collection Channels

MRC collects used mattresses through the following channels in California:

- 1. Retailers take back
- 2. Permanent collection sites
- 3. Curbside bulky item collection
- 4. Mattress collection events
- 5. Commercial Volume Program (CVP)

In 2024, MRC:

- Contracted with 242 permanent collection sites that collected units from consumers, a net increase of two from 2023.
- Contracted with 86 entities that received curbside bulky items collected units, a
 decrease of one from 2023. Of these, 60 were operated by franchise haulers and
 municipalities at SWFs that also serve as permanent collection sites, with the
 remaining 26 being operated by franchise haulers and municipalities at a private yard,
 and therefore not at SWFs.
- Participated in 105 collection events in 2024.
- Contracted with 70 CVP sites with permanent on-site trailers, an increase of 10 from 2023.
- Picked up 290 live loads from 101 temporary CVP sites in 2024, an increase of 33 live loads from 2023.

In 2025, MRC will continue to expand the permanent collection network in areas that increase access for California consumers and commercial entities, who can learn more about the drop-off and recycling options available to them at ByeByeMattress.com.

Appendix B contains a list of all locations by type.

Collection Site Types

Retailer Take Back

Any retailer that delivers a new mattress to a California consumer must offer to take back a mattress that the consumer has discarded upon request at no cost. Consumers can use this collection channel when purchasing a new mattress. Retailers then may recycle the used mattresses at no cost through the program (MRC bears the cost of recycling).

Permanent Collection Sites

Since the program's inception, MRC has created a robust, permanent collection network throughout California where residents may discard used mattresses for recycling. MRC initially targeted SWFs and later focused its site recruitment efforts on underserved areas by adding alternative collection locations, such as nonprofits, public agencies, Native Nations and California Redemption Value (CRV) recycling centers.

As of December 31, 2024, the California program had 242 permanent collection sites. These sites are listed in <u>Appendix B</u>.

Except for mattress recyclers, MRC pays contracted collection sites a handling fee if they accept mattresses from the public at no cost (MRC compensates recyclers for serving as collection sites as part of the general recycling services they provide). MRC bears the cost of transporting the units to a recycler and recycling them.

The specific types of permanent mattress collection sites that the program offers California residents and commercial entities are as follows:

Solid Waste Facilities

SWFs comprise the majority of MRC's permanent collection network. In 2024, MRC contracted with 174 SWFs (a net increase of four since 2023), 57 of which operate in rural counties of the state, an increase of two from 2023. All of these sites accept mattresses dropped off by residents at no cost, and 107 accept drop off from commercial entities at no cost, an increase of seven from 2023.

MRC uses annual mattress disposal data that SWFs report to CalRecycle to identify which SWFs to recruit as potential new collection sites. This resulted in MRC adding a net increase of four SWFs to the collection network in 2024. MRC is continuing this recruitment effort in 2025.

Mattress Recyclers

In most cases, MRC recyclers accept mattresses directly from residents and commercial entities at no cost. In 2024, MRC's recycling network consisted of 10 locations throughout California and one location in Oregon. Recyclers in California track the number of units they receive from each of the following sources (<u>Program Collection and Disposition Data section contains the number of units collected from each source</u>):

- **Retailer Drop-off:** This includes units that mattress retailers drop off at recyclers using their own transportation or using MRC's CVP services but excludes units that retailers drop off to SWFs.
- **Institutional Drop-off:** This includes units from hotels, educational facilities and other large-volume mattress purchasers that deliver units to recyclers using their own transportation or use MRC's CVP services.
- Consumer Incentive Payment (CIP): Units collected through MRC's CIP program, which allows California residents to drop off discarded mattresses at specified recyclers and receive an incentive payment of \$3 per unit for as many as five units per vehicle per day.

In 2024, the Oregon recycling facility only received one dedicated load from one permanent collection site in northern California.

Nonprofits

MRC contracts with nonprofit organizations such as Goodwill, Habitat for Humanity ReStore and Local Conservation Corps to serve as permanent collection sites.

Depending on the site, residents and/or commercial entities may drop off units at these nonprofit sites at no cost. In 2024, 14 nonprofits accepted mattresses from the public through MRC's program. Additionally, 13 of the 14 nonprofits accept commercial dropoffs at no cost.

CRV Recycling Locations

MRC contracts with collection centers that participate in the CRV Beverage Container Recycling Program. In 2024, California residents and commercial entities could drop off mattresses at two CRV recycling centers throughout the state, a decrease of one from 2023. Additionally, one CRV location is located in a rural county.

Mattress Retailers

To increase mattress retailer and residential access to the program, MRC contracts directly with some mattress retailers to become permanent collection sites. In 2024, MRC had eight permanent collection sites at retailers, a net increase of one from 2023. Both California residents and commercial entities may drop off mattresses at all retail drop-off locations. Additionally, four of the eight retailers are located in rural counties.

Mattress Renovators

Residents and businesses may drop off discarded units at mattress renovators at no cost. In 2024, six mattress renovators collected mattresses through MRC's program, a decrease of one from 2023. The mattresses they did not renovate were sent to MRC recyclers for dismantling. In 2024, MRC continued to recruit renovators identified through annual data reported to CalRecycle to become permanent collection sites.

Other

In 2024, MRC contracted with six local businesses, 23 public agencies and one Native Nation to be mattress collectors. Of these, one local business, two public agencies and one Native Nation are in rural counties.

Curbside Bulky Item Collection

Some franchise haulers and municipalities provide curbside bulky item collection of mattresses at no additional charge to residents. Residents schedule a pickup for their discarded mattress. Participating haulers and municipalities collect the mattress and load it into an MRC-provided trailer positioned at their yard or SWF. MRC transports full trailers to recyclers for dismantling.

Units may be collected through bulky item pickups through either of two processes:

- MRC contracts with a municipality or franchise hauler to recycle units collected through its existing bulky item program. The MRC-provided trailers in which these units are consolidated are located at private yards and are not publicly accessible. In 2024, MRC collected mattresses from 26 municipalities or franchise haulers in this way.
- 2. Some SWF operators that have contracted with MRC to serve as a permanent collection site that is accessible to the public also collect mattresses from bulky item pickup services. These SWFs consolidate mattresses collected curbside in an MRC-provided trailer with other units dropped off at the permanent collection site. In 2024, MRC collected mattresses from 60 collection sites that accept mattresses from bulky

item programs, an increase of two sites from 2023. To avoid double counting, these locations are counted under the SWF category and not counted again under the curbside collection category in Table 6.

Mattress Collection Events

MRC hosts mattress collection events in areas that may benefit from enhanced residential access. MRC partners with municipalities, waste services providers, Local Conservation Corps, Native Nations, retailers and other interested parties to hold collection events. When hosting events, MRC provides the necessary labor, transportation, recycling and publicity.

MRC often combines mattress collection events with events accepting other products to increase convenience for residents, target underserved areas or mitigate illegal dumping.

In 2024, MRC participated in 105 collection events. Notably, 16 of these events provided access in nine rural counties (Del Norte, El Dorado, Glenn, Humboldt, Kings, Madera, Siskiyou, Sutter, and Tuolumne).

Each year, MRC collects less than 1% of mattresses in California through events. In areas with accessible collection sites and minimal illegal dumping, we collaborate with organizations to promote existing permanent sites instead of hosting events. MRC actively evaluates requests, prioritizing events in areas lacking access, high rates of illegal dumping or environmental justice areas. As a result, the number of events decreased by 19.6% in 2024 compared to 2023 and some events were canceled in select communities.

In 2024, MRC partnered with Paintcare and Thermostat Care to host a collection event in South Lake Tahoe. MRC used social media to promote this event, which was co-promoted with Paintcare. As a result of this event, MRC was able to raise awareness about its program and collect over 40 mattresses.

Commercial Volume Program (CVP) Services

MRC provides no-cost transportation and recycling of discarded mattresses from retailers, lodging establishments, educational institutions, healthcare facilities and military bases if they have at least 100 discarded units to be picked up at a single site.

MRC provides transportation in three ways:

1. Permanent On-Site Trailers: If a business generates at least 100 mattresses per month at a particular location, MRC provides a permanent on-site trailer at a specific location. This arrangement works well when a retail chain uses a central distribution center from which it delivers mattresses that consumers purchased in the chain's multiple retail storefronts and then consolidates the discarded mattresses that its delivery teams take back from consumers when the delivery trucks return to the distribution center at the end of their delivery run. In this manner, MRC can provide efficient collection service for all of a retailer's storefronts within its local distribution network. In 2024, the number of on-site trailers increased from 60 to 70.

- 2. Temporary CVP Site (Live Loads): For businesses that generate at least 100 units at a time at a particular location, but not on a monthly basis, MRC does not provide a permanent on-site trailer. Instead, MRC dispatches a truck and trailer to the collector when requested and the units are loaded into the trailer while the driver waits. This is referred to as a "live load" pickup. In 2024, MRC provided 290 live load pickups for 101 CVP entities resulting in a 12.8% increase in live load pickups from the previous year.
- 3. **Consolidation Locations:** To provide a no-cost drop-off for smaller retailers and businesses, MRC positions centrally located trailers where these entities can consolidate the mattresses that they collect. By the end of 2024, MRC had a total of five strategically placed commercial consolidation locations.

Small Volume Commercial Loads

To provide no-cost drop-off for commercial sources generating smaller volumes (that is, fewer than 100 units at a time), some permanent collection sites will accept small commercial loads. By the end of 2024, 172 permanent collection sites accepted no-cost drop-off for small commercial loads, an increase of 18 from 2023. To avoid double-counting, these locations are counted under the Permanent Collection Site category and not counted again under the CVP category in Table 7.

In order not to undermine mattress renovation, as intended by the Legislature, MRC is communicating with renovators regarding the CVP program. MRC also provides a list of compliant renovators to businesses that are not eligible for CVP transportation services. Refer to the Reuse section for more details.

Table 7 shows the total number of collection sites by type from 2020 through 2024.

Collection Site Mattress Management

When adding new collection sites, MRC provides on-site training and guidelines to educate site staff regarding proper handling, efficient stacking techniques and best practices to increase the recyclability of mattresses received. MRC's Program Operation Materials Guidelines (Appendix C) are included in all collection site and event contracts.

The guidelines define products eligible and ineligible for recycling and explain how collectors can efficiently load mattresses into trailers. They also describe non-recyclable mattresses (e.g., those that are wet, insect-infested, excessively soiled, etc.) and how to identify bedbug-infested units.

To further assist collection sites in identifying and managing instances of bedbug contamination, MRC offers an online training video about bedbugs that collection site staff can access on demand. MRC's Resources Library for a link to the video.

MRC also offers a video series (available in MRC's <u>Resources Library</u>) that addresses efficient mattress stacking and loading, effective collection site operations, program and non-program products identification and collection event promotion. The series is available in English and Spanish.

To assist new collection sites with onboarding, MRC visits new and existing locations annually, or as needed. In 2024, MRC staff conducted routine site visits providing collection sites with supplemental training and resources. During site visits, staff answer questions, confirm whether the site is following the guidelines, provide updates on how a site may apply to MRC for improvement funds, provide resources on stacking and loading of mattresses to improve efficiency, offer suggestions to maintain the quality of collected mattresses and provide necessary signage, invoicing support, etc.

In 2024, MRC funded, completed and reimbursed 11 collection site projects. MRC awards funds for projects intended to increase the recyclability of mattresses or improve efficiency (such as a covered/paved mattress storage area to keep the units dry and clean, forklift equipment, etc.). The Research section contains more information.

Coordination with Existing Infrastructure

MRC must coordinate with existing used mattress collection programs and recycling programs, including nonprofits, and meet the requirements of Cal. Pub. Res. Code § 42987.1. Since 2016, MRC has demonstrated year-over-year growth in the collection network, increasing the number of collection sites, bulky item collection programs, events and CVP activity.

Existing Used Mattress Collection Programs

Solid Waste Facilities

In 2024, MRC contracted with 174 SWFs. To expand participation from this segment of the waste industry, MRC identified potential new locations from the list of SWFs that report landfilled mattresses to CalRecycle. MRC contacted viable SWFs on the list that were not already part of our collection network to explain the benefits of working with MRC.

Bulky Item Collection Programs

In 2024, MRC used data from a variety of sources to target additional curbside bulky item collection programs that could participate in the program. To further coordinate with existing used mattress collection programs and increase consumer access to no-cost recycling in California, MRC contracts with municipalities and franchise haulers that provide curbside bulky item pickup at no additional cost. By the end of 2024, 26 bulky item programs and 60 SWFs that consolidate mattresses collected at curbside in an MRC provided container participated in its collection network.

In 2025, MRC will continue efforts to target additional bulky item collection programs that could participate with MRC.

Retailer Take Back

Many mattress retailers collected units from their customers before the program was launched. MRC leverages this pre-existing practice by working with retailers to bring these mattresses to MRC's recyclers, either by direct drop-off or through the CVP. This practice benefits both the mattress consumer and retailer and increases the volume of mattresses diverted from landfills.

Collecting mattresses directly from retailers also increases the likelihood that the collected mattress will be recyclable, as compared to units obtained from SWFs and bulky item collection programs. When mattresses are mixed with regular trash and other municipal solid waste, they can be crushed and contaminated to the point that few or no parts of the units can be recycled. Discarded units obtained directly from retailers tend to be dry and cleaner, allowing the recycler to reclaim more and better-quality materials that can command higher prices.

Other Relevant Parties

MRC further uses the existing solid waste infrastructure to expand its collection network by:

- Coordinating with municipalities and franchise haulers to hold mattress collection events
- Contracting with CRV recycling centers, Local Conservation Corps, Native Nations, nonprofits, retailers and mattress renovators to act as collection locations.

Existing Recycling Programs, Including Nonprofit Mattress Recyclers

In April 2015, MRC requested proposals to provide transportation and recycling services at locations throughout the state. As part of this process, MRC contacted all known mattress recyclers in California (including nonprofit recyclers) and publicized the request by posting it on MRC's website. MRC also visited all active for-profit and nonprofit mattress recyclers in California to assess their capabilities, interest in participating in the program and future plans. Among the companies that responded to our request were three existing nonprofit and 11 for-profit recyclers. After evaluating the proposals based on the price offered to provide the requested recycling services, recycling experience, quality of proposal and facility capabilities, MRC awarded contracts to six recyclers (including four for-profits and two nonprofits). Five were existing mattress recyclers and one was an existing recycler of other products.

Since the program launched in 2015, MRC's recycler network has evolved. Several of the initial recyclers changed or added facility locations, others are no longer under contract with MRC and MRC has added several new recyclers as the program has grown.

In December 2017, MRC requested proposals to better serve the San Francisco Bay Area, Fresno, the city of Los Angeles, Los Angeles County and Orange County. Likewise, in October 2018, MRC requested proposals to serve the city of Fresno or Fresno County, Tulare County, Kings County or Madera County. Each of the recyclers that MRC added in 2017 and 2018 had experience recycling other products, both in California and elsewhere.

In 2024, MRC requested proposals to provide mattress recycling services at locations throughout the state of California. MRC promoted the request by contacting all known mattress recyclers and posting the announcements on our website, in newsletters and on social media. A total of 10 businesses submitted proposals and MRC selected seven to operate nine recycling facilities in 2025.

In deciding whether to award recycling contracts, MRC has consistently considered the same factors: price, recycling experience, quality of proposal and facility capabilities.

As of December 31, 2024, eight MRC recyclers operated 11 facilities (four facilities are operated by a nonprofit). One recycling facility is located in Oregon. <u>Appendix B</u> contains a list of MRC's existing recyclers (and their locations).

MRC's Coordination with Existing Mattress Collectors and Recyclers to Efficiently Deliver Services

As MRC established and expanded its collection and recycling network, it sought to deliver services efficiently and minimize duplication of effort by applying the following principles:

- To bring large quantities of discarded units into the program efficiently, MRC leverages existing retailer take-back practices and contracts with California's existing solid waste collection infrastructure to become convenient no-cost mattress collection sites.
- MRC strategically selects collectors and recyclers to build a network that both provides California residents with statewide access to recycling services and minimizes transportation costs.

Therefore, in building its mattress collection and recycling network, MRC has succeeded in coordinating with existing used mattress collection and recycling entities, including nonprofits, and has supported the broader California recycling community by contracting with existing facilities that collect and recycle mattresses and other products.

Prioritization of In-State Processing Facilities

In 2024, MRC used in-state and out-of-state processing facilities to recycle program mattresses. MRC contracted with one non-profit recycler in Oregon to process a limited number of California mattresses. By using this facility, MRC maximized its transportation efficiencies and controlled costs. Appendix B contains a list of MRC recyclers.

Mattress Transportation

For each MRC collection site in California, MRC pays for or provides storage containers that are appropriate for the size and location of each facility. MRC uses 53-, 48- and 28-foot trailers, as well as sea containers and roll-off bins for sites with limited space or other logistical constraints. The 53-foot trailer is preferred because it can hold the most mattress units, resulting in a lower per unit transport cost. Roll-off containers, which are the smallest storage option, are the least efficient alternative, but may be the only option for collection sites with small or restricted loading areas. All containers that MRC provides are covered to reduce contamination of the mattresses and eliminate damage from weather.

To provide mattress transportation throughout the state, MRC contracts with mattress recyclers, third-party logistics companies, transportation companies and SWFs to pick up and transport mattresses from specific facilities.

In 2024, MRC launched MyMRC, a new logistics and database portal for California transporters, recyclers and collection sites. Transporters can manage pickup requests (accepting, rejecting, or diverting) and make docking appointments with recyclers, and recyclers can communicate their dock availability to transporters. All users are able to report feedback and access real-time data and reporting. MRC is also available to assist with any issues that may arise regarding transportation and logistics.

Collection sites that do not transport units using their own equipment will use MyMRC to request or cancel pickups from an MRC-contracted transporter when a full container is ready to be picked up and swapped for an empty one. For sites located in urban areas, MRC transporters have 48 hours to swap a trailer after receiving a request, and up to five days for sites in rural areas. Mattresses are bulky and light cargo, and as a result, efficient transportation helps control costs. MRC assigns mattress loads to individual recyclers to achieve efficiency throughout the collection network.

Mattress Processing and Recycling

Recycler Procedures

After discarded mattresses arrive at a recycling facility, the recycler unloads the container. Mattresses contaminated with bedbugs or putrescible solid waste are typically not recycled and are separated to minimize facility contamination and worker exposure and then landfilled.

Non-contaminated mattresses then are dismantled. The outer ticking layer is removed so each internal component material can be separated. The dismantling process varies from one recycler to the next, but most use a combination of manual and mechanical processes. Each recyclable material type is separated and sometimes compressed into bales for shipment to buyers. The <u>Uses for Recycled Materials</u> section contains details regarding what happens to each material type after consolidation at recyclers.

Some recyclers separate and sell high-quality used mattresses or their component materials to renovators, who use them to renovate mattresses for sale in secondary markets.

Uses for Recycled Materials

Recyclers sell or pay to have materials from used mattresses and foundations manufactured into new products or used for alternative purposes. The Program
Disposition Data section contains quantitative information. Although there were no significant changes in these uses in 2024, MRC continues to invest in research to identify new end markets to increase the program's recycling rate, help MRC's recyclers become more financially sustainable and expand secondary markets for mattress components. The Research section contains more detail.

Steel Wire: Most used mattresses contain steel springs, either in the form of innersprings or pocketed (polypropylene fabric-encased) coils. Likewise, most used foundations contain a steel wire interior structure. The steel from both mattresses and foundations can be shredded or baled for sale in steel scrap

markets. Steel mills then purchase the scrap steel and re-melt it for use in manufacturing new steel products, such as appliances, automobiles and building products.

In 2024, most California scrap metal recyclers continued to reject unprocessed pocketed coils for recycling because the polypropylene fabric and any glued layers attached are a contaminant which accounts for up to 25% of the pocketed coil's weight. Only two recycling facilities were able to work with third party scrap metal recyclers willing to accept their unprocessed pocketed coils. Rather than landfill thousands of tons of pocketed coils, MRC transported this material from six California recycling facilities to companies in Los Angeles and Fresno that removed the fabric and sold the steel to scrap markets. Three recycling facilities processed some or all their own pocketed coils in 2024.

Foam: The interiors of most mattresses contain one or more layers of polyurethane and/or latex foam. After the outer quilt panel is removed, the recycler separates the inner foam layers for baling and sale to scrap purchasers. Nearly all post-consumer foam is sold to carpet underlayment manufacturers to make carpet padding where scrap foam is chopped into small pieces, mixed with rebonding adhesive and exposed to steam to cure the mixture. The result is a large rebond foam cylinder that is cut into thin sheets to make carpet pads. The feedstock for carpet padding is mostly post-industrial polyurethane foam but may also contain a small percentage of used carpet pads, as well as post-consumer mattress foam and quilt panels. In 2024, demand for recycled foam fluctuated significantly, staying low early in the year and increasing towards year end. As consumer preferences shift from carpet to hard surface flooring alternatives, we expect the value and demand for post-consumer foam and quilt to continue declining. The Research section contains additional discussion on this topic.

Quilt Panel: The mattress sleep surface (that is, the top layer of a one-sided "no-flip" mattress and the top and bottom layers of a two-sided mattress) is typically a decorative outer fabric (also called ticking), one or more layers of fiber batting, non-woven fabric or foam (polyurethane and/or latex) and a thin backing (usually a non-woven fabric). These layers usually are stitched or "quilted" together. Once the quilt panel has been removed from the mattress, recyclers bale it for sale separately from other reclaimed commodities.

Demand for recycled quilt panels is limited for several reasons. First, quilt panels lack consistent construction and materials. Second, quilt panels are more likely to become contaminated with dirt, water, bodily fluids or other environmental impurities because they are the outermost layer of a mattress. As a result, nearly all quilt panels are sold to carpet underlayment manufacturers, which chop the quilt into small pieces to make carpet pads. In this application, the post-consumer quilt panel represents a small percentage of the finished carpet pad. In 2024, the amount of recycled quilt panels decreased due to a decline in demand from manufacturers for the material.




Foundation Wood: Most consumers use a foundation or box spring underneath their mattress. The foundation raises the sleep surface of the

mattress to a comfortable height and helps prolong the life of the mattress by acting as a shock absorber. A typical foundation is composed of a wood frame assembled using nails or staples. A steel wire structure attached to the wood frame by staples or nails provides the spring support for the foundation. Some foundations contain an all-wood interior structure instead of a steel wire structure. The sides of the foundation are typically covered by a decorative ticking, while a non-woven fabric typically covers the top and bottom.

To dismantle a foundation, recyclers remove the ticking and non-woven fabric, then shear or shred the unit to separate the metal from the wood. If the wood is free of significant metal or fabric contamination, it can be finely shredded for use as mulch or, in some limited cases, as compost. Some recyclers also send wood to biomass facilities, where it is burned to generate energy.

In 2024, one recycler sold post-consumer foundation wood to a facility that remanufactures wood pallets.



Other Fiber: Many mattresses also contain layers made from one or more other types of fiber. Depending on the construction of the mattress, these fibers may include polyester, rayon and other synthetic fibers, wool, horse and other animal hair and coconut fiber. MRC determined that coconut and cotton fibers can be composted at commercial composting facilities. Nevertheless, recycling options for these other fibers are limited. As a result, most are typically landfilled.



Shoddy Felt: Another common layer of mattresses is shoddy felt (also called shoddy pad or just shoddy). This material is typically placed between the metal springs and foam layers to insulate the foam from sharp points on the springs and prevent the foam from working its way into the springs over time.

Shoddy is a non-woven material comprised of mixed shredded recycled post-industrial fabric and apparel. Given the mixed nature of fiber types used to make shoddy, it is currently cost prohibitive to separate into different fiber categories, so the material is usually landfilled.



Plastics: Retailers often place the discarded mattresses they collect from consumers in plastic bags (usually polyethylene) so that dirt, bedbugs or other biological materials on the discarded units do not contaminate new

units being delivered on the same truck. These bags frequently cover discarded mattresses when they arrive at the recycler. Most recyclers bale and sell this material to plastic recycling companies, where the bags are converted into plastic pellets. Manufacturers of new plastic products melt and use recycled plastic as a feedstock in their manufacturing processes. Potential end uses for these pellets include composite plastic lumber and plastic film products.



Cardboard: Mattress foundations may contain a layer of cardboard that separates the wood base structure from the bottom non-woven fabric. Recyclers bale the cardboard and sell the bales to companies that make chipboard for cereal boxes, corrugated cardboard and other packaging materials.

Materials Management/Waste Hierarchy

MRC and its recyclers implement the program consistently with California's solid waste management hierarchy: source reduction, reuse (including renovation), recycling, composting, biomass, transformation/waste to energy (WTE) and landfill. The following describes activities MRC undertakes that are consistent with each waste management tier in the hierarchy. Associated data is provided in the Program Disposition Data section.

Source Reduction

Healthy, restorative sleep is essential to physical and psychological well-being. The mattress industry manufactures durable, comfortable and affordable products to meet those needs. Almost every American consumer will sleep on a mattress for all their life. These are long-term durable goods that consumers use over a multi-year period. MRC's source reduction efforts focus on reducing the environmental footprint of the mattress manufacturing process, encouraging the mattress supply chain to consider end-of-life design issues when designing new products and encouraging consumers to maintain their mattresses properly to extend their useful life. MRC encourages manufacturers to implement internal continuous improvement processes that will help them measure and reduce both the amount of resources consumed in manufacturing new mattresses and the amount of waste generated from those activities. In addition, MRC has formed workgroups that facilitate information sharing across the mattress industry value chain, including mattress manufacturers, component suppliers and recyclers, to improve the recyclability of mattress materials. In 2024, MRC continued to build consumer awareness of mattress care best practices with a rotating series of eight social media posts.

Additional information about each of these sustainability initiatives is found in the Research and Education and Outreach chapters of this report.

Reuse (including Renovation)

Reuse follows source reduction in California's waste management hierarchy. In mattress waste management, reuse includes mattresses handed down to friends or family, mattresses sold in used furniture stores and mattress renovation. Used mattress retailers and mattress renovators were active in California before MRC launched the program and remain active today.

Statewide Renovation Trends

When California enacted SB 254, the Legislature stated its intent that the new law "not undermine existing used mattress recycling, resale, refurbishing, and reuse operations that are in compliance with state and federal law." According to CalRecycle data, renovators reported 179,984 units in 2024. Table 8 shows the number of units renovated from 2020 to 2024.

Overall demand for renovated units, which tend to be sold primarily at lower price points, are constrained by low-priced imports of new mattresses. Official U.S. import and industry statistics show that imported mattresses accounted for 23% of total mattress units shipped into the United States in 2024, placing competitive pressure on both renovators and manufacturers that sell units at the lower end of the mattress market.

MRC has taken a number of actions consistent with legislative intent. For example, six renovators contracted with MRC in 2024 to serve as permanent collection sites that receive mattresses directly from the public and commercial entities. Under this arrangement, the renovator may select discarded units it wants to renovate and place the remainder in MRC-provided trailers for transport at MRC's expense to recyclers for processing. MRC pays a handling fee for the discarded units sent to recyclers.

In 2024, MRC also provided recyclers with a list of renovators that comply with applicable California and federal bedding requirements (as required by SB 254) and may purchase whole units and materials from recyclers.

In addition to the discarded units that renovators may cull from the units they collect, renovators in 2024 also purchased 6,090 units and an estimated 5,490,678 pounds of whole units plus deconstructed materials from MRC recyclers for reuse and renovation,

a 24% increase from their 2023 purchases. MRC will update the list of compliant renovators in 2025 and will continue to monitor the relationships between recyclers and renovators for future annual reports.

CalRecycle established that a baseline of 225,000 units were renovated in 2018 and monitors this number annually. According to CalRecycle data, renovators reported that they renovated 179,984 units in 2024. This is a 5% decrease from the units reported as renovated in 2023. The CalRecycle data provided to MRC is incomplete, with only 40 out of 47 known renovators reporting in 2024. Additionally, the reported data may not be precise, as 15% of reporting renovators based the number of units that they reported in 2024 on conversion factors and estimates rather than actual counts and company records. Economic factors, such as low housing sales and high inflation, further contribute to the decrease in demand for renovated mattresses. Similarly, the economic conditions in 2024 caused total mattress units sold in California and reported to MRC to decrease 3.5% below 2023 levels. The Good Faith Effort section contains additional information.

Therefore, far from undermining renovators, the statewide program benefits them. Renovators may both cull units from the discards that they collect and purchase whole units and materials from recyclers for renovation. MRC is informing recyclers about renovators that have complied with California law and are thereby eligible to purchase units and materials from recyclers. Renovators that serve as collection sites pay nothing to have residents drop off units at their facilities and then select which of those units to renovate. Those collectors incur no-cost to transport the rejected units to a recycler or landfill. They simply place the rejects in an MRC-provided trailer and MRC pays to have them taken to a recycler. MRC compensates these collectors for the discarded units transported to a recycler for processing.

MRC Recyclers and Renovation

As discussed in the <u>Recycler Procedures</u> section, some recyclers sell whole mattresses and component materials to renovators. MRC pays recyclers the same to dismantle units, regardless of whether the materials reclaimed from this process are sold to renovators or others in the secondary markets. MRC does not compensate recyclers when they sell whole mattresses directly to renovators. The recycler instead is paid for the unit by the renovator. This financial arrangement benefits both the recycler and renovator, allowing the renovator to buy whole mattresses and components.

Renovators as MRC Permanent Collection Sites

MRC lists California-based renovators that contract to serve as used mattress collection locations on its Bye Bye Mattress Recycling Locator. In 2024, six renovators served as permanent collection sites for residents, retailers and commercial entities. MRC transports unrenovated units collected at these sites to recyclers for dismantling. In 2024, MRC transported 48,392 units (equivalent to a weight of 2.6 million pounds of material)

from these renovators to MRC recyclers. In 2024, MRC also reached out to renovators about becoming new permanent collection sites. MRC will continue efforts to identify renovators that could serve as drop-off points.

Renovators on ByeByeMattress.com

Consistent with California's solid waste management hierarchy and to increase California consumers' access to MRC's collection network, MRC contracts with renovators that comply with applicable California and federal bedding requirements (as required by SB 254) to serve as permanent collection sites. MRC includes these locations on its Byee Mattress Recycling Locator.

Renovators and Program Development

MRC considers the views of renovators and other interested stakeholders when setting program policies. For example, when MRC developed the CIP program, it sought input from the Mattress Advisory Committee (on which the renovator segment is represented) regarding the level of incentive that consumers should receive when dropping off discarded mattresses and foundations at an MRC recycler. After considering different incentive levels, the committee advised MRC that setting the incentive above \$3 per unit could harm renovation. MRC accepted the committee's advice and capped the incentive at \$3 per unit, up to five units per vehicle per day. In 2024, MRC communicated with contracted renovator collectors to minimize the impact of CVP on their supply chain.

MRC avoids recruiting CVP participants already serviced by renovators. MRC also provides to CVP entities not eligible for transportation the list of recyclers, collection sites accepting commercial drop-off and renovators that comply with applicable California and federal bedding requirements (as required by SB 254).

Education and Outreach to Renovator

During program development and in subsequent years, MRC has informed all known renovators about their obligations and opportunities under SB 254. Renovators receive the same program updates that MRC sends to retailers and other program participants. Therefore, MRC has implemented the program consistent with both this tier of the waste management hierarchy and the Legislature's intent that the program not undermine the resale, refurbishment and reuse of discarded mattresses.

Recycling

Recycling is the third priority in California's waste management hierarchy. The program is designed to increase both the number of discarded mattresses diverted from California's landfills and the recycling of post-consumer mattress materials.

To achieve this result, MRC has established a robust, diverse and geographically accessible mattress collection network that is continually improving. Among other things, MRC provides enclosed containers to protect discarded mattresses from weather damage during storage and transport and funds research and activities to improve the

recyclability of mattresses. Once a recycler receives a discarded mattress, it dismantles the unit and separates the component materials for sale or use in secondary markets. Materials for which no market exists or that cannot be recycled (because they are contaminated or mixed with other materials) are usually landfilled.

MRC follows 10 strategies to promote mattress recycling:

- SWF Compensation: The Program compensates participating solid waste facilities
 and other collection locations at negotiated rates for handling mattresses that they
 accept free of charge from consumers and businesses. Additionally, MRC provides
 no-cost storage, transport and recycling of these units. This reduces the quantity of
 discarded mattresses that the facilities would otherwise landfill.
- 2. Mattress Retailers (Retailer Take-Back Obligation): Mattress retailers must offer a consumer the option to have a used mattress picked up for recovery at no cost when they deliver a new mattress. This is an important way for California consumers to access the MRC network in a convenient manner. Since the Program encourages retailers to make the discarded mattresses they collect available for recycling through the Program free of charge, this provision diverts additional quantities of discarded mattresses that a consumer otherwise would dispose of through existing solid waste collection systems.
- 3. No-Cost Retailer Recycling: Retailers can recycle mattresses they pick up through the retailer take-back obligation at no cost through MRC's program. Retailers generating more than 100 discarded units may request no-cost pick-up through MRC's Commercial Volume Program. Additionally, many public collection locations in MRC's network also accept discarded units from retailers. Discarded mattresses that retailers provide for recycling reduce the quantity of discarded mattresses that they send to landfills. The Mattress Collection and Retailer Access sections contain more detail.
- 4. No-Cost Business Recycling (Commercial Entities): Business or large-volume mattress consumers (such as hotels, dormitories, nursing homes, etc.) generating discarded mattresses may provide these units to an MRC-contracted recycling facility at no cost. Businesses generating more than 100 discarded units may request no-cost pick-up through MRC's Commercial Volume Program. Additionally, many public collection locations in MRC's network also accept discarded units from businesses. The Mattress Collection and Commercial Volume Program sections contain more detail.
- No-Cost Consumer Drop Offs at SWFs: California residents may drop off
 mattresses at participating solid waste facilities and other public drop-off sites
 throughout California at no-cost. The <u>Mattress Collection</u> section contains more
 detail
- 6. **Consumer Incentive:** MRC offers California residents that deliver discarded mattresses directly to select MRC-contracted drop-off locations a payment. This reduces the quantity of mattresses that consumers would otherwise have disposed

- of through existing solid waste collection options and sent to landfills. The <u>Consumer Incentive Payment</u> section contains more detail.
- 7. MRC Recyclers' Target: MRC's recyclers are responsible for dismantling discarded mattresses and foundations, selling or otherwise identifying a use for the reclaimed materials in secondary markets, and disposing of the waste or otherwise unrecyclable material. A recycler has financial incentives to recycle as much of a mattress as it can because it keeps the revenue it earns from the sale of those materials and incurs costs when sending waste and unrecyclable materials to landfills. To further incentivize the amount of mattress materials recycled through the program, MRC's recyclers are expected to recycle 75% by weight of the units they process, but some recyclers have encountered difficulty meeting this requirement. The Program
 Disposition Data contains more detail.
- 8. **Mitigate Illegal Dumping:** MRC compensates participating entities (local governments, solid waste facilities, solid waste operations and others) in its Illegally Dumped Mattress Collection Initiative for providing data about the number of illegally dumped mattresses they collect in their communities. This information identifies those areas of the state where illegally dumped mattresses are most prevalent and guides MRC's efforts to mitigate illegal dumping activity. The Mitigation of Illegal Mattress Dumping section contains more detail.
- 9. Prevent Bedbug and Other Contamination: A mattress may not be recyclable if it is wet, heavily soiled or contaminated by bedbugs. Although contamination affects relatively few units, MRC educates recyclers and collection sites on how to prevent and properly manage bedbug and other contamination, and thereby increase the amount of mattress materials that can be recycled annually. The Collection Site Mattress Management and Recycler Procedures sections contain more detail.
- 10. Mattress Collection Facility Improvement Funding: To increase the number of mattresses diverted from the waste stream, improve the recyclability of discarded units, improve worker safety and decrease transportation costs and fuel consumption by increasing the number of units shipped per container, MRC funds improvements to mattress collection sites. Beginning in 2018, public collection sites in California are eligible for up to \$10,000 per site per funding cycle. Award recipients must agree to serve as permanent collection sites for at least one year following completion of the project. The Research section contains more detail.

Composting

Composting is a form of recycling and falls at the same level in the waste management hierarchy. In 2024, one MRC recycler sent post-consumer mattress materials to a facility to be composted.

Foundation wood is also theoretically appropriate for composting. However, efficient composting requires that the wood be reduced to very a small particle size that both has a high surface area to volume ratio and provides good structure to the compost

mixture. This requires aggressive shredding or grinding to reduce the foundation wood to particles that are 3 inches or less in diameter. In addition, the shredding process must remove most of the metal contamination. Both of these requirements make composting foundation wood impractical for MRC's recyclers.

Biomass

California's solid waste management hierarchy considers biomass to be recycling that is preferred over the transformation of solid waste through WTE facilities or landfill. In 2024, MRC recyclers sent 2,271,830 pounds of wood to biomass. While this represents a decrease of 4.3% from the amount of wood shipped to biomass in 2023, biomass as a percent of total outbound materials increased only 0.4%, demonstrating that recyclers processed this material consistent with the prior year. MRC recyclers sent wood to biomass because it was financially more attractive than incurring the cost both to transport the wood to a mulcher and pay the mulching operation's tipping fee or because local mulching companies rejected the material due to metal contamination.

Biomass may not be a viable long-term recycling option for foundation wood. Low energy prices and environmental regulations may cause existing biomass plants that MRC's recyclers use to close in the coming years.

Transformation (WTE)

In 2024, MRC recyclers did not send any post-consumer mattress material to WTE facilities.

Landfill

Under their contracts with MRC, recyclers are expected to recycle 75% by weight of the units they process, although that may not always be feasible. MRC recyclers dispose of non-recyclable materials and residue in environmentally safe landfills. This material may include entire mattresses or foundations and mattress materials that are:

- · Severely damaged or twisted
- Wet, frozen or heavily soiled
- Infested with bedbugs, other living organisms or other biological contaminants that render the unit either unsafe to process or make its constituent materials unmarketable
- Have no financially viable market

MRC recyclers do not track landfill disposal data by material type, making it impossible for MRC to provide data regarding the exact quantity of specific materials that they landfilled in 2024. However, given that recyclers landfilled some whole units, as well as separated materials, MRC assumes that they landfilled at least some quantity of every mattress material type (e.g., steel, foam, fiber and wood). MRC recyclers landfilled 23,279,960 pounds of material in 2024. While this represents an increase of 27% from the amount of landfilled material from 2023, most of that increase is attributable to

the 6.3% increase in units collected. Landfill as a percent of total outbound materials increased 3.2%. Recyclers slightly increased the amount of material sent to landfill due to decreased demand for wood, foam and quilt panel, as discussed in the Program
Disposition Data section.

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Program Objectives and Activities

Program Objectives and Activities

Convenience

Pursuant to Cal. Pub. Res. Code § 42987.5(a)(1)(D), CalRecycle requires MRC to meet goals related to consumer convenience, no-cost freight services and retailer convenience. MRC's efforts to achieve the newly established goals are discussed in the Residential Access and Commercial Access sections. In 2024, MRC contracted with Customer Analytics, a demographic analytics consulting firm, to evaluate the extent to which its collection network is accessible to California residents and retailers. Customer Analytics measured access for all California residents including those living in rural counties and environmental justice communities to MRC's collection network using a 15-mile benchmark. For these purposes, the program's mattress collection network refers to all drop-off locations in MRC's collection network (recyclers, collection sites, collection events) and curbside bulky item programs that send their mattresses to MRC recyclers for dismantling.

In its convenience analysis, Customer Analytics first considered only the permanent collection network (collection sites, recyclers and curbside bulky item collection programs) to measure whether MRC had met the goals set by CalReycle, and separately included metrics that incorporate collection events for continuity with past annual reports. For a full description of the methodology used, refer to Appendix D.

Table 9 shows the percentage of all California residents living within 15 miles of MRC's collection network in 2024 regarding both MRC's permanent collection network and entire collection network (that is, including collection events). The <u>Residential Access</u> section contains further details.

Customer Analytics evaluated retailers' access to MRC's permanent collection network by measuring the percentage of California's population that live near locations in the network that accept discarded mattresses collected by retailers.

This metric represents retailers' access to MRC's collection network because retailers often collect discarded units from consumers' residences when they deliver new purchases and need accessible drop-off locations for those discarded units. As shown in Table 10, the analysis used a radius of 20 miles for urban counties and 40 miles for rural counties. The Commercial Access section contains further details.

Residential Access

CalRecycle's goals established pursuant to Cal. Pub. Res. Code § 42987.5(a)(1)(D)(i)(l) require that MRC meet the following consumer convenience and access goals:

- By January 1, 2022, MRC must establish at least one permanent mattress drop-off location in each California county (except counties whose populations are less than 2,000, in which case, MRC must host two collection events annually).
- MRC must establish at least 221 permanent collection sites by December 31, 2024.
- MRC must increase consumer convenience to 94% by 2024.

Table 11 summarizes MRC's efforts to meet these goals in 2024.

Consumer Convenience (Number of Collection Opportunities)

CalRecycle has defined the metric for convenient collection opportunities to include the number of collection sites in MRC's collection network, disposal facilities that accept mattresses, mattress recycling facilities, curbside bulky item collection programs that accept mattresses and retailers that take back old mattresses upon delivery of new mattresses. Because MRC does not have a mechanism to count disposal facilities outside MRC's collection network that accept mattresses for no fee, they are not included in the collection opportunities counted in 2024.

MRC's collection opportunities are comprised of its permanent collection network (including recycling facilities) plus other franchise haulers and municipalities that collect mattresses through their curbside bulky item collection services. In 2024, MRC's permanent collection network consisted of 268 collection opportunities, surpassing CalRecycle's goal by 47. MRC's permanent collection network was comprised of permanent collection sites (which includes recycling facilities) and 26 franchise haulers and municipalities that aggregate curbside bulky item collection units.

Table 12 provides an overview of MRC's collection network (permanent collection sites and recycling facilities) from 2022 through 2024.

The <u>Program Collection</u>, <u>Transportation and Processing</u> section explains the various channels from which MRC collects units and the reasonable steps it has taken to expand its collection network.

Consumer Access to the Program

In 2024, 97.7% of California's residents lived within 15 miles of MRC's permanent collection network (which consists of permanent collection sites, recycling facilities and other entities that provide curbside bulky item collection), exceeding CalRecycle's goal of 94%. Including collection events, statewide access increases to 99%. In 2024, MRC's permanent collection network included permanent collection sites in all 58 California counties.

The analysis of MRC's collection network, however, understates the access that California residents have to no-cost mattress recycling because it does not take into consideration the impact of the retailer take-back obligation. As discussed more fully in the Program Collection, Transportation and Processing chapter, a retailer that delivers a mattress to its customer must offer to pick up the customer's discarded mattress at no cost. The retailer take-back obligation provides another important alternative for consumers to access the program. Appendix B contains a list of all locations in MRC's mattress collection network.

Underserved Areas

The 2023 convenience analysis showed that more than 99% of California residents had access to the program's permanent collection options and collection events. Using this analysis, MRC identified Contra Costa and San Francisco as areas that could benefit from improved consumer access. Table 13 outlines MRC's progress towards improving convenient access in these counties in 2024.

Next Steps

Based on Customer Analytics' analysis of MRC's 2024 collection network, MRC recognized that Contra Costa and San Francisco counties could still benefit from enhanced residential access. MRC will provide progress updates in the 2025 Annual Report.

Challenges to Expanding the Collection Network

An ongoing challenge that MRC faces is that some SWFs refuse to become a permanent collection site because they make money by charging residents to dispose of their mattresses. Under California law, MRC may recycle mattresses collected by a SWF only if it collects those units without charge to the resident. In exchange, MRC pays the participating SWF a reasonable amount for accepting, collecting, storing, transporting and handling discarded units. MRC's negotiated compensation is intended to cover the SWF's direct costs to provide these services. In addition to being paid to handle units, a participating SWF also avoids the cost of paying to landfill those units or preserves its valuable landfill space because it does not bury units that it sends to MRC recyclers.

Some SWFs, however, currently charge exceedingly high disposal fees for mattresses (\$58 or more per unit). Although MRC is prepared to compensate these SWFs for the reasonable costs they incur in handling mattresses, MRC will not pay them the same high rates that they currently charge consumers. For this reason, some SWFs deliberately do not participate in the program.

MRC anticipates that if not all SWFs participate, the program's ability to increase the number of units collected annually will be limited.

In addition to SWFs that are influenced by financial motivations, other SWFs do not participate in the program because:

- The SWF lacks internal resources to review and complete the contracting process
- Existing contractual restrictions with a local municipality may preclude a franchise hauler that operates a SWF from negotiating to become a permanent collection site
- The SWF lacks the logistical capability to participate in the program (e.g., the facility lacks space for a 53-foot trailer; has insufficient labor to collect, store, transport and handle the units for MRC or lacks appropriate loading equipment)
- The SWF receives very few discarded units

MRC is prepared to accommodate these specific logistical and other constraints to encourage a potential new collection site to expand consumer access by joining MRC's permanent collection network.

When we encounter these obstacles, MRC has developed innovative solutions, including working with the following types of alternative collection entities:

- Nonprofits, including Goodwill, Salvation Army, and Habitat for Humanity
- Local Conservation Corps, which provide both permanent collection sites and event staffing for community collection events
- California Redemption Value locations
- Mattress retailers and local businesses that allow the public to drop off discarded units at no cost.

Rural County Access

MRC dedicates significant resources to making the program accessible to rural county residents. MRC meets regularly with the Environmental Services Joint Powers Authority (ESJPA) to provide updates, coordinate with stakeholders and discuss strategies and ideas. In rural areas where recruiting a SWF as a collection site may not be an option, MRC will work with alternative types of collection sites (nonprofits, local businesses, retailers, public agencies or CRV centers) or host local collection events.

For purposes of this report, MRC has defined a rural county using the definition set forth in Cal. Pub. Res. Code § 40184, which in general defines a rural county as one that disposes of less than 200,000 tons of waste annually. Based on the most recent waste disposal data collected by CalRecycle in 2023 (the most recent data available at the time of Customer Anaytics' analysis), the following counties are considered rural: Alpine, Amador, Butte, Calaveras, Colusa, Del Norte, El Dorado, Glenn, Humboldt, Imperial, Inyo, Kings, Lake, Lassen, Madera, Mariposa, Mendocino, Modoc, Mono, Napa, Nevada, Plumas, San Benito, Shasta, Sierra, Siskiyou, Sutter, Tehama, Trinity, Tuolumne, Yolo and Yuba.

In 2024, rural counties covered 47.8% of the state's geographic area but account for only 6.4% of its population. MRC's permanent collection network (collection sites, recyclers and curbside bulky item collection programs) served all 32 rural counties.

In 2024, 94.9% of California's rural residents were located within 15 miles of MRC's permanent collection network. When including the 16 collection events that MRC hosted in rural counties in 2024, rural county accessibility increased to 95.7%.

California residents in rural counties are accustomed to driving longer distances for services, such as hospitals and grocery stores, when compared to urban residents. MRC also analyzed how many rural county residents were within 25 miles of MRC's collection network. That analysis shows that 98.2% of California's rural county population lives within 25 miles of the program's permanent collection network, demonstrating the program's success in providing access to mattress recycling in rural counties.

In 2023, MRC used an analysis prepared by Customer Analytics to identify Plumas County as a rural county that would benefit from increased network access. Table 14 describes MRC's progress toward that goal in 2024.

Based on Customer Analytics' analysis of MRC's permanent collection network in rural counties in 2024, MRC recognized the potential to enhance residential access in Trinity County. MRC will provide progress updates in the 2025 annual report.

Environmental Justice

Cal Pub. Res. Code § 42987.1(m) requires that MRC develop strategies for collecting used mattresses for recycling from "areas and communities that face unique challenges associated with proper waste management such as poverty, language barriers and illegal mattress dumping." Pursuant to this requirement, MRC consults with Federal Environmental Justice (EJ) Agencies, the California Environmental Protection Agency's (CalEPA) Environmental Justice Task Force (EJ Task Force), CalRecycle Office of Environmental Justice, Tribal Relations, and Education (EJTREO) and other stakeholders. MRC has identified the relevant communities (which we refer to as "EJ communities") using CalEPA's CalEnviroScreen 4.0—an environmental mapping program that identifies California communities by census tract that are disproportionately burdened by and vulnerable to multiple sources of pollution, considering indicators such as poverty and linguistic isolation. (A census tract is a small geographic area defined for statistical purposes by the U.S. Census Bureau.)

In 2024, 98.5% of Californians who resided in EJ communities lived within 15 miles of MRC's permanent collection network (recyclers, collection sites and curbside bulky item collection). This number increases to 99.6% when collection events are included. These percentages understate actual access since they do not consider when a retailer that delivers a new mattress to a California consumer takes back a consumer's discarded unit at no cost, which is an additional and important way that residents may access the program.

Collection Strategies

MRC collects used mattresses from residents through four channels: retailer take back, permanent collection sites, curbside bulky item collection and collection events. MRC recognizes that not every resident has the means to transport a mattress, which may be especially true for residents in EJ communities. Therefore, curbside bulky item collection, in addition to the retailer's take-back obligation, is an important part of MRC's strategy for collecting discarded mattresses in EJ communities.

MRC maintains a directory on ByeByeMattress.com of communities that offer at least one free curbside bulky item pickup per year. MRC's consumer education materials and advertising also encourage residents to ask their local government how bulky items are collected in their area. In 2024, 93 bulky programs served EJ communities, 48.4% of which also provided no-cost collection to multifamily housing complexes.

MRC actively uses collection events as another collection channel in EJ communities. Collection events reduce the distance many residents must travel to access the program. In 2024, 59 of MRC's 105 collection events took place in EJ communities and 92 events were within 15 miles of EJ communities.

Underserved Environmental Justice Communities

In the 2023 Annual Report, MRC reported that we would seek to improve access to the program for residents living in Tulare County. Table 15 describes MRC's progress toward that goal.

Based on Customer Analytics' analysis of MRC's permanent collection network in 2024 compared with CalEnviroScreen data, MRC recognized the potential to enhance residential access in Merced County. MRC will provide progress updates in the 2025 annual report.

Illegal Dumping Mitigation in EJ Communities

Since launching the Illegally Dumped Mattress Collection Initiative (Initiative) in 2016, participation has increased, helping MRC collect valuable statewide data. In 2024, Customer Analytics analyzed this data to determine the number of illegally dumped units collected from public rights-of-way in EJ communities. According to their analysis, EJ communities accounted for 30,068 or 46.9% of the total amount of mattresses collected through the Initiative in 2024, an increase of 7.7% from 2023.

By identifying the amount of illegally dumped units collected in EJ communities, MRC can better understand the impact of illegal dumping on these communities and work to address the issue.

In 2024, MRC partnered with the Central California Environmental Justice Network (CCEJN) to support a collection event in Tulare County.

EJ-Focused Conferences and Working Groups

In 2024, MRC sponsored or participated in a variety of webinars and conferences to gain and share knowledge about illegal dumping as well as the challenges EJ community leaders face with educating their residents about and encouraging them to use available recycling options, including the following:

- Keep America Beautiful (February)
- San Diego Zero Waste Symposium (February)
- Northern CA Recycling Association Recycle Update (March)
- Alameda County Statewide Illegal Dumping Conference (April)
- Solid Waste Association of North America (April)

- Southern California Waste Management Forum Annual Business Meeting (June)
- California Resource and Recovery Association (August)
- CalEPA Region 9 Tribal Conference (October)
- Southern California Waste Management Forum (November)

Attending these events also allows MRC to make community leaders and influencers more aware of resources they can access to promote mattress recycling and to gather feedback to improve our education and outreach. The stakeholders MRC meets through these events also help us expand the collection network.

For similar reasons, MRC communicates with working groups, such as task forces and community-based organizations that serve EJ community needs. Engaging with these groups allows MRC to learn about new initiatives aimed at communities burdened by multiple sources of pollution or disproportionately vulnerable to the effects of pollution. In 2024, MRC worked with the following:

- CalRecycle Illegal Dumping Technical Advisory Committee
- Identifying Violations Affecting Neighborhoods (serving Fresno, Imperial, Kern, Kings and Tulare Counties)
- Central California Environmental Justice Network

Education and Outreach

MRC prioritizes EJ communities when contacting local officials and media, as well as where we advertise. In 2024, MRC's EJ community-focused efforts included:

- Providing multilingual information to mayors, city council members, county officials and Council of Governments to promote mattress recycling options with their residents.
- Providing permanent collection sites and event hosts with publicity toolkits to educate residents about mattress recycling.
- Encouraging media to cover mattress recycling and publish submitted op-eds and letters to the editor.
- Encouraging public service announcement directors at TV and radio stations to
 use MRC's "Break Up the Right Way with Your Old Mattress" campaign materials,
 which we have translated into multiple languages. In 2024, MRC produced a new
 campaign titled "Influencer," which was first distributed in February 2025. To develop
 the concept and scripts, MRC consulted information gathered from completed
 illegal dumping pilot projects and our involvement in task forces, workshops and
 conferences.
- Emailing new homeowners and renters in EJ communities about their mattress disposal options (retailer take back, permanent collection sites or their local curbside bulky item collection program).

- MRC used Spanish-language ads in select major markets to increase general awareness of the program. In addition, Asian-language outlets were used in the fall campaign. The <u>Education and Outreach</u> chapter contains more specific information on targeted counties.
- Exhibiting at Earth Day festivals and other spring events in EJ communities.
- Using multicultural outreach consultants to advise MRC how to overcome language barriers and communicate most effectively with residents of EJ communities, as well as identify new opportunities to promote MRC's collection network in EJ communities.

Commercial Access

No-Cost Freight Services

Pursuant to Cal. Pub. Res. Code § PRC section 42987.5(a)(1)(D)(i)(II), CalRecycle's baseline and goals requires that MRC provide no-cost freight services to transport discarded mattresses from retailers, health care facilities, educational facilities, military bases and lodging establishments to permanent collection sites. To meet this goal, MRC offers pickup services for mattresses from each of these entities when they have at least 100 units to discard at one time through its Commercial Volume Program (CVP). The sites where these entities accumulate their mattresses are not open to the public.

Depending on whether an entity regularly collects the minimum (such as a mattress retailer) or has a less frequent or ad-hoc need for MRC's services (such as a lodging establishment), MRC offers several types of CVP collection and transportation options: CVP sites equipped with a permanent on-site trailer, temporary sites (live loads) and consolidation locations. The following describes each type of CVP collection type:

- Permanent on-site trailer sites are established for entities that collect at least 100 units per month. MRC provides those entities with an on-site trailer and transports the collected units to an MRC recycler on a regular basis. In 2024, MRC's CVP collection network included 70 sites with on-site trailers.
- Temporary sites (live loads) serve entities that generate 100 mattresses less than once a month. Temporary CVP sites contact MRC to schedule a pickup (called a live load) whenever they reach 100 mattresses. MRC picked up 290 live loads from 101 temporary CVP sites in 2024, an increase of 33 live loads from 2023.
- Consolidation locations are sites that accept units delivered by retailers and other commercial entities only. In 2024, MRC offered five consolidation locations. The number of each CVP site type that MRC offered in 2024 is shown in Table 16.

In 2025, MRC continues to recruit eligible retailers, businesses and institutions to participate in its CVP and will report on progress in the next Annual Report.

Commercial Entities with Small Loads

In addition to the above CVP options, MRC assists lower volume commercial sources to manage discarded mattresses that they collect. Under MRC's CVP, businesses and institutions that generate small loads of discarded mattresses may drop off their units at MRC permanent collection sites that accept commercial volume. These collection sites are not reflected in Table 16's CVP Collection Network but are designated in Appendix B.

In 2024, 172 permanent collection sites offered no cost drop off for small commercial loads. MRC lists these locations on its <u>Bye Bye Mattress Recycling Locator</u> and in list format on the site's page explaining commercial volume options. MRC also provides CVP entities that are not eligible for MRC-provided transportation (because they do not frequently generate loads of 100 mattresses or more) with a list of renovators that accept discarded mattresses and comply with applicable California and federal bedding requirements (as required by SB 254).

Retailer Access

Pursuant to Cal. Pub. Res. Code § 42992, any retailer that delivers a new mattress to a customer must offer to take back the customer's old mattress at no added cost. To make this take-back requirement a convenient means for California residents to access no-cost mattress recycling, retailers have the following options for recycling those mattresses through the program at no cost:

- Drop them off at an MRC recycler.
- Drop them off at a permanent collection site that accepts small commercial loads.
- Request that MRC pick them up from the retailer through the CVP (permanent on-site trailer or live loads).
- Drop them off at a CVP consolidation location.

For ease of reference, we will refer to these options as the retailer collection network. Pursuant to Cal. Pub. Res. Code § 42987.5(a)(1)(D)(ii), CalRecycle's goals for MRC require that by 2024, 95% of consumers in rural areas reside within 40 miles and 80% of consumers in urban areas reside within 20 miles of a permanent collection site that accepts mattresses from retailers and their associated delivery parties. Customer Analytics calculated the percentage of California's urban and rural population that lives near permanent collection sites that accept discarded mattresses from retailers and other commercial entities (recyclers, permanent collection sites that accept commercial volume and CVP consolidation locations).

Customer Analytics' analysis showed that 99.2%% of the urban population lived within 20 miles, and 99.5% of the rural population lived within 40 miles, of MRC's retailer collection network. Note that this analysis may understate actual retailer access because it does not account for retailers whose units MRC picks up directly through the CVP on-site trailer service or that request live loads.

Residents' Access to No-Cost Disposal Options

Some no-cost mattress disposal options in California are not currently part of MRC's collection network. For example, mattresses collected by some retailers are not recycled through the program and some curbside bulky item collection programs do not send units that they collect to the program.

To complete its analysis of how many California residents may access either no-cost mattress recycling or no-cost mattress disposal, MRC mapped its collection network and all curbside bulky item collection programs in the state, regardless of whether they participate in the program.

Based on MRC's collection network (collection sites, recyclers and curbside bulky collection programs) and including all events in the state, 97.7% of California residents were either served by an event or lived within 15 miles of MRC's collection network in 2024.

This percentage likely understates consumer access because our analysis does not include retailers that take back discarded mattresses and recycle them through MRC's program providing consumers additional no-cost collection options. In 2024, the program received 27.8% of its units directly from retailers or MRC's CVP transporters (which transport units received from retailers and other commercial entities). Retailers' share of units recycled through the program is even higher because some retailers also drop off units at permanent collection sites. However, since retailer units obtained from permanent collection sites are comingled with mattresses dropped off by residents and other commercial sources, MRC cannot estimate how many of these were from retailers.

This analysis is useful as MRC considers new strategies for preventing illegal dumping and improving statewide program accessibility. MRC has increased residential

accessibility by focusing recruitment efforts on SWFs and communities that offer no-cost curbside collection services. The <u>Program Collection</u>, <u>Transportation and Processing</u> section contains further details about MRC's collection network.

Consumer Incentive Payment

California residents may receive a Consumer Incentive Payment (CIP) when they drop off discarded mattresses at MRC recyclers. The CIP is \$3 per unit for up to five units per vehicle per day delivered during the recycler's regular business hours. The CIP is available only to state residents, and not to businesses or government collectors.

The incentive encourages California consumers to manage discarded mattresses responsibly by taking them directly to a contracted recycler for processing.

In 2024, eight of MRC's 11 California recycling locations offered the CIP, as well as two permanent collection sites (Habitat for Humanity ReStore and Cristal Materials). One California recycling facility did not offer the CIP because of local restrictions that prohibit public access on the site. Another recycling facility was not yet open to the public but will offer the CIP starting in 2025. The out-of-state processing facility in Oregon does not offer CIP. In 2024, residents received CIPs for 86,680 units. Residents dropped off an additional 23,438 units that did not qualify for CIPs because they exceeded the five units per day limit, they dropped off their units after normal operating hours, or customers deny payment. The total of 110,118 units that consumers dropped off at the CIP locations represents approximately 7.1% of all units collected through the program.

CalRecycle has requested that MRC explore offering the CIP at more locations and increasing the amount paid per unit. This, however, is a complex issue. The Mattress Advisory Committee is on record recommending that MRC not increase the CIP because it could result in fewer units being renovated and the Legislature has expressed its intent that MRC's program not undermine renovation.

After carefully considering the potential advantages and disadvantages of increasing the CIP and offering it at more locations, MRC has decided not to do so for the following reasons. First, permanent collection sites face many challenges in offering the CIP in an efficient, fiscally responsible and secure manner. For example, most collection sites lack staff needed to accept the delivered units in compliance with the CIP rules (such as, no more than five units per day per vehicle) and manage the process. Given the nature of their business, few sites have either the cash on hand in small denomination bills needed to disburse CIP when units are dropped off or the security to protect the cash being disbursed. Even if they have the necessary staff and cash on hand, they also lack the internal controls and accounting system needed to track these transactions and document that the CIP was properly disbursed for eligible units received. Finally, the CIP tends to attract many residents. Permanent collection sites generally lack the space to accommodate lines of residents dropping off mattresses and waiting for their

CIP. Second, when MRC developed the CIP program, it sought input from the Mattress Advisory Committee regarding the level of incentive that consumers should receive when dropping off discarded mattresses and foundations at an MRC recycler. After considering different incentive levels, the committee advised MRC that setting the incentive above \$3 per unit could harm renovation. MRC accepted the committee's advice and capped the incentive at \$3 per unit, for up to five units per vehicle per day. For these reasons, MRC has decided not to increase the CIP at this time from \$3 per unit or to offer it at additional locations.

Program Collection and Disposition Data

Program Collection

Based on data that MRC recyclers report through the program, MRC collected 1,560,655 program units for recycling in 2024, reflecting an increase of 6.3% from 2023 to 2024.




FIGURE 2: Units Collected by Source

MRC recyclers process both program units and non-program units. Non-program units include those that a recycler obtains from franchise haulers and SWFs that do not participate in the program, as well as mattresses manufactured by the Prison Industry Authority (which are exempt from the recycling charge and therefore are not recycled at MRC's cost) and units not collected from California sources. MRC compensates its recyclers for processing program units only.

Although MRC recyclers separately report program and non-program units received at their facilities, the recyclers commingle the materials recovered through the recycling process from program and non-program sources and report those materials together when sold. The data provided in the Program Disposition Data section reports the totals from both program and non-program materials combined, as reported to MRC by its recyclers.


Program Disposition Data

As discussed in the <u>Materials Management/Waste Hierarchy</u> section, MRC recyclers are expected to reuse, recycle or send to biomass as much material as is economically practical and feasible. MRC recyclers have reported to MRC that they recovered the following materials from discarded mattresses in 2024:

FIGURE 3: Total Commodities Recycled from Program & Non-Program Units




MRC recyclers have reported to MRC that they reused, recycled or sent to biomass 73.7% of all mattress materials processed in 2024. Table 20 and Figure 4 show the 2024 disposition totals and percentages. The data shown for reused or renovated materials includes the whole units reused/renovated shown in <u>Table 19</u> and other materials that recyclers sold to renovators. The data shown for biomass in Table 20 includes wood pounds from <u>Table 19</u>.

CalRecycle requires that MRC report on its progress towards goals established pursuant to Cal. Pub. Res. Code § 42987.5(a)(1)(A)-(B). In addition to reporting its performance under the CalRecycle metrics, MRC also measures the percentage of materials its recyclers reused, recycled or sent to biomass. To avoid confusion with a distinct goal that CalRecycle defines as "recycling rate", MRC refers to this percentage as the "MRC recovery rate."

MRC is committed to supporting recyclers' efforts to increase their efficiency, but future MRC recovery rates may be influenced by factors outside MRC's control. Markets for some recycled mattress materials are limited, seasonal or depend on a variety of economic variables.

For example, demand for foam and quilt panels is driven entirely on demand for carpet pads, the current primary end use for these materials. Demand for carpet pads fell in 2023 and remained low into 2024. This resulted in decreased demand for post-consumer foam early in the year. Although demand for recycled foam rebounded later in 2024, quilt panels, which are typically less valuable than foam, did not experience a similar rebound. Likewise, some mattresses contain small amounts of different types of fiber, but these materials can be difficult to sell because buyers require minimum quantities, and it can take recyclers substantial time to separate and accumulate the requisite amount. Some recyclers are unable to store this material because they lack space or are concerned with storing potentially flammable material over an extended time.

In 2024, MRC continued to transport pocketed coils from mattress recyclers to one facility in Fresno County and one in Los Angeles County that separated the steel springs from the fabric, thereby increasing the amount of metal recycled. The primary pocketed coil processor in Fresno County upgraded its equipment in late 2023, which reduced equipment shutdowns and improved steel recovery in 2024.

MRC has also taken steps to improve the quality and amount of material that can be recycled, which can increase the market value for the reclaimed materials and reduce the amount of unrecyclable material sent to landfills. For example, MRC continues to fund permanent collection site improvements that protect discarded mattresses from being spoiled for recycling by exposure to weather. The Research section contains more detail.

Statewide Collection and Disposition Data

Statewide Program and Disposition Data

MRC is required to report progress towards goals established by CalRecycle pursuant to Cal. Pub. Res. Code § 42987.5(a)(1)(A)-(B) using defined metrics that measure recycling and renovation across California, regardless of affiliation with MRC's program.

14 CCR § 18965 through § 18967 require that mattress recyclers, SWFs and renovators report to CalRecycle the number of used mattresses they collect, recycle, renovate and landfill in California each year. CalRecycle has provided MRC aggregate data that these entities reported.

CalRecycle notes that it took the following actions regarding its 2024 data collection effort:

- Distributed nine emails through the Mattress Recovery and Recycling Program Database to remind entities to submit 2024 annual reports.
- Mailed letters and annual reports in both English and Spanish from January through March 2025 to 47 renovators and confirmed receipt. Mailed follow-up letters and annual reports in both English and Spanish in April 2025 to 43 renovators who had not yet reported and confirmed receipt.
- Contacted all entities that had not yet reported as of April 21, 2025, via phone call and email to remind them to report prior to May 1, 2025.
- Provided continued communication to reporting entities through phone calls and email communications and responded to phone calls and email communications from reporting entities.
- Provided verbal communication, reminder emails, and reporting spreadsheet in Spanish, when necessary.
- Identified and onboarded 1 recycler, 5 renovators, and 3 SWFs that had not reported in prior years.
- Archived 4 renovators that are no longer in operation or no longer renovate mattresses. Archived 6 SWFs that are no longer in operation or no longer collect mattresses.
- Analyzed all data for completeness and reasonableness, including comparing data to annual reports from prior years. Called and emailed entities to clarify and correct suspected errors in reported data.
- Sent notices of violation to 21 entities that failed to submit annual reports by May 1, 2025.

In-State and Out-Of-State Sources

The number of units collected/received includes those received from in-state and out-of-state sources (shown in <u>Table 22</u>). CalRecycle notes that a significant amount of double counting exists in these numbers. For example, SWFs reported receiving 1,141,887 units in 2024; however, many of these were subsequently delivered to mattress recyclers and are counted again in the recyclers' reported data.

The number of units recycled represents whole units that were dismantled for the purpose of recycling. SWFs reported the number of units landfilled and renovators reported the number of units renovated.

Statewide Recycling Rate

This metric includes units collected through MRC's program and outside of it, as well as units received from in-state and out-of-state sources. Using the data in Table 23, we calculated the statewide recycling rate by dividing the number of units recycled and renovated by the total number of units managed (that is, the sum of units recycled, renovated and disposed of in landfills based on data reported to CalRecycle by recyclers, renovators and SWFs). The Statewide Recycling Rate is 85.9%, which meets the 2024 goal of 81% plus or minus 5% set by CalRecycle.

The data reported to CalRecycle represents the most comprehensive information on mattress disposition available in the United states. However, challenging data gaps

are likely. MRC has spent a considerable amount of time with the Advisory Committee discussing unknowable variables to the ultimate disposition including:

- 1. A considerable number of discarded, but usable units are exported to Mexico. There is no documentation available to quantify this number
- 2. The number of units crushed in compactor trucks by curbside collectors of solid waste
- 3. The number of units buried in mixed loads that arrive at solid waste facilities

MRC will continue its efforts to increase the percentage of discarded units that are recycled or reused statewide, but recognizes that opportunities to expand collection are limited for the following reasons:

- Some discarded units are not recyclable because they are too wet, moldy or are mixed with putrescible solid waste and are unsafe to recycle. To reduce weather-related and other damage to discarded units, MRC funds improvements to mattress collection facilities to improve the quality of discarded units, increase loading efficiency and protect worker safety. While these efforts are expected to reduce the number of units landfilled and improve the program's collection and recycling performance, they are unlikely to increase the volumes collected substantially.
- Some units that are potentially recyclable are landfilled by SWFs that have chosen
 not to participate in the program. MRC has worked diligently since the program's
 inception to recruit these SWFs and will continue to do so. Nevertheless, recruiting
 non-participating SWFs into the program is increasingly difficult, limiting MRC's ability
 to capture additional discarded units.
- In enacting SB 254, the Legislature expressed its intent that mattress recycling
 does not undermine existing resale, refurbishing and reuse of mattresses that are in
 compliance with state and federal law, further limiting MRC's ability to increase the
 number of units recycled.

The <u>Residential Access</u> and <u>Program Collection</u>, <u>Transportation and Processing</u> sections of this report provide an explanation of the various sources from which MRC collected units and the reasonable steps it has taken to expand the collection network, avoid undermining renovation and better serve state residents and businesses.

Statewide Efficiency Rate

This metric includes the amount of material recycled by recyclers and solid waste facilities and renovated by renovators from mattresses collected through MRC's program and outside of it, as well as units received from in-state and out-of-state sources. As the following table demonstrates, MRC calculated the statewide efficiency rate by dividing the pounds of material recycled and renovated by the total pounds of material recycled, renovated and disposed in landfills from data reported to CalRecycle by recyclers, renovators and SWFs. Recyclers report the total quantity in pounds of each mattress material recycled and residual materials disposed. SWFs report the number of units

landfilled, as well as the number of whole units recycled on-site, if any. These units must be converted to pounds using the assumption that the average unit weighs 55 pounds. Renovators report the number of units they renovate and the pounds of residual material disposed. The units must be converted to pounds and multiplied by the annual renovation recovery rate calculation agreed upon by CalRecycle, which was 88.7% in 2024. The statewide efficiency rate is 64.6%, which meets the 2024 goal of 65% plus or minus 5% set by CalRecycle.

While MRC achieved the Efficiency Rate Goal for 2024, the calculation is based on data that is partially incomplete and partially estimated. Seven out of 47 renovators (almost 15%) did not submit reports. Of those that reported, six of the renovators provided estimated rather than exact unit counts. Estimated unit counts made up 8% of all renovated units reported. Additionally, four SWFs did not submit reports. Of the units reported as landfilled by SWFs, 11% were based on estimates rather than exact unit counts. The Efficiency Rate calculation also assumes that all pounds of residual material disposed of by renovators are landfilled, however, data from prior years indicate that some of these materials were directed to product manufacturing or reuse. This disposition information was not provided for 2024, limiting MRC's ability to include such diversions in the Efficiency Rate calculation.

MRC cannot control the landfilling of whole units or component parts by third parties but works to meet this goal by increasing collection and working with recyclers to improve the recovery rate for units they process.

MRC continues to invest in research activities targeting low-value and difficult to recycle mattress commodities that have limited or no demand.

Finally, MRC is working with its recyclers to improve their material separation processes.

If post-consumer materials are not properly separated, potential buyers may reject them because of contamination. With proper information and training, MRC hopes that recyclers can continue to reduce their disposal rates, increase the amount and quality of mattress materials that can be recycled and increase the revenue they earn from selling the recycled materials, making their businesses more financially sustainable. The multiple strategies MRC is pursuing to divert materials from disposal are discussed in further detail in the Program Disposition Data section and Research chapter.

Good Faith Effort

Pursuant to Cal. Pub. Res. Code § 42987.5, CalRecycle in consultation with MRC, must establish a state mattress recycling baseline amount and state mattress recycling goals. MRC must demonstrate its good faith effort to meet the state's mattress recycling goals. Cal. Pub. Res. Code § 42986(d) provides that "good faith effort" means "all reasonable and economically practical efforts by a mattress recycling organization to implement the components identified in its approved plan consistent with its annual budget.

CalRecycle established the following goals for the program:

In 2024, MRC successfully achieved all of the state's mattress recycling goals.

In addition, CalRecycle established a 2024 baseline for units renovated statewide by third-party renovators of 225,000 units. Based on the 179,984 units that renovators reported to CalRecycle as units renovated in 2024, renovation reached nearly 80% of the baseline. MRC has the following observations regarding the reported renovated data:

- The data on renovated units reported to CalRecycle by renovators may be incomplete or inaccurate. In 2024, 46 renovators were registered with MRC in California. There is a strong likelihood that other companies are renovating mattresses in California that have not registered with the program. Furthermore, CalRecycle notified 47 renovators about their annual reporting requirement but only 40 renovators reported units renovated data. Of those, six reported using a conversion factor or estimated units renovated, as opposed to reporting actual units renovated based on their company records. For these reasons, there is a significant likelihood that if non-registered and registered renovators had reported their actual units renovated instead of just estimates, then the true renovated units data may either meet or exceed CalRecycle's 2024 baseline.
- The demand for renovated mattresses (and therefore the number of units that renovators process) is highly influenced by various economic factors that also affect new unit sales. For example, as a result of low housing sales and inflation, the total number of both new and renovated units sold in California was 3,265,445; 3.5% below 2023 levels. Renovated mattresses tend to sell at the lower end of the price point range and now compete with on-line boxed bedding which accounts for 40-50% of all sales. Nationally, 2024 mattress sales revenue fell by 5.9%, while units sold fell by 5.7%, compared to 2023. This dynamic means that the sales declines were more pronounced at the lower price points, which would include sales of renovated mattresses. Competition from low-priced mattress imports remains strong. For these reasons, general economic pressures and online sales are logically reducing sales of renovated units in California.
- MRC has limited influence on the total number of units companies renovate.
 Nevertheless, MRC continued to demonstrate a good faith effort, using reasonable and economically practical means, to support renovation in 2024. These efforts include adding renovators to our permanent collection network, providing lists of renovators who are compliant with state and federal law to mattress recyclers who may be interested in selling whole units or component parts to renovators and offering collection site improvement funds to renovators collecting units from the public.

Renovation is discussed further in the <u>Program Collection</u>, <u>Transportation and Processing</u> section of this report.

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Mitigation of Illegal Mattress Dumping

CALIFORNIA PUBLIC RESOURCES CODE AND REGULATIONS

14 CCR § 18964(b)(7) — A description of methods used by the mattress recycling organization to coordinate with existing used mattress collection and recycling programs with regard to the proper management or recycling of discarded or abandoned mattresses.

14 CCR § 18964(b)(8)(B) — Qualitative and/or quantitative information on subdivisions (g), (I), and (m) of section 42987.1 of the Public Resources Code.

Cal. Pub. Res. Code § 42987.1(I) — Ensuring, to the maximum extent possible, that urban and rural local governments and participating permitted solid waste facilities and authorized solid waste operations that accept mattresses are provided with a mechanism for the recovery of illegally disposed used mattresses that is funded at no additional cost to the local government, solid waste facility, or solid waste operation.

Cal. Pub. Res. Code § 42990.1(m) — For reports submitted on and after July 1, 2021, all of the following:

(3) A report on research activities, which the organization shall undertake, to improve used mattress collection, dismantling, recycling operations, source reduction and green product design, and the response to the problem of illegal dumping and a report on the progress made as a result of the research activities.

- (4) A report on pilot programs, which the organization shall undertake, to test new processes, methods, or equipment on a local, regional, or otherwise limited basis, such as those designed to clean up illegally dumped mattresses, gather data and identify strategies to reduce the number of illegally dumped mattresses, in partnership with the cities and counties identified by the mattress recycling organization as having areas with the highest rate of illegal dumping in the state. Pilot program descriptions shall include a mechanism to measure success, such as establishing a baseline and goals when possible and report on the progress made in undertaking the pilot programs.
- (5) If the mattress recycling organization determines during a particular year that any of the activities undertaken to implement paragraph (3) or (4) were unsuccessful, the organization shall identify the problems with the current activities, and report on the new activities undertaken and progress made, in the following year's annual report.

Mitigation of Illegal Mattress Dumping

MRC uses the following strategy to address illegal mattress dumping:

- 1. Intercept discarded mattresses before they are illegally dumped by:
 - a. Providing California residents with no-cost retailer pick-up of discarded mattresses when the retailer delivers a new mattress to a consumer.
 - b. Encouraging no-cost drop-off options for state residents at designated collection points throughout California.
 - c. Providing a financial incentive to encourage residents to deliver discarded units directly to recycling facilities.
- 2. Through MRC's Illegally Dumped Mattress Collection Initiative, compensate participating local governments, solid waste facilities and solid waste operations that provide baseline data to help MRC and policymakers better understand the extent of illegal mattress dumping.
- 3. MRC, policymakers and participants use this data to measure and document the extent to which illegal mattress dumping is occurring in each participant's geographic area and whether mitigation efforts are effective.
- 4. Fund pilot projects to mitigate illegal mattress dumping and communicate those findings to illegal dumping technical experts.
- 5. Work with technical experts to develop solutions and best practices to address illegal dumping, attend illegal dumping working groups and conferences, promote recycling and illegal dumping mitigation resources.

The methods MRC uses to intercept discarded mattresses before they are illegally dumped are discussed in other chapters of this report. MRC encourages consumers to use the no-cost collection network and promotes Consumer Incentive Payment locations (where consumers can receive compensation for delivering units directly to recyclers). To reduce the retailers' burden of providing no-cost take-back services, MRC encourages them to participate in our Commercial Volume Program (which provides simple, no-cost options for retailers to dispose of units they collect) described in Program Objectives and Outreach chapter describes how MRC informs industry and consumer audiences about MRC collection channels.

MRC's goal is to proactively discourage illegal dumping by encouraging consumers and businesses to divert used mattresses to recyclers. MRC reassesses this strategy annually and considers other strategies that might better combat and address unanticipated increases in illegal dumping.

Illegally Dumped Mattress Collection Initiative

To gather reliable data about the nature and extent of California's illegally dumped mattress problem, the Initiative offers financial incentives to local governments, solid waste facilities, franchise haulers, nonprofits contracted with municipalities, Local Conservation Corps, joint powers authorities, Native Nations and other entities that report data to MRC regarding illegally dumped units they collect from public rights-of-way (e.g., collection date, number of units collected, disposition of collected units and collection ZIP code). MRC pays participants a per unit amount for every illegally dumped unit they pick up and report to MRC. The amount paid depends on whether the entity operates in an urban (up to \$15 per unit) or rural county (\$20 per unit), as determined by the rural county definition set forth in Cal. Pub. Res. Code § 40184 (which in general defines a rural county as one that disposes of less than 200,000 tons of waste annually). Table 27 identifies participating counties that are rural. MRC plans to continue the Initiative in 2025 and will report progress in future annual reports.

2024 Results

In 2024, 76 Initiative participants representing 36 counties reported 64,227 units. Of the represented counties, 13 were rural. Compared to 2023, there was a 15.6% increase in the number of units and no net change in the total number of reporting participants. Although, there were changes within the set of participants providing the data.

Eight 2023 participants did not report in 2024, but this was offset by two new entities joining the Initiative—one rural and one urban—and six existing participants that reported data in 2024 but had not done so in 2023.

When researching reasons for the unit increase, MRC contacted participants that reported the greatest change in units and found that participants improved their data reporting efforts, which led to noticeable increases in the number of units collected by some organizations compared to previous years.

MRC will continue to observe data trends in future years to determine whether a more in-depth analysis of the Initiative is warranted.

Participant Outreach and Retention

To recruit participants, MRC promoted the Initiative among local governments, Native Nations, franchised haulers, Local Conservation Corps and other collectors through conferences and workshops, illegal dumping working groups and task force meetings. We also communicated with our network of contacts via emails, phone calls and meetings to raise awareness of the Initiative's benefits and persuade them to join. These efforts resulted in two new participants. In 2025, MRC will continue to recruit participants from underrepresented counties.

Throughout 2024, MRC also regularly corresponded with registered participants to keep them engaged and submit information in a timely manner. MRC sent reminders encouraging them to submit their data to MRC's online database and to contact MRC if needed. MRC continued to provide participants with ongoing support, including providing login assistance, resetting passwords, updating an organization's contact information and navigating the database.

To improve retention, MRC contacted the eight entities that did not report in 2024 and learned that staffing constraints led to a reassignment of responsibilities for managing illegally dumped mattresses. MRC will continue to support and provide resources to keep current participants engaged and help them maintain involvement during staff transitions.

Data Analysis

Demographic/Socio-economic Trends

MRC hired Customer Analytics, a demographic data analysis firm, to analyze 2024 illegal dumping data collected through the Initiative. Customer Analytics measured the relationships between illegal dumping and demographic and socio-economic factors in the communities served by the reporting entities. They also tested for associations between rates of illegal dumping and various elements of MRC's collection network.

Appendix D contains a complete description of the methodology used.

Customer Analytics' analysis of 2024 illegal dumping data showed that ZIP codes with the following attributes experienced higher rates of illegal dumping:

- Higher percentage of renter households
- Higher percentage of multifamily housing complexes
- Higher percentage of persons living below the federal poverty level
- Lower proportions of persons aged 64+

Curbside Bulky Item Collection Programs and Illegal Mattress Dumping

To increase residents' awareness of additional curbside collection opportunities, MRC provides a Bulky Item Pickup Directory on ByeByeMattress.com. This directory is based on information MRC collected in a statewide study of curbside collection services, which MRC periodically updates. The directory identifies areas that provide residents with at least one free bulky item pickup per year. MRC's consumer outreach also promotes bulky item curbside collection as an option for responsible mattress collection.

MRC Collection Network and Illegal Mattress Dumping

Customer Analytics' analysis of the 2024 Initiative data suggests that of the zip codes with higher rates of reported illegal dumping that are within 15 miles of collection sites, including mattress recyclers, have less reported illegal dumping.

Overall, this analysis supports MRC's strategy of expanding the permanent collection network, which is an effective method to reduce illegal dumping.

In 2024, MRC also funded an illegal dumping pilot study that examined how providing curbside mattress collection services affected illegal dumping. The <u>Illegal Dumping Pilot Projects</u> section contains additional details.

Initiative Data and Analysis Utilization

The Initiative data and accompanying analyses help guide MRC's efforts to expand its collection network, provide a tool for monitoring the outcomes of pilot projects and influence where to target MRC advertising and other outreach.

In the 2023 report, MRC's analysis of the Initiative data identified areas with the highest rates of illegal dumping. These areas included:

- City of Berkeley
- · City of Oakland
- Lake County
- Tulare County

In 2024, MRC established a new collection site in the city of Oakland, which is located in Alameda County. Residents within the city limits of Berkeley also have access to this site. MRC also established a new collection site in Lakeport, located in Lake County and a new collection site in the City of Tulare, located in Tulare County.

Additionally, in 2024, the City of Long Beach expanded the hours of its collection site to 7 days per week, 24 hours a day. MRC will continue to monitor the illegal dumping trends in the city.

MRC provides Initiative participants with a customized heat map they may use to inform their city management, local leaders and waste service providers as they respond to illegal dumping incidents. In 2025, MRC will continue to consult Initiative data as it determines where to expand and conduct outreach. Participants will also continue to receive heat maps.

In 2025, MRC intends to explore new solutions for illegal dumping reporting software to enhance the efficiency of data collection. MRC will evaluate available technologies to identify options that align with participant needs.

Projects to Mitigate Illegally Dumped Mattresses

MRC encourages communities experiencing illegal mattress dumping to propose pilot projects to address the problem. Each year, MRC invites Initiative participants and California municipalities, nonprofits and solid waste facilities that have collected illegally dumped mattress data for at least one year (either under the Initiative or using an internal reporting system) to propose a project that MRC might fund. The three broad areas considered for funding include:

- 1. Education programs to inform residents about existing mattress collection channels
- 2. Improving residents' awareness of illegal dumping laws and their enforcement
- 3. Establishing or improving mattress drop-off locations

Since MRC began offering this funding in 2021, it has distributed over \$500,000. The most recently awarded and active projects are described in this chapter. Case studies regarding the results of previous years' projects are available on MRC's website at MRC's "Illegal Dumping Mitigation Pilot Project Results" page.

Projects Awarded in 2024

Daly City

The City, in partnership with their franchise hauler, Republic Services, participated in the MRC pilot study project to explore the effectiveness of hosting free, hyper-local mattress collection events in 12 neighborhoods. The project aimed to increase awareness of proper mattress disposal, educate residents on the consequences of illegal dumping, and reduce illegally dumped mattresses in Daly City.

All objectives were successfully achieved. The program raised awareness about proper mattress disposal by offering free collection services and providing education on future disposal options. A dedicated webpage informed residents about the consequences of illegal dumping, including fines up to \$10,000.

San Benito County

In 2024, San Benito County launched a comprehensive strategy to address illegal mattress dumping. The county mailed quarterly bilingual postcards to promote free recycling events and programs, installed bilingual signage to highlight increased fines for illegal dumping and conducted in-person outreach at community events and workshops. The county also partnered with its franchised waste hauler to deliver bilingual outreach promoting mattress and bulky item recycling. These efforts aimed to increase attendance at recycling events, raise public awareness and educate residents on proper disposal options. MRC will discuss the status of this project in the next annual report.

Other Active Projects

Ventura County

Ventura County launched a pilot project to address illegal dumping in a hotspot location. The project involved installing a surveillance camera and monitoring footage daily to track and document mattress-related dumping incidents. The goal was to gather evidence for investigations, which the Sheriff's Office would investigate, and the District Attorney's Office would review. Additionally, the county collaborated with a public relations firm on an education and outreach campaign to raise awareness about the illegal dumping issue.

The project successfully eliminated illegal dumping in the area monitored by the camera. Several key lessons were learned during implementation: The surveillance trailer needs an additional camera for better monitoring, as vandals cut electrical wires twice, preventing identification. Future plans include evaluating the cost-benefit ratio for enhanced security. Trailer placement also posed challenges; teams must securely fasten and position the trailer for better coverage to deter theft. Lastly, although illegal dumping signs were installed, field evaluations identified areas with insufficient coverage, prompting plans for improved sign placement.

City of Modesto

The city of Modesto proposed a comprehensive plan to combat illegal dumping by focusing on education and outreach, surveillance and expanding access to its residents. The project includes developing and distributing multilingual door hangers, collaborating with schools to educate students on the impacts of illegal dumping using MRC's illegal dumping lesson plan, installing signage with information on reporting illegal dumping and deploying mobile cameras and a digital message board at illegal dumping hot spots. Additionally, the city will pilot a one-year no-cost mattress collection site, measuring success by whether these actions reduce illegal dumping.

As of this report, the city has collected over 271 mattresses from residential drop-off since launching its project. MRC extended the project completion date until December 2025 because supply chain issues delayed the camera installation. MRC will discuss the status of this project in the next annual report.

Next Steps

Given the strong participant retention, quality of reported data and positive outcomes from the completed pilot projects, MRC will continue to work with the CalRecycle Illegal Dumping Technical Advisory Committe, the Mattress Advisory Committee and other illegal dumping task force groups to promote the Initiative and pilot project funding. MRC will also continue to analyze Initiative data and pilot project results to identify best practices to share with the wider community.

Supplemental Strategies

These efforts, along with <u>Education and Outreach</u> activities, are relevant to the fifth prong of MRC's illegally dumped mattress mitigation strategy.

Workshop with Gigantic Ideas

In April 2024, MRC hosted a workshop facilitated by MRC and Gigantic Idea Studio (GIS), a third-party consulting firm, at the 4th Annual Statewide Illegal Dumping Conference. Attendees participated in activities designed to elicit feedback on their experience with illegal dumping enforcement. Attendees included residents, state and local government and representatives of other non-governmental organizations.

The report titled "In This Together: Collaborating for Best Practices" was published in November 2024 and is available on MRC's website.

Clean California Initiative

In 2021, Governor Newsom launched the Clean California Initiative (Clean California), to remove roadway litter and beautify public spaces throughout the state. Under one part of Clean California, the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) hosts Dump Day events, when underserved communities may have their bulky waste collected at no cost.

In 2024, MRC supported six Clean California Dump Day events in three of Caltrans 12 districts. As a result, over 800 mattresses were collected.

MRC intends to collaborate with the Clean California Initiative in the future.

School Lesson Plan: Don't Dump it, Recycle it

To teach California's youth the importance of recycling (as opposed to dumping), MRC created a school lesson plan that includes five activities aligned with Next Generation Science Standards to guide students through the waste journey, its impact on the environment and ways to prevent illegal dumping. The last lesson provides facts and statistics about mattress recycling and how its components can be repurposed.

MRC continued to promote the lesson plan to teachers, afterschool programs, solid waste working groups and to local municipalities.

White Paper

In 2020, MRC commissioned an interdisciplinary team of experts lead by Dr. Calvin Lakhan, Faculty of Environmental Studies, York University, Toronto, Ontario, to develop a white paper on "Best Practices in Addressing Illegal Dumping of Durable Waste—A Guide for Policy Makers." The paper discusses strategies and best practices that have been found effective in mitigating illegal dumping in the United States and elsewhere. The report is available on MRC's website.

MRC continues to promote the white paper to illegal dumping task force groups, environmental justice organizations, through MRC social media and at other conferences and events.



Research

CALIFORNIA PUBLIC RESOURCES CODE AND REGULATIONS

14 CCR § 18964 (b)(8)(B) — Qualitative and/or quantitative information on subdivisions (g), (I), and (m) of section 42987.1 of the Public Resources Code.

Cal. Pub. Res. Code § 42987.1(g) — Conducting research, as needed, related to improving used mattress collection, dismantling, and recycling operations, including pilot programs to test new processes, methods, or equipment on a local, regional, or otherwise limited basis.

Cal. Pub. Res. Code § 42990.1(m) — For reports submitted on and after July 1, 2021, all the following:

Cal. Pub. Res. If the study or report contains trade secret or confidential information protected by law, the organization shall only be required to provide a description of the research and its relevance to the program that omits any of the trade secret or confidential information.

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- Requires that MRC report on research activities pertaining to:
 - Mattress collection, dismantling & recycling operations
 - Source reduction & green product design
 - Response to problem of illegal dumping
 - Progress made as result of research activities
- States that if any of the activities undertaken to implement this measure were unsuccessful, MRC shall identify the problems with the current activities, and report on the new activities.
- Requires that MRC include a hard copy of all research studies & reports and an explanation of how research benefits program.

RESEARCH

MRC seeks to improve the sustainability of mattress recycling by:1

- Advancing the efficient collection and transportation of discarded mattresses.
- Identifying and promoting best practices for mattress dismantling and recycling.
- Identifying new and better uses for the recycled components.
- Fostering innovation, cooperation and communication between suppliers, manufacturers, collectors, dismantlers and end-market commodity buyers to increase mattress recycling rates.

To assist in developing and managing its research efforts, MRC works with an experienced team of research and innovation subcontractors to identify projects that have the potential to achieve both short-term, high-impact results, as well as longer-term projects with multi-year horizons. This section summarizes completed, in-progress (active) and future projects or areas of interest. When projects span multiple calendar years, they will be discussed in several reporting cycles. From a portfolio management perspective, MRC works to establish and manage a diverse family of projects which explores both incremental and disruptive technology development.

MRC is encouraged by its efforts to date but is realistic, recognizing that by their nature research outcomes are unpredictable, with some projects producing useful results and others failing. Moreover, many factors influence market acceptance of new technologies. Therefore, research is necessary to improve long-term industry performance but should not be focused exclusively on short-term results.

With these cautions in mind, MRC evaluates research proposals and defines the intended objective of each research project awarded. This process considers whether the proposer is qualified to undertake the project and the value proposition. Awarded projects are funded contingent on established, structured and milestone-driven contracts with the selected organization. MRC's research program metrics are structured to:

- Reward learning
- Encourage taking and managing risks

¹ In addition to MRC's research efforts to improve the sustainability of mattress recycling, Cal. Pub. Res. Code § 42990.1(m)(3) also requires that MRC report on research activities undertaken concerning, "source reduction and green product design, and the response to the problem of illegal dumping." - Encourage collaboration
- Meet project milestones
- Produce results

Research projects may be accelerated or extended (or stopped entirely) if it appears the work is likely to produce valuable (or inconclusive) results.

Completed Projects

Mattress Collection Site Improvement Funding

For the sixth year, MRC funded improvements at mattress collection sites to increase the number of mattresses diverted from landfills, improve the recyclability of discarded units, improve worker safety, decrease mattress handling time, reduce fire risk, and decrease transportation costs by increasing the number of units shipped per container. Beginning in late 2018, public and private collection sites in California have been eligible for up to \$10,000 per site per year. Funding recipients must agree to serve as MRC-contracted public drop-off sites for at least one year following reimbursement of funds for project costs.

In 2024, 11 projects were completed and reimbursed, totaling \$98,534. The scope of work included improvements to mattress collection areas to increase the recyclability of units, purchasing equipment for safer and more efficient loading of units, and securing units against fire and contamination. In total, the 11 projects anticipate collecting an additional 28,778 units annually for recycling as a result of the funding (see <u>Table 28</u>) Two of the sites were new to MRC's program.

MRC funded three other projects in 2024 that will be completed and funded in 2025; all three of these are new MRC collection sites. A report on those projects will appear in the next annual report. MRC continues to accept applications from eligible sites throughout the year.

Recycled Mattress Textiles in Composite Products

In 2023, MRC initiated a study to explore the potential use of recovered mattress shoddy and cotton as reinforcing fibers in polyurethane-based composites with applications across various industrial sectors, including aerospace, automotive, marine, electronics and biomedical. Fibers are commonly used to reinforce urethanes or epoxy resins, resulting in durable, lightweight and strong products. The research, led by Dr. Ram Gupta at Pittsburg State University, focused on a bio-based polyurethane system as the base resin.

Dr. Gupta's findings revealed that composites containing up to 20% cotton exhibited excellent physical properties. Similarly, shoddy-reinforced composites showed promising results, with a maximum content of approximately 15%. The study highlights the composites industry's interest in developing materials with a lower carbon footprint and demonstrates a viable pathway to achieve this goal. A <u>final report</u> was prepared and is posted on MRC's web site. The next step is to review these findings with the composite community to gauge interest in commercializing this technology. The total funding provided for this project was \$47,297.

Life Cycle Analysis

In 2022, MRC completed a life cycle analysis (LCA) project to assess the environmental impacts of its mattress recycling operations. The analysis examined 11 environmental impacts across each stage of MRC's process: collection, transportation and recycling. It also evaluated the benefits of reducing landfill waste and using recycled mattress materials in place of virgin materials. The study concluded that the environmental benefits of mattress recycling are substantial.

An independent review to verify the LCA findings in accordance with International Standards Organization requirements concluded in 2024. The review committee confirmed the overall environmental benefits of the recycling program. Both the <u>full LCA</u> and <u>independent review</u> reports are available on MRC's website. The total funding for the LCA study and independent review, which included composition, age and waste characterization studies, was \$175,400.

Cotton Fibers in Biodegradable 3D Printed Composites

MRC collaborated with West Virginia University to explore using recycled mattress cotton in biodegradable 3D-printed composites. Initial efforts with extruded filament feedstocks faced nozzle clogging, leading the team to create compression-molded samples and conduct biodegradation studies, were completed in late 2023.

These studies, simulating composting conditions, showed that cotton-based composites had similar greenhouse gas emissions (mainly carbon dioxide) to pure cotton. In contrast, landfill decomposition emits up to 50% methane, a potent greenhouse gas. While mechanical recycling remains ideal, composting offers a lower environmental impact alternative to landfilling.

The final report, funded at \$71,289, is on MRC's website.

Recycled Foam Characterization

To facilitate market development for post-consumer mattress foam, MRC commissioned a study at University of California Los Angeles (Prof. Samanvaya Srivastava) to characterize foam composition, variability and presence of extractable components. The study encompassed three sub-projects:

- Statistical analysis of foam chemistry and physical properties
- Quantification of extractable additives and residual compounds
- Detection of bacteria and mold

Analysis of over 100 foam samples from 60 mattresses revealed that resilience (ball rebound) effectively distinguishes conventional and memory foam. Extractable additives and residual compounds containing tin (single to hundreds of ppm) and chlorine (~100 to thousands of ppm) likely originate from catalysts and flame retardants. Bismuth, bromine and fluorine levels were below 10 ppm, and PFAS were undetected (10 ppt detection limit).

Seven foam samples were cultured and all of them showed the presence of bacteria and mold, suggesting this issue may require consideration when recycling or reusing post-consumer mattress foam in certain applications.

This \$175,965 study, <u>published on MRC's website</u> in April 2024, supports the goal of providing recyclers with feedstock of known composition and consistency for higher-value end uses.

Oleo Sponge

Oil spill cleanup represents a potential new market for recycled mattress foam. While organic sorbents are commonly used in clean-up applications, foam use is limited due to its cost, low oil uptake and unfavorable oil:water selectivity. An MRC-sponsored research project at Arizona State University (Prof. Tim Long) explored a simple, cost-effective process to change the surface of post-consumer mattress foam to enhance oil absorption properties.

Modifying foam surfaces with oleophilic groups in conventional reactors significantly improved oil absorption. One modification tripled oil uptake with a 75% increase in oil:water selectivity compared to unmodified foam. Another increased oil uptake by 50% while decreasing water uptake fourfold, resulting in a six-fold increase in oil:water selectivity. These modified foams exhibited 3-4 times higher oil absorption capacity than representative commercial sorbents.

Analytical techniques confirmed successful surface modification of the foam, while scanning electron microscopic imaging showed that the foam's structural integrity was largely maintained after functionalization. While further development is needed to demonstrate the viability in field applications, these results suggest chemically modified PU foam offers a promising, cost-effective solution for oil spill cleanup.

An <u>Executive Summary</u> of the work was published on our website in fourth quarter of 2024. After patent filings are submitted, MRC will publish more detailed results of this study and explore the potential for development of related products. The project cost totaled \$95,947.

Vitrimerization of Polyurethane Foam

In May 2021, MRC contracted with Edge Geoscience Inc. (EGI) to investigate whether mattress foam could be transformed into valuable, reformable polymers. The primary goal was to evaluate the potential for creating new components for various consumer and industrial products such as cell phone covers, shoe soles, conveyor belts and tool grips.

The project was built on previous research by top university material science laboratories, which demonstrated that polyurethane foams could be thermo-chemically converted into covalent dynamic networks (vitrimers). These vitrimers are meltable pellets that can be reshaped and recycled into useful products. EGI successfully scaled this technology using post-consumer mattress foam and filed a patent application in August 2022.

In 2024, EGI founded Vitricycle LLC to commercialize the technology and establish a pilot-scale process center while collaboration agreements were executed with the mattress industry supply chain. Vitricycle is developing formulations with 50% to 100% post-consumer recycled content, with ongoing work in 2025. They plan to work with end users to fine-tune formulations and establish supply agreements. MRC concluded its funding in September 2024, investing \$230,000 over three years and publishing the final report available on our website.

This program highlights the importance of providing technical support and funding to innovators working to advance promising technologies on the commercial scale. The successful commercialization of vitrimer technology could create a significant new use for recovered mattress foam, emphasizing the impact of MRC's support for recycling technologies. MRC will continue to collaborate with Vitricycle and other innovators in this space to further advance the technology platform.

Compression Trailer

A collaborative program with G&G Transport and Tough Stuff Recycling was initiated to investigate the feasibility of compressing mattresses and pocket coils to reduce transportation costs. Similar initiatives in Europe demonstrated that mattresses could be compressed by up to 50% of their initial height without affecting recyclability. This would allow more mattresses to be transported per load from collection sites to recycling facilities, thus reducing logistics costs.

In 2024, a prototype trailer was built, and several trial shipments of compressed mattresses and foundations were conducted. These trials also demonstrated an over 50% increase in net cargo weight per shipment. However, some potential savings were offset by increased loading and handling times. Overall, the trials suggested a potential 40%-45% reduction in logistics costs per unit. MRC provided \$175,000 in funding to help cover development costs. The <u>project report</u> was posted to MRC's website in August 2024.

To fully implement the solution, further design modifications are needed. G&G Transport has committed to developing a second-generation trailer at its own expense without additional financial support from MRC. Once this is complete, MRC will reengage to explore commercial-scale implementation.

Active Research Projects

Lean Manufacturing Assessment of MRC California Recyclers

In 2021, MRC launched a lean manufacturing program aimed at reducing or eliminating non-value-adding activities within the organization. This methodology focuses on continuous improvement and problem-solving. Since its inception, MRC recyclers have consistently shown overall productivity enhancements. Many have even created permanent roles to oversee lean improvement activities at their facilities. Based on feedback, future lean improvement projects will now be managed directly by the recyclers, with MRC reimbursing qualified expenses that aim to boost operational productivity.

Recycling Facility Fire Assessments

Mattress recycling can involve fire safety risks. To encourage MRC's recyclers to learn about and implement fire safety compliance and mitigation tactics, MRC contracted with Doyle Sullivan LLC, a nationally certified fire safety consultant with over four decades of experience in fire prevention and suppression.

In 2024, Doyle Sullivan provided fire assessments at each MRC contracted recycling facility in California to evaluate fire risk reduction opportunities and code compliance. These assessments were intended to help each facility understand the complexities of fire safety. MRC encourages all recyclers to conduct and provide our contractor with a monthly fire risk self-assessment that provides a basis for on-going discussion and awareness of fire prevention throughout the year.

MRC will provide this service again in 2025.

Recycled Mattress Foam in Footwear and Automotive Applications

A sponsored project at George Mason University (Prof. Shay Bagheri) to explore the use of mechanically recycled polyurethane foam in footwear and automative applications was launched in the fourth quarter of 2024. This research will evaluate the feasibility of integrating recycled mattress foam into these products, focusing on foam segregation and mechanical recycling. The four-phase project will: 1) assess recycled polyurethane foam's suitability for target applications by analyzing its mechanical properties; 2) refine foam separation processes based on these properties; 3) design and create composite products (footwear outsoles/insoles, automotive door panels); and 4) characterize these products to ensure they meet industry standards.

Surface Engineered Powders from Recycled Mattress Foam

In the fourth quarter of 2024, MRC initiated a sponsored research project with RoCo to develop powdered, optionally surface-functionalized, foam-based products for potential use in coatings, composites, lubricants, batteries or catalyst supports. This project aims to create engineered, high-surface-area foam products tailored to specific applications.

Initial prototypes have produced particles having a mean particle size of 100-150 micron without cryogenic processing. Future work will aim to optimize the grinder for fine particle production, scale-up the process, demonstrate the functionalization reaction and evaluate the resulting powders in selected applications.

Future Areas of Interest

Bridging the Gap

In early 2024, MRC launched a new initiative to accelerate driving promising research projects to commercial scale. In most cases, a concept proven at lab scale requires additional research to produce an improved material at larger scale and integrate the concept into final products. Unfortunately, the risk profile of production scale investment without clear sight of revenue is a formidable challenge for most enterprises. As a result, promising innovations can stagnate for lack of investment at this stage, a phenomenon often referred to as the "innovator's dilemma."

Driving innovations to commercial scale requires collaboration at multiple levels in the supply chain. Obtaining buy-in from end users, developing prototypes and investing in pilot scale production are examples of activities that are necessary to take technical and commercial readiness to a self-sustainable level. To focus on this challenge, MRC increased technical resources and funding to help create awareness of the potential market value, de-risk scale-up activities, build networks and encourage assembly of enduser sponsored product development teams. Co-investment from the marketplace may take many forms including government-sponsored small business innovation awards, government grants, corporate sponsorship and private party agreements.

In 2024, MRC was successful in supporting pilot-scale development of vitrimer technology. Efforts to scale carbonization technologies are ongoing. Composite technologies and surface modification projects, which were successful at lab scale will be next in the development pipeline.

High-Performance Carbon from Recycled Mattress Materials

A research team led by Dr. Ram Gupta at the National Institute for Materials Advancement (NIMA) completed a 3-year study sponsored by MRC which successfully developed high performance carbon materials. The trial products, tested in high-performance battery and capacitor applications, could address global shortages of carbon for electrodes and reduce mattress waste. Further details are on MRC's website.

The NIMA team and MRC are jointly working to develop collaborative relationships with potential industry suppliers to commercialize the technology. However, leading manufacturers require consistent high-volume feedstocks and high graphene purity (~99.5%) for top-end applications. Smaller-scale biomass-to-carbon facilities have also showed interest, as recovered textiles outperform biomass feedstocks in certain conditions. Further market development will continue in 2025.

Biochar

The biochar industry in California is not well developed, with most companies operating at pilot or small scale. MRC is still interested in exploring biochar as a potential end use for post-consumer mattress wood if capacity or costs at biomass facilities are no longer economically viable options for recyclers. Unfortunately, we have yet to identify a suitable California-based company to conduct a pilot project. While composting wood is feasible, foundation wood must be shredded to a small size to decompose at a rate similar to other organic material. The potential benefits from biochar include making energy and/or a char soil amendment that sequesters feedstock carbon in the finished biochar product.

NSF-Funded Foam Circularity Research

MRC continues to serve on the Stakeholder Committee for a 4-year project funded by the National Science Foundation (NSF) called the Emerging Frontiers in Research & Innovation Circularity of Cross-linked Polyurethane Foams. This research is being conducted by scientific teams from Arizona State University and Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University. The Stakeholder Committee provides insights from essential stakeholders in the U.S. polyurethane foam value-chain that will inform and guide the research team's efforts, decisions and resource allocations. The Stakeholder Committee convenes regularly to establish a conduit and communication channel between industry members and the research team.

The project is scheduled to conclude in 2025. MRC will provide conclusions and links to final reports on our website when available.

Sustainability

Circularity for the Mattress Industry

As MRC manages its own efforts to improve mattress recycling and find new and better markets for reclaimed mattress materials, we regularly communicate with other mattress recycling organizations around the world and stay abreast of broader efforts being pursued to work toward enhancing circularity in the mattress industry.

Designing mattresses that are easier to recycle is a common thread in discussions among manufacturers interested in sharing best practices. However, end-of-life management priorities and strategies diverge significantly from region to region. Rather than invest in conventional recycling infrastructure, which is mostly downcycling, some countries are moving directly to technologies that would recycle polymeric materials (such as foam and some fibers) through chemical recycling, pyrolysis and gasification. We anticipate further political and scientific debate regarding the best ways to manage difficult waste streams while contemplating the greenhouse gas impacts of various technologies.

In Europe, several pilot and commercial chemical recycling facilities now convert post-consumer polyurethane foam back into its chemical building blocks that can then be used to make new polyurethane foam and other materials. With increased experience and a better understanding of the technical risks and business cases, public-private sector entities and an industry-led consortia are exploring means to globally expand the most promising technologies. Decisions regarding the size and placement of these future facilities will have significant environmental and economic impacts. MRC has been actively engaged with these organizations to provide volume estimates and feedstock quality data to help inform these decisions.

In the United States, MRC continues its focus first on developing better and new markets for mechanically recycled materials. Although mechanical recycling does not create full circularity, it is an important part of the overall strategy because it typically has a favorable environmental impact. Second, MRC thinks that building operational efficiencies to collect, transport and process discarded units is equally important. In these two areas, MRC is taking a leading role and sharing findings with other regions.

Finally, among stakeholders, consensus is building that circularity is an idea that will take considerable time and investment to attain. Moving forward, several industry trade organizations in Europe, the United States, Asia and Australia have committed to playing a lead role to encourage investment and to facilitate communication and collaboration in pursuit of this goal. Global collaborative networks have already formed to explore and address capability gaps systematically with the following initial priorities:

- Develop better designs.
- Develop the means to increase recycled content in raw materials.

- Build sustainable logistics and recycling infrastructure.
- Establish a science-based forum to advance meaningful innovation.
- Establish a more informative material labeling system.
- Develop an effective, easy-to-understand communication plan for consumers.

Industry Workgroup on Circular Design

MRC formed the Industry Workgroup on Circular Design to help members of the value chain take end-of-life recycling challenges into account when they design new components and mattresses. MRC shares lessons learned from mattress deconstruction and recycling with the workgroup to help find strategies that will reduce waste generation and create value by recycling post-consumer mattress components.

The workgroup meets annually during ISPA's Sustainability Conferences, bringing together component suppliers, manufacturers and mattress recyclers. In 2024, MRC opened the discussion to all attendees of the Sustainability Conference. Over 100 people were in attendance

The workgroup's goals are to:

- Discuss how to improve the circularity of mattresses.
- Share recyclers' experiences with suppliers, designers and manufacturers to understand design and materials impacts on mattress deconstruction and end-of-life component recycling.
- Anticipate whether new materials and assembly techniques will require adjustments to recycling infrastructure when a mattress is discarded.
- Develop consensus on circular design principles for the mattress industry.

The 2024 meeting opened with feedback from recyclers that may be used to improve the circularity of future designs. Attendees were then given six breakout topics to select from and then divided into the top four breakout sessions covering:

- **Design for Deconstruction:** How mattress design, component composition/ selection and assembly techniques might be adjusted to reduce manufacturing waste, improve recyclability and reduce recycled material contamination.
- Waste Reduction Across the Value Chain: How strategies such as increased product longevity, in-plant recycling and packaging improvements can reduce waste.
- **Circular Fabrication Materials:** How materials from technical and biological material flows (such as recycled and renewable materials or polyols) can reduce environmental impacts from manufacturing.
- **Identifying Barriers to Circularity:** Discuss the current barriers to converting post-consumer mattress materials into viable new products.

Pocketed Coils

Pocketed coils are an example of how this workgroup and the industry have addressed one component recycling challenge. A pocketed coil innerspring unit is made from steel coils that are typically enclosed in polypropylene fabric sleeves. Various companies have developed shredders or other approaches to effectively separate the steel and polypropylene fabric. The most effective of which created a clean polypropylene feedstock that can be sold through existing scrap plastic markets. Today there are pocketed coils manufactured with:

- Polypropylene-based glues that are more compatible with the fabric for potential buyers of the recycled fabric.
- Sonically welded pocketed coils structures that eliminate the use of glue.
- A prototype of perforated polypropylene fabric that allows pocketed coils to be separated more easily at recycling facilities.

Additionally, BedTimes magazine published a case study on the industry's response to the pocketed coil challenge called "How Industry Collaboration is Improving Sustainability" in the February 2024 issue.

The Industry Workgroup on Circular Design will meet again during ISPA's Sustainability Conference in September 2025.

Industry Work Group on New Materials

MRC formed the Industry Workgroup on New Materials to identify end-of-life challenges posed by mattresses being sold to consumers today, to advise MRC on anticipated long-term changes in product mix and raise industry awareness about how design and marketing decisions can affect recycling. Members of the workgroup represent foam, textile and spring suppliers. Participants share information about new materials introduced since the last workgroup meeting and evaluate potential implications that new materials may have on future mattress recycling operations. The workgroup's efforts inform MRC's research team and assist recyclers in preparing for these challenges as well as forecast future types and quantities of mattress materials available for recycling. The workgroup meets with MRC annually.

During the 2024 meeting, the workgroup identified potential challenges and suggested that MRC continue to engage with the industry to better understand how product design and individual components affect the recycling process.

Global Mattress Recycling Coalition

The Global Mattress Recycling Coalition met again during ISPA EXPO in March 2024. The meeting was held in person and virtually to accommodate attendees from various time zones. Attendees included recyclers, mattress manufacturers, component suppliers, stewardship organizations and industry associations from Australia, Belgium, Canada,

France, India, the Netherlands, Poland, United Kingdom and the United States. The first part of the meeting included regulatory updates from organizations around the world and how various organizations are preparing. In the second part of the meeting, participants presented projects focused on improving mattress circularity in each region. Members of this group continue to meet informally as developments or improvements are found to advance efficient collection, transportation, deconstruction or end markets for mattress materials.

Circular Economy for Polyurethane Foam

Polyurethane foam is an important material used in most mattresses. At present, only a small percentage of polyurethane foam is recycled globally. For several years, an interdisciplinary international effort to improve polyurethane foam circularity has been underway.

Most major polyurethane chemical suppliers have established goals to reduce their carbon footprints by 50% by 2035 and achieve net zero by 2050. As part of these initiatives, researchers have developed feedstocks derived from bio-based and chemically recycled materials. While several manufacturers have already introduced products with increased bio and/or recycled content, MRC understands that these new products still have low industry adoption rates.

To further enhance circularity in the EU, several chemical companies have partnered with recyclers to develop end-of-life solutions for post-consumer foam. This field is very active, with several pilot and commercial facilities now producing recycled content polyol, subsidized by EU funding. These recycling processes and their resulting outputs are dependent on facility design, which is taking three distinct paths:

- Low energy intensity processes generate a mixture of urethane chemicals.
 Formulations to use these recovered materials to displace virgin chemicals in the flexible foam manufacturing process are under development and show promise.
 Recycled content in finished products, however, currently tends to be less than 25%.
- 2. Alternative depolymerization technologies effectively separate the major chemical components in a purer form that can be used to make new foam or other products. With some adaptation in formulating technologies, these materials may be used to make products with much higher recycled content.
- 3. More energy-intensive developmental processes can generate building block chemicals that could theoretically be further refined or used as feedstocks in existing chemical manufacturing facilities. The displacement of virgin products in these facilities could approach 100%.

Each of these approaches has a cost/performance tradeoff. At this point, the cost to generate chemicals from a recycled material feedstock exceeds the cost of production from virgin sources. Therefore, investment to generate the recycled chemicals on a commercial scale will require subsidies.

MRC's current recycling rate for polyurethane mattress foam exceeds 80% (almost all of which is mechanically recycled into carpet padding). However, consumer demand for carpet padding is falling because carpet's share of the U.S. flooring market is declining. Furthermore, as more states enact their own mattress recycling laws, the supply of post-consumer mattress foam will increase.

Therefore, to sustain the currently high recycling rate for polyurethane mattress foam, it is imperative that MRC seeks to develop new markets for this material. MRC's LCA study demonstrates that mechanical and chemical recycling processes have similar environmental benefits.

As discussed earlier in this chapter and in previous annual reports, MRC is also funding research on an alternative low-intensity thermomechanical recycling process called vitrimerization, which has the potential to convert foam into reformable polymers for use in a variety of common consumer products. While these are not purely circular solutions, preliminary assessments indicate that they might offer favorable environmental benefits. MRC thinks that investment in all options will be necessary to substantially improve the global recycling rate for mattress foams.

Sleep Products Sustainability Program

In 2019, MRC launched an initiative called the Sleep Products Sustainability Program (SP2), focused on providing mattress manufacturers with a management process for reducing material waste, water and energy consumption. SP2 helps individual mattress manufacturers analyze and understand the environmental impacts of their products by examining:

- The raw materials they manage and consume in manufacturing and distributing those products.
- The energy, water and other resources needed to manufacture and distribute mattresses, and how to manage and minimize waste products generated at each stage in the manufacturing and distribution processes.
- The nature and designs of the products they manufacture.
- How the products they manufacture today are managed at the end of their useful lives by recyclers.

SP2 helps mattress manufacturers develop methods for improving their businesses, products and processes in light of these factors. For example, these methods identify steps manufacturers can take to reduce their environmental impacts, define metrics for measuring the impact of those changes and learn from best practices. The goal is to help mattress manufacturers create voluntary and practical environmental management systems that can produce continual improvements over time, reinforced by periodic follow-up reviews by MRC.

Program Criteria

SP2 includes methods to train and verify the participant meets the SP2 requirements. A participant must meet the criteria in Table 29 to obtain SP2 certification:

Program Resources

MRC has developed the following resources to meet the needs of SP2 participants:

- **Training:** A comprehensive, personalized training for all participants. Offered virtually.
- **SP2 Requirements Document:** A concise document detailing the minimum requirements for certification.
- **SP2 Guidance Document:** A comprehensive document that details each of the 11 requirements, providing a description, examples and gap analysis questions.
- **SP2 Resources Website:** A participants-only website that contains program material, archived webinars and downloadable tools to assist with certification.

- **SP2 Toolkit:** A monthly resource that provides participants with methods and examples to achieve one of the SP2 requirements.
- Program Tools: Downloadable tools to help participants assess, track and make
 progress towards certification. Tools include facility impact assessment and gap
 analysis templates, a utility tracking tool, a corrective and preventative action tracking
 tool and a program verification checklist.

In 2024, MRC developed or modified the following additional resources and online tools to assist participants in the SP2 process:

- New Best Practice Sharing Videos: MRC held an SP2 session at 2024 ISPA EXPO highlighting five best practices from certified SP2 facilities. Individual videos were created for each of the best practices and shared with both potential and existing participants.
- SP2 Utility Tracking Tool, Revised: This tool was updated at the request of
 participants to include volume-to-weight estimations based on US EPA conversions
 for smaller collection containers that are not weighed.
- **SP2 Gap Analysis Worksheet, Revised:** This tool was updated to provide an example of a completed gap analysis and translation to next steps.
- SP2 Corrective and Preventative Actions Worksheet, Revised: This template was updated to provide examples of tracking methods for tasks needed to return an SP2 system to its planned operation.
- Target Process Charts Template, New: This template was created in response to a participant request to assist in displaying their monthly progress against annual targets.
- Completed Facility Impact Assessment Example, New: This example was developed as a reference for new facilities to see a completed Facility Impact Assessment to assist them in completing their own.
- **Training Tracking Sheet, New:** This template was developed to provide a ready format to track SP2 training needs, assignment to employees and completion.
- **SP2 New Participant Training, Revised:** The training was updated to reflect program updates, incorporating best practices from certified facilities.
- SP2 Participant Training eLearning Pilot: MRC is developing an online SP2 training, or eLearning to replace live training. This will provide on-demand training for new participants and retraining for new SP2 team members at existing certified facilities. This has been frequently requested due to an ever-changing business climate and to address turnover at manufacturing facilities. The eLearning program will provide both visual and audio components to accommodate various learning styles. In 2024, the initial planning stage for the content plan was completed.

General Industry Best Practice Sharing

MRC held a workshop in March 2024 during ISPA EXPO called *Navigating the Road to Sustainable Sleep: Best Practices in Sustainable Manufacturing.* MRC highlighted five best practices that yielded impressive results from SP2 certified facilities. Each practice was introduced and highlighted what made it successful and lessons learned. The five best practices were: end-of-shift shutdown, reducing quilting transition waste, compressed air efficiency blitz, recycling that supports work, and waste and energy in product launch checklist. Each attendee was provided with a handout of salient points for each best practice. MRC received positive feedback for the practical solutions that attendees could easily implement in their facilities.

MRC recorded the session and broke down each best practice into its own video. These videos have been shared with all workshop attendees, current SP2 participants and through social media channels.

Program Metrics

MRC uses the following metrics to determine the success of the program:

- Participant Status: Participant count at each stage (registration, training, developing, certification, recertification)
- Waste Diversion: Qualitative description of participants' waste diversion activities and quantitative data regarding waste diverted by participants (anonymized and aggregated after completing five certifications)
- **Education and Outreach:** Number of impressions or touchpoints with current participants (newsletters, trainings and webinars, etc.), and number of impressions with potential participants (marketing, advertising, webinars, etc.)

Participant Status

Table 30 provides the participant count at each stage of SP2. MRC continues to assist trained facilities with achieving their SP2 certification and recruit eligible manufacturers that sell mattresses to California residents and businesses.

Registered/Untrained participants have registered to participate in the program but have not received training. Trained/Developing participants received training and are working on the SP2 requirements. Participants can be at this stage for six months to one year while evaluating current sustainability activities, identifying opportunities and implementing new practices. Certified participants have met all requirements and obtained SP2 certification. Recertified participants have recertified their SP2 program at least once.

Waste Diversion

To achieve SP2 certification, each participant must set qualitative goals and quantitative targets for waste reduction and diversion. Qualitative accomplishments were collected from certified participants through the annual maintenance audits. Examples of projects implemented in 2024 by participants include:

- Added collection containers (compactors, collection bins, open top containers) for recycling streams and removing containers for landfill to divert more material into recycled-content next markets.
- Improved labeling of recycling containers to improve employee sorting accuracy.
- Reduced printer paper use through streamlined reports and converting processes to paperless methods.
- Worked with recycling vendors to improve sorting accuracy, reduce contamination and achieve higher value in collected materials.
- Upgraded thermostats for energy savings.
- Implemented end-of-shift shutdown procedures for energy savings.
- Converted fuel vehicles to battery-electric vehicles to reduce carbon emissions.

In 2025, MRC will provide qualitative descriptions about SP2 participants' waste diversion targets. Once MRC has certified five participants, anonymized and aggregated waste diversion quantitative data will be reported in future annual reports.

Education and Outreach

To recruit participants, MRC publicizes SP2 among mattress manufacturers and in industry trade publications – BedTimes, Sleep Savvy and Furniture Today – both print and digital editions and in monthly social media posts. MRC generated further awareness about SP2 through its participation during ISPA's Sustainability Conference. All SP2 announcements, advertisements and outreach materials encouraged readers to visit a dedicated webpage (www.MattressRecyclingCouncil.org/SP2).

In 2024, MRC published a monthly newsletter. SP2 Toolkit, which is distributed to participants in the program and those already certified and those working towards certification.

Program participants (certified facilities and trained facilities currently working towards certification) continue to receive the monthly SP2 Toolkit. The monthly SP2 Toolkit was sent to 30 program participants with an average open rate of 30%. Each month, the toolkit offers a comprehensive overview of one of the 11 certification requirements. This includes defining the requirement, how to meet the requirement, relevant resources and examples of how to accomplish it. Immediately following the distribution of toolkit emails, it is common for participants to contact SP2 support with questions about building the next element of their SP2 system, indicating that this is acting as an effective reminder for facilities working toward certification.

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Financing Mechanism

CALIFORNIA PUBLIC RESOURCES CODE AND REGULATIONS

14 CCR § 18964 (b)(9) — Financing Mechanism. Include the mattress recycling organization's total expenses and revenues associated with the implementation of the used mattress recycling program. Changes to the mattresses recycling charge shall be reflected in the annual program budget for approval by the department. If a mattress recycling organization conducts activities that are separate from the implementation and management of the California used mattress recycling program, then the annual report shall include documentation on how the collection and use of funds from the California mattress recycling charge were kept separate from other activities of the mattress recycling organization, including the methodology for distribution of shared costs. Consistent with subdivision (a) of section 42990.1 of the Public Resources Code, the annual report shall include the following:

- (A) Mattress recycling charge per mattress size
- (B) Capital costs
- (C) Education/Outreach costs
- (D) End-of-life used mattress management costs with line items, if applicable, for collection, transportation, recycling, renovating, reuse, and proper disposal
- (E) Program administration costs including, but not limited to, the department's costs pursuant to subdivision (a) of section 42988.2 of the Public Resources Code, and third party legal costs. Surplus funds, if any, and detailed rationale for the specified level of surplus.

Financing Mechanism

In 2024, the Mattress Recycling Council Inc. (MRC Inc.) operated mattress recycling programs in three states: California, Connecticut and Rhode Island. MRC Inc. has established separate limited liability companies (LLCs) for each state program. The LLC operating the California program is Mattress Recycling Council California, LLC (MRC).

Each state program's LLC maintains its own financial records to reflect the receipt of the appropriate recycling charge and the direct expenses that it incurs (e.g., collection, recycling, transportation, communications, etc.). MRC Inc. allocates shared expenses (e.g., administration costs, overhead, etc.) among the three state program LLCs based on the relative population of each state. Each LLC also has a separate reserve for that state program.

Using the format specified in CalRecycle's regulations, we review MRC's total 2024 expenses and revenues associated with the California program with tables comparing 2024 actual expenses and revenues to 2023 actuals, as well as projections for 2025 and the budget for 2026, subject to CalRecycle's approval, as follows:².

Revenue from the Mattress Recycling Charge

Cal. Pub. Res. Code § 42989(b)(2) authorizes MRC to either (1) set a single recycling charge that applies to all sizes and types of mattresses and foundations, or (2) set two different charges "to accommodate mattress size differentials." MRC maintained a single charge for 2024 and in its 2025 budget (as approved by CalRecycle). Factors MRC considered that supported this decision included avoiding confusion among retailers and consumers, ease of consumer messaging and simplified charge collection and reporting obligations for retailers when they collect the charge from consumers and then remit those charges to MRC.

MRC collected this recycling charge on all sales of mattresses and foundations to California residents or end users (e.g., hotels, educational institutions, etc.), regardless of size. In 2024, registered retailers and other sellers reported California sales of

² For these purposes, all 2023 and 2024 revenue and expenses are based on MRC's audited financials. Projections for 2025 are based on unaudited 1st quarter 2025 actuals and forecasted revenue and expenses for the remainder of the year. 3,265,445 units, 3.5% less than 2023, including 14,850 units reported as sold in prior years (2018–2023). In fact, 2024 mattress sales were down 2.5% from 2024 projections submitted to CalRecycle in July 2024. As a result, in 2024 MRC collected recycling charge revenue totaling \$34,287,173 (3,265,445 units multiplied by \$10.50).

In 2024, the California program also earned \$28,388 in late fees on recycling charge remittance from retailers to MRC. The total revenue for 2024 including recycling charge and late fees was \$34,315,561.

Table 32 shows MRC's 2023 and 2024 actual revenue from the recycling charge and late fee revenue, 2025 projected revenue and its budgeted 2026 revenue.

Capital Costs

Other than modest expenditures on computers, software and office equipment, MRC incurred no capital costs in 2024 related to the California program.

Education and Outreach Costs

Costs for education and outreach activities in 2024 totaled \$2,425,118, 13.3% lower than 2023, representing 5.1% of total expenses. MRC continued to meet its communication objectives, providing robust industry- and consumer-targeted outreach as explained in the Education and Outreach section of this report. Table 33 shows 2023 and 2024 actual education and outreach costs, projected 2025 costs and budgeted 2026 expenses.

End-of-Life Used Mattress Management Costs

MRC classifies as Operational Costs expenses incurred for mattress collection (including the Illegally Dumped Mattress Collection Initiative), transportation and recycling. As summarized in Table 34, MRC's 2024 Operational Costs for end-of-life management were \$37,348,497, an increase of 11.6% from 2023 levels. Total units collected and recycled in 2024 were 1,558,042, an increase of 6.6% from 2023 units. This increase in units collected directly affected recycling and collection costs.

The following provides additional details for Operational Costs:

Collection Costs

- Solid Waste Handling Fees: MRC paid \$3,588,874 (6.5% higher than 2023) to collection sites throughout the state to compensate them for consolidating discarded mattresses in containers for transport to an MRC recycling facility.
- Collection Containers and Storage: MRC incurred \$1,787,242 in 2024 (6.9% more than 2023) for trailers and roll-off container rentals that hold and transport collected units.
- Consumer Incentive: In 2024, MRC recyclers paid a total of \$260,069 (23.4% less than 2023) in consumer incentives to encourage residents to deliver discarded mattresses directly to MRC recycling facilities and one external consumer incentive location. In setting the per unit incentive amount, MRC took into account Cal. Pub.

Res. Code § 42985(b), which states the legislature's intent that MRC's statewide program not undermine existing used mattress recycling, resale, refurbishing and reuse operations that are in compliance with state and federal law.

- Collection Site Signage/Guidelines: MRC incurred \$12,292 in 2024 (17.8% higher than 2023) to provide new collection site signage and updated written guidelines to collection sites. MRC produces the signs when a new site joins the program or existing signage is damaged.
- Illegally Dumped Mattress Collection Initiative: MRC spent \$1,185,299 in 2024 (36.1% higher than 2023) to address illegally dumped mattresses in California. Most of these costs (\$972,845) were payments to entities, including local governments, solid waste facilities, franchise haulers and nonprofits contracted to count and pick up mattresses that were illegally dumped in their communities. Funding for pilot studies of \$176,678 is also included in the 2024 total. The Mitigation of Illegal Mattress Dumping section contains more information.

Transportation

MRC paid \$9,550,143 in 2024 (9.7% more than 2023) to transport collected units to MRC recyclers, including \$983,320 to transport pocketed coils to a central processing facility. This increase is directly related to the increase in units transported. Although an increase in units resulted in higher total transportation costs, the per unit cost decreased from \$6.92 to \$6.68 due to cost saving efficiencies, including several recyclers processing their own pocketed coils (thus reducing the need for MRC to transport some pocketed coils to a central processing facility).

Recycling

MRC contracts with recyclers to dismantle and recycle units in California. In 2024, MRC paid eight contracted recyclers (operating 10 facilities) \$20,964,578 (13.4% more than 2023), including \$696,637 for processing pocketed coils at a central processing facility. The increase is due to higher processing volumes and rate increases by each recycler.

Pocketed coils contain recyclable steel, but most scrap steel purchasers require that the steel be separated from the polypropylene pocket fabric. By the end of 2024, two recyclers were completely processing their own pocketed coils, and another recycler was processing most of its own pocketed coils. For recyclers who did not process pocketed coils, MRC transported the material to a centrally located recycler for processing. In 2025, all MRC recyclers were required to manage their own pocketed coils, eliminating the need for additional transportation and processing.

Table 34 shows MRC's 2023 and 2024 actual end-of-life management costs, its projected 2025 costs and its budgeted 2026 expenses.

Research

MRC seeks to enhance the impact of California's mattress recycling program by improving the efficiency and effectiveness of mattress collection, transportation and deconstruction while identifying and developing new and better end uses for recovered materials. In addition, MRC operates the Sleep Products Sustainability Program (SP2) which is discussed next.

Research Projects

In 2024, MRC incurred expenses of \$601,081 (0.9% less than 2023) for research activities and mattress collection facility improvement funding. The <u>Research</u> section contains a more detailed explanation of completed, active and future research activities.

Sleep Products Sustainability Program (SP2)

In 2024, MRC incurred \$115,625 to operate the SP2 program (20.5% higher than in 2023). SP2 develops methods that manufacturers can use to analyze and reduce their environmental impact. MRC works with California manufacturers to help them reduce both the generation of waste materials and the use of water and energy in their manufacturing facilities.

Program expenses included consulting fees for SP2 oversight and development of program resources to assist participants as they prepare for certification, as well as the costs associated with facilitating workgroups focused on product circularity and new materials in mattresses.

The Waste Hierarchy and Research sections of this report contain more information.

Table 35 shows MRC's 2023 and 2024 actual research costs, its projected 2025 costs and its budgeted 2026 expenses.

Program Administration, Legal and CalRecycle Costs

In 2024, MRC incurred \$6,619,452 (2.6% higher than 2023) in program administration costs, including legal and CalRecycle oversight. In 2024, MRC's total staff expense of \$4,329,193 covered salaries for a total of 29 FTE (full time equivalent) staff. Of that amount, \$3,763,741 is for 25 FTEs that perform administrative and operational program oversight and whose salaries are included under this expense category. Staff expense for the additional 4 FTEs, who work on education and outreach, the illegally dumped mattress initiative, research, and in-house legal are included under those activity costs.

MRC also paid consultants and outside contractors \$415,811 in 2024 to provide additional services and expertise to help manage program registrants, retailer participation, recycling data, and financials. MRC 2024 program administration included \$386,088 in computer and database expenses for the organization's finance and CRM systems, including expanding its program CRM to improve efficiency and data collection. Other administrative and overhead costs include office space, telephone, utilities, insurance, bad debt and depreciation. In addition, MRC incurred \$15,198 to conduct compliance audits of its recyclers and \$59,976 to conduct reviews of retailer participation compliance, bringing total compliance expenses to \$75,174.

Program administrative expenses also include costs to prepare annual tax filings and conduct the annual financial audit, including MRC's SOC1 audit (conducted by PwC, a global audit and accounting firm), which CalRecycle's regulation 14 CCR§ 18964(b) (11) requires MRC to perform as a necessary component of the annual audit. These expenses are reflected in the \$224,254 in the Annual Financial Audit and Tax Filings expense category.

Field site visits and program travel expenses of \$111,598 were 26.0% lower in 2024 compared to 2023 levels.

MRC also works with California-based entities to provide industry and government relations support, specifically to assist MRC in responding to questions from legislators, informing elected officials and other stakeholders about the program and monitoring other California legislative and regulatory developments that may affect the program. In 2024, MRC incurred \$144,945 in this expense category, similar to 2023 levels. In addition, CalRecycle invoiced MRC \$694,374 for oversight expenses in 2024, a 4.2% increase from 2023.

In 2024, MRC incurred legal and litigation support expenses totaling \$145,094, of which \$12,672 was for outside legal counsel and the remainder for in-house legal support. Legal costs represent in-house and outsourced legal costs to support the organization, including negotiating, managing and updating MRC's contracts with hundreds of vendors.

Reserves and Surplus Funds

Cal. Pub. Res. Code § 42988 requires that MRC maintains a reserve that is sufficient to fund the program's operations over a multiyear period in a fiscally prudent and responsible manner. Section 42988.3 further provides:

Commencing January 1, 2027, the mattress recycling organization shall not maintain total reserves exceeding 60 percent of its annual operating expenses, consistent with the requirements of the Financial Accounting Standards Board's Accounting Standards Update 2016-14, Not-for-Profit Entities (Topic 958), and any future updates to that standard.

In addition, CalRecycle's regulations require that MRC's annual report include a discussion of its "[s]urplus funds, if any, and detailed rationale for the specified level of surplus." 14 CCR § 18964(b)(9)(E).

For nonprofit entities like MRC, the concepts of "surplus funds" and "reserves" are distinct. For nonprofits, generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP) define the annual "increase (or decrease) in net assets" to mean the mathematical difference between total revenue and total expenses for that year. A nonprofit's increase (or decrease) in net assets is functionally comparable to net income (or net loss) earned by a for-profit company. For this reason, we interpret the term "surplus funds" used in 14 CCR § 18964(b)(9)(E) as referring to an increase in net assets that MRC records at the end of each annual year. (A decrease in net assets at year-end would be a deficit.)

GAAP (as set forth in FASB Accounting Standards Update 2016-14, referenced in Section 42988.3 of the Public Resources Code) defines a nonprofit's reserves as that amount of the unrestricted accumulated net assets that the organization's board of

directors has designated as reserves. MRC has no restricted net assets. MRC's 2024 audited financial statement (Statement of Financial Position) identifies MRC's reserve fund as "Board Designated Financial Reserve."

An organization's board designated financial reserve can serve many purposes, including providing continuity of operations in times of economic downturn and addressing unforeseen events or other financial hardships. MRC has set aside funds for unforeseen circumstances that could substantially impact its revenues and expenses.

The reserves, however, are less than the total accumulated net assets. The part of the total net assets that are not designated by the board as reserves includes the nonprofit's financial assets which are set aside to meet the organization's short-term financial needs. These are comprised of liquid assets (such as cash), as well as non-liquid assets. Non-liquid assets, among other items, include accounts receivable (representing 17.5% of net assets), property and equipment and prepaid expenses.

Sufficient undesignated net assets are important to provide an organization with working capital to meet immediate cash flow needs. MRC's network of recyclers and transporters rely on prompt payment for services rendered. To keep the program functioning and its vendors paid and operating, it is critical that MRC hold sufficient working capital to cover cash flow shortfalls. To be fiscally responsible, MRC has designated approximately three months of operating assets as working capital.

As of December 31, 2024, MRC's net assets were \$20,004,927, as reported on the Statement of Financial Position section of MRC's 2024 audited financial statements. The Net Assets are divided into two segments:

- \$8,185,807 in Board Designated Financial Reserve, which is equal to the total net assets less the undesignated net assets. The reserve represents approximately 17.3% of 2024 Total Expenses, below the 2023 level of 47.4%.
- \$11,819,120 in undesignated net assets (which equals 25.0% of 2024 Total Expenses). This is set aside to meet MRC's short-term cash needs.

MRC has adopted a conservative investment strategy for the Board Designated Financial Reserve with the goal of preserving the value of our investments over the long term, using lower risk investments that historically provide good returns, with a strong weighting in fixed income. In 2024, MRC earned a net return of \$1,394,760 on its investments (including interest, dividends, realized and unrealized gains).

Section 42988.3 of the Public Resources Code requires that by January 1, 2027, MRC's reserves not exceed 60% of its annual operating expenses. As part of its multiyear effort to meet this requirement, MRC was able to keep the recycling charge at \$10.50 despite operating at a deficit since 2019. As part of this process, MRC recorded an operating loss in 2024 of \$12,960,921. As a result, MRC's net assets decreased in 2024 by a total of \$11,565,824, which reflects the sum of the \$12,960,921 operating loss, the \$1,394,760 net gain on investments, and a modest \$337 gain on disposal of assets.

As Table 38 shows, as of December 31, 2024, the Net Assets at End of Year was \$20,004,927.

EDUCATION & OUTREACH

MRC's education and outreach efforts inform consumers, retailers, the mattress industry and other stakeholders about mattress recycling in California by explaining:


- How MRC operates
- MRC's accomplishments and impact in California
- How and where to recycle discarded mattresses
- Why recycling is beneficial
- What the charge funds
- The mattress industry's legal obligations

MRC's multichannel, multilingual consumer education strategy continues to be effective. MRC's outreach received 745 million impressions and increased awareness of mattress recycling, retailers' take back obligation and how to recycle discarded mattresses.

MRC reaches these audiences using an array of communications and marketing methods, including targeted direct mail, printed collateral, advertising, media relations, websites and social media. MRC also participates in community and industry events and visits retailers, recyclers and other collection locations to learn how to collaborate on residential outreach

Figure 5 shows the percentage of MRC's education and outreach costs directed to consumer and industry audiences.

Communication Efforts

MRC's outreach materials fall into one of three categories of efforts:

- 1. **Controlled:** MRC uses its own assets to provide and publish information (e.g., websites, social media, newsletters).
- 2. **Paid:** MRC pays for the ability to distribute information and receive visibility (e.g., advertising or event sponsorships).
- 3. **Offered:** MRC makes information or resources available to others to voluntarily distribute (e.g., a media release or toolkit).

MRC's outreach encourages visiting one of three websites:


- 1. ByeByeMattress.com, which focuses on consumers.
- 2. <u>MattressRecyclingCouncil.org</u>, which informs the mattress industry, regulators, and stakeholders.
- 3. MRCreporting.org, which mattress retailers, manufacturers, distributors and renovators use to register with MRC and to report and remit recycling charges to MRC.

MRC uses Google Analytics to measure website performance.

ByeByeMattress.com

MRC's outreach to California consumers (residents and businesses wanting to discard a mattress) encourages visiting ByeByeMattress.com to learn how and where to recycle unwanted mattresses. For residents, the site features a searchable locator and curbside pickup directory, along with California program details such as retailer take-back information. For businesses, MRC provides Commercial Volume Program information.

Google Analytics in 2024, counted 236,361 users to the site. The views to the California landing page increased dramatically from 19,400 views in 2023 to nearly 70,200 views in 2024.

MRC uses <u>MattressRecyclingCouncil.org</u> to inform industry audiences, regulators, and stakeholders about state laws, program implementation and performance. The website features a robust resource library for the solid waste, recycling and mattress industries; research reports and developments; and a media center with newsletters and announcements.

In 2024, MattressRecyclingCouncil.org's total website visits were up 6% to nearly 64,350. There was a total of 145,770 page views. Views to the California page decreased by 21% year over year; however, the page remained the second most viewed on the website.



MRCreporting.org

Mattress retailers, manufacturers, distributors and renovators use MRCreporting.org to register with MRC and to report and remit recycling charges to MRC. The portal houses resources about California law and program, as well as documents and videos demonstrating the registration, reporting and charge remittance processes. Registered parties receive automatic payment reminders and missed deadline email notices. MRC also pushes important announcements about available customer education materials and mattress recycling options. In 2024, the number of companies receiving these communications totaled 1,578.

Social Media

MRC maintains social media channels for both brands. We use the Bye Bye Mattress branded channels—Facebook, X and Instagram—to educate consumers, and the Mattress Recycling Council branded channels—Facebook, X, LinkedIn, and YouTube—to communicate with industry audiences. Our social media followers consist of

retailers and manufacturers, civic and environmental groups, local and state governments, waste haulers, and recyclers. At the close of 2024, the cumulative audience of all our branded channels surpassed 7,600.

In 2025, MRC will continue to monitor the viability of our current social media channels as well as explore other platforms that may be effective tools to communicate with our diverse audiences.



Bye Bye Mattress channels

During 2024, the content on Bye Bye Mattress branded channels earned 1.2 million impressions and 156,000 engagements. The cumulative followers of these channels totaled 3,169 at the end of the year. Instagram continues to experience the most year-over-year growth, with nearly a 60% increase in followers, reaching 612 by the end of 2024.

MRC used social media advertising to promote retailer take back, guide users to the nearest drop-off location, advertise collection events, showcase consumer incentive drop-off locations, draw attention to new mattress care content and inform new residents to visit ByeByeMattress.com. These ads earned an additional 17.7 million impressions.

Overall, MRC's Bye Bye Mattress social media accounted for 3% of all visitors to ByeByeMattress.com in 2024.

Mattress Recycling Council channels

During 2024, the content on Mattress Recycling Council branded channels earned 132,298 impressions. The cumulative followers of these channels totaled 4,459 at the end of the year. LinkedIn grew by 25% in 2024. With more than 2,480 followers, it is the most popular of all the MRC social media sites.

MRC used these channels to announce program developments, promote MRC's presence at industry events, share research announcements, distribute resources, generate interest in using the Commercial Volume Program (CVP), recruit Sleep Products Sustainability Program (SP2) participants and increase e-newsletter subscribers.



Newsletters

In 2024, MRC offered six digital newsletters. Most of these newsletters targeted small audiences; however, our flagship publication, Highlights, reached over 7,500 subscribers. In 2024, all the newsletters were re-designed with a new mobile-friendly layout.

Highlights, monthly

Highlights is MRC's primary communication tool for announcements, state program updates, posting research accomplishments and distributing lessons learned from our illegal dumping pilot projects.

MRC distributes Highlights to all registered retailers, renovators, manufacturers, collection site hosts, recyclers and other stakeholders that subscribe. By the year's end, the mailing list had exceeded 7,500 with an average open rate of nearly 50%. MRC also publishes each issue on MattressRecyclingCouncil.org and circulates it on social media channels.

Retailer Spotlight, quarterly


Retailer Spotlight is distributed to registered retailers and provides tips for using MRCreporting.org, updates on state laws and regulations, new MRC resources for retailers, and insights on mattress recycling. By year's end, the mailing list exceeded 1,800 with an average open rate of 55%.

In 2024, in response to feedback gathered from the 2023 Industry Survey, MRC provided more information about recycling and regulatory updates, including guidance on how retailers can prepare for a CalRecycle inspection.

Illegal Mattress Dumping Download, quarterly

The Illegal Mattress Dumping Download was created for Illegally Dumped Mattress Collection Initiative participants. It provides news and tips to combat/prevent illegal mattress dumping while continuing to remind participants about data entry and how to use the database.

In 2024, the mailing list was expanded to include those registered in the Initiative and attendees of recent environmental conferences. The final newsletter of 2024 was sent to 210 with an open rate of 62%.







Seasonal Reminders, monthly

Each of MRC's program coordinators distributes a Seasonal Reminder to the collection site operators within their multi-county regions. The primary purpose of the newsletter is to remind operators of relevant MRC best practices (e.g., proper mattress stacking) and resources for training their staff or promoting their site. MRC has expanded the format to recognize the achievements of individual collection sites within the region and share different approaches to implementing best practices.

The open rates of each coordinator's newsletter varied. Averages ranged from 30% to 58%.

SP2 Toolkit

MRC distributes this newsletter monthly to contacts at certified facilities or facilities working toward certification. Each month's content focuses on one of the 12 certification requirements. In 2024, the mailing list consisted of 28 program participants and the newsletter averaged an open rate of 34%.





Paid

Consumer Advertising

MRC uses a mix of television, radio, digital, social media, and print as it designs advertising plans for general audiences or local plans to address a specific need. MRC's ads are multilingual.




FIGURE 6: Consumer Advertising

Figure 6 shows the percentage of consumer advertising spending for television, radio, print, digital and social in 2024.

General Audience Campaigns

In 2024, MRC ran general audience advertising in the spring and fall to coincide with holiday weekends when retailers sell large volumes of mattresses. MRC used English-language and Spanish-language ads in select major markets to increase general awareness of the program. Asian-language outlets used in the fall campaign translated the English-language ad.

MRC considered the following factors when determining which areas to target: the presence of a recycler, increased access such as the opening of a large collection site or multiple sites, the area's environmental justice classification, and the per capita rate of illegal dumping. Based on these criteria, MRC chose the following as major advertising markets in 2024:

- Alameda County
- Fresno County
- Los Angeles County

- San Bernadino County
- Santa Barbara County
- Sacramento area

English-language media received the "Three Ways to Recycle" campaign. The ad summarized the three primary ways a consumer could place a mattress in the recycling stream: retailer take back, consumer drop off, and municipal bulky item pickup.

Spanish-language media received "Cuidando la Tierra" (translates to Taking Care of the Earth) which positions mattress recycling as an easy and free way to help protect the environment. Both ads encourage visiting ByeByeMattress.com to learn more about what to do with an unwanted mattress. Digital direct mail campaigns to new movers in the target markets complemented these ads.

Overall, MRC's general audience advertising in these markets resulted in 32.4 million impressions of digital TV and radio ads, 2.1 million opens of digital direct mail campaigns and print ads circulated to more than 158,000 readers. More than 30% of the visits to the California page on ByeByeMattress.com originated from the digital ads.

Local Campaigns

Building on momentum from 2023 campaigns, MRC continued to collaborate on local outreach with:

- Long Beach: MRC produced multiple digital and printed direct mail projects to raise awareness of a newly established collection site, each reaching an average of 75,000 households, resulting in a total of 7,100 website clicks.
- **Modesto:** MRC utilized both targeted emails and digital ads to promote the use of a new collection site. The four eblasts netted 2,700 clicks on the website. The digital ads earned nearly 2 million impressions and more than 1,200 clicks.
- **Fresno County:** MRC provided English and Spanish artwork and matching funds for a social media campaign on the county's Facebook page during November and December. Cumulative impressions surpassed 991,000.






In the fall, MRC decided to conduct additional local campaigns:

- Richmond: MRC chose to advertise here given the city's persistent ranking as a high per-capita illegal dumping area and the rise of new hyperlocal news outlets. MRC placed digital and print ads in new and existing sources. Digital ads received 1.1 million impressions and the circulation of the print outlets totaled 46,900 readers.
- High Growth Cities: In response to a Los Angeles
 Times article announcing Irvine as the hottest
 housing market in the state, MRC deployed a
 digital direct mail campaign to Irvine and six other
 surrounding communities. The article also named
 other high-growth cities in California, where MRC



deployed a digital direct mail campaign. This included San Diego, Menifee, Lathrop, Chico, Bakersfield, Manteca, Roseville, Santa Cruz, San Bernardino and Ontario. MRC's emails received 330,000 impressions, resulting in more than 42,000 clicks to ByeByeMattress.com.



Online and Digital Advertising

MRC continued to use Google's AdWords Grant program, keyword search ads and display ads. MRC also used digital advertising to bring attention to the new mattress care content on ByeByeMattress.com.

 Online Search: MRC garnered more than 22.8 million impressions in 2024 through the use of Google ads, which were displayed in or alongside search results as users searched the internet for "mattress recycling," "disposal," or "junk removal." More than 260,000 consumers visited ByeByeMattress.com after clicking on one of these ads.



Meta Ads: MRC conducted three ad campaigns on Meta's Facebook and Instagram in 2024. The Mattress Care campaign, first introduced in 2023 to drive traffic to the new Mattress Care segment on ByeByeMattress.com, continued in 2024 with 140,000 impressions and nearly 1,800 website clicks. The ongoing Consumer Incentive Payment and Don't Dump It, Recycle It campaigns drew more than 17.6 million impressions with more than 230,000 website clicks.

MRC will continue using online and digital advertising to generate leads to ByeByeMattress.com and regularly monitor analytics to find the best marketing mix for Californians

Industry Advertising

In 2024, MRC advertised the CVP, SP2 and the retailer take-back obligation in a variety of trade publications in different industry verticals. Overall, MRC's industry advertising received more than 502,000 impressions. **Appendix E** contains examples of these ads.

- **CVP:** MRC used digital and print ads, as well as targeted emails to subscribers in the home furnishings, lodging and apartments verticals.
- **SP2 and Retailer Take Back:** MRC focused these ads in the home furnishings vertical and used digital and print ads.

Event Sponsorships

Community Events

MRC participated in 15 events in 2024 throughout the state during spring, including Earth Day, exposing Bye Bye Mattress to more than 40,000 residents. New in 2024 were Visalia, Modesto, Santa Rosa, Bakersfield, Healdsburg, and San Diego. MRC's booth raises awareness about retailer take-back, participating drop-off locations, and available curbside opportunities. MRC also invites attendees to learn about how a mattress is recycled, what happens to the components and the positive environmental impacts of mattress recycling. MRC's 2024 schedule included:

Mattress Industry Events

In 2024, MRC participated in mattress industry events to increase awareness of legal obligations, present research findings, further sustainability and circularity conversations and build interest in SP2. These events included:

- Las Vegas Market: Held twice each year, this event is the largest furniture and bedding show in the United States. It attracts retailers, distributors and manufacturers from California and elsewhere across the U.S., and over 80 countries. At both markets, MRC staff members informed attendees about CVP, California's retailer take-back obligation, California's charge and MRC's recycling research. MRC also visited showrooms of Market participants. The purpose of these visits was to see many of the newly designed and innovative products that had the potential to be sold in California and would need the charge applied. In other instances, MRC discussed the program's success and explored ways to further sustainability.
- Southern California Furniture and Accessory Market: MRC exhibited alongside some of the industry's leading manufacturers, suppliers, and distributors of mattresses, furniture and home goods. MRC interacted with attendees at our booth and engaged in discussions with other exhibitors. These interactions allowed MRC to raise awareness among retailers of California's law, the availability of recycling, and how to access resources for program compliance and customer education.
- Keep America Beautiful Conference: In February 2024, MRC exhibited at the
 national conference in San Diego, using it as an opportunity to inform community
 leaders in both California and elsewhere how to work with MRC to recycle mattresses
 or inform their community about the program. Attendees also inquired about our
 efforts to combat illegal mattress dumping. We distributed the illegal dumping White
 Paper, lesson plan activities, as well as information about illegal dumping mitigation
 pilot projects.
- ISPA EXPO: This is a biennial international trade show that features the latest in the bedding industry's machinery, components and supplies. At the 2024 event, MRC exhibited and answered attendees' questions about the program's progress and research projects, and how to recycle in their state. We also visited other exhibitors to learn about their sustainability efforts, observing several already applying lessons from the 2023 Sustainability Conference. Videos taken during these visits are available on the ISPA EXPO 2024 playlist on the MRC YouTube channel.
 As part of ISPA EXPO's educational programming, MRC presented research
 - As part of ISPA EXPO's educational programming, MRC presented research project results and sponsored a session sharing lessons learned by manufacturers participating in SP2. MRC convened a Global Mattress Recycling Coalition meeting in conjunction with the event. See the <u>Research</u> chapter of this report for details regarding MRC's research projects and recycling coalition.
- ISPA Sustainability Conference: ISPA in 2024 held its third conference to educate, connect and inspire the bedding industry to develop practical solutions for sustainability challenges. MRC exhibited and participated in a panel discussion to create a broader understanding of end-of-life challenges recyclers face with mattresses, generate interest in research projects and encourage participation in SP2.

Offered

Consumer Education Materials for Retailers

MRC provides no-cost point-of-sale materials to the mattress industry. Items include an information card, poster, Consumer FAQ and digital badge. Translations of these materials are available in the top five other languages spoken in California. On an ongoing basis, MRC utilizes Retailer Spotlight, email notifications via MRCreporting.org, industry publications, and discussions and presentations at events to inform retailers regularly about these educational materials.

A retailer may request these items from MRC or download current artwork from MRC's Resources Library. For newly registered retailers or those opening new stores in the state, MRC sends a starter kit with a link to request an automatic refill of materials.

From January to November 2024, MRC provided 16,200 information cards and 1,680 posters to California retailers to help them explain mattress recycling and the charge to their customers.

In December 2024, in preparation for the charge increase effective January 1, 2025, MRC sent a packet of 100 cards, two English posters in each size and updated Customer FAQs to each registered retailer. The materials included in this mailing featured a new design based on feedback collected from retailers in our industry survey and observations made during store visits. The revisions include larger text, images that emphasize the recycling options versus the recycling process, more prominent contact information, and a QR code to quickly access the California program page of ByeByeMattress.com.







Media Relations

In 2024, MRC generated more than 666.3 million impressions with consumer and industry media outreach. This amount of coverage equates to approximately \$903,330 in advertising value.


MRC proactively generated consumer coverage about the availability and success of the Bye Bye Mattress program during Presidents Day, Earth Day and America Recycles Day. We also informed local media about new collection sites and awards of new pilot projects to mitigate illegal dumping.

MRC's proactive industry efforts included participating in the furniture and bedding industry's sustainability and circularity coverage. We also distributed announcements regarding research project results and the new charge amount that would take effect Jan. 1, 2025.

Other mentions of MRC or Bye Bye Mattress resulted from ISPA's announcement regarding the association's leadership change, other industry groups honoring the outgoing ISPA and MRC president at upcoming conferences, reporters attributing MRC as their source for mattress recycling information or referencing our program as an example of industry-led recycling. Collection sites or event hosts using MRC's publicity toolkit and accompanying resources also generated coverage mentioning their participation in the program.

In 22 counties, MRC also worked with local elected officials, city managers, county supervisors, and local chambers of commerce to amplify awareness of retailer take-back and mattress recycling using their social media channels and newsletters. We estimate that the Presidents Day content reached an audience of 465,000 followers, Earth Day reached more than 214,000 followers and America Recycles Day reached 213,000 followers.





Collection Site and Event Publicity Toolkits: MRC provides recyclers, collection sites, and event hosts with a toolkit containing a news release template, flyer, signage, and suggested content they can use to publicize their participation in the program through online and social media outlets, city/organization websites, and newsletters. The toolkit allows customization of messaging, such as hours of operation and residency restrictions. Visit MRC's Resources Library for complete toolkits.

Public Service Announcement

In 2024, MRC's Public Service Announcement (PSA) campaign, "Break Up the Right Way With Your Old Mattress," eclipsed 12 million lifetime impressions nationwide since first airing in 2021. MRC retired the campaign at the end of the year. In California, it aired a grand total of 12,332 times, resulting in over 9.5 million impressions.

The campaign included a 15-second and 30-second video and radio spots in three languages—English, Spanish and Mandarin. In California, English-language TV spots accounted for 31% of the airings and Spanish-language spots accounted for 30%. Other languages and the shorter Spanish spot accounted for the remaining 40%.

MRC encouraged airings by contacting station directors in the weeks before Earth Day (April 22) and in August. To complement these airings, MRC also asked city leaders and community-based organizations to share the PSA on their social media feeds and other communication channels.

California media markets with the most 2024 airings included:

In 2024, MRC produced a new campaign titled "Influencer," for use beginning in 2025. The campaign includes 15-second and 30-second video and radio spots. Spanish versions are also available. To develop the concept and scripts, MRC consulted information gathered from completed illegal dumping pilot projects and our involvement in task forces, workshops and conferences. MRC distributed "Influencer," to PSA Directors in February 2025 and the spots are currently available in the Bye Bye Mattress Media Center.

Appendix E contains the video and radio scripts for "Break Up the Right Way With Your Old Mattress."

Compliance Outreach

MRC continues to monitor various sources for new entrants into the mattress segment, as well as non-compliant parties. When MRC identifies a party that may need to register and participate in the program, MRC mails a certified mail notice informing it of its potential obligations and follows up with a phone call or email. If there is no response within 30 days, MRC mails a second certified letter and the party is given 30 more days to respond. If the party remains unresponsive, MRC refers the party to CalRecycle for action.

MRC's database of potential retailers, manufacturers, distributors, and renovators is a compilation of information from California's Bureau of Household Goods and Services, ReferenceUSA, Dun & Bradstreet, industry publication subscriber lists, industry event attendee lists, Yellow Pages, chambers of commerce, the Better Business Bureau and online searches. MRC also receives leads for potential registrants from CalRecycle's enforcement staff and MRC program coordinators as they travel the state, MRC Customer Relations area visits and other registered participants. In 2024, MRC conducted 51 on-site visits to retailers in Northern California.

MRC also monitors whether retailers and other mattress sellers submit monthly reports and remit collected recycling charges on time. MRC uses a protocol to alert parties more than 90 days delinquent of late fees and associated interest. MRC notifies CalRecycle of all parties that reach level seven.

Meanwhile, CalRecycle's enforcement unit randomly selects mattress retailers, manufacturers and renovators to evaluate compliance with SB 254 through virtual and on-site inspections.

At retailer inspections, CalRecycle confirms whether the business is registered with MRC, visibly displays the correct charge on the sales transaction documents, collects the recycling charge from customers, properly remits those charges to MRC, and complies with the no-cost retailer take-back obligation. Inspectors also verify whether the mattresses and foundations offered for sale are produced by manufacturers that have registered with MRC.

At renovator inspections, CalRecycle confirms whether the business is registered with MRC and evaluates documentation practices used to report annual mattress collection and disposition data (due to CalRecycle May 1 of each year).

When CalRecycle determines it will levy penalties against a non-compliant party, it publishes the enforcement order on the department's website (https://www2.calrecycle.ca.gov/Docs/EnforcementOrder/). In 2024, CalRecycle issued four enforcement orders.

Evaluations

MRC tracks consumer awareness annually and conducts periodic research to measure and improve consumer outreach and education. We also gauge industry awareness and satisfaction by contacting all registered retailers at least once each year. Appendix E contains the complete survey results.

Consumer Behavior and Awareness

MRC surveyed consumers statewide in May 2024 after the spring advertising campaign. MRC contracted with KB Insights, a 35-year marketing consultant and experienced analyst, to create and implement the survey (N=1,037). This survey was constructed to obtain feedback from adult residents throughout California, matching the demographic breakdown reported in Census data (age, gender, ethnicity, income, etc.). All responses were collected online.

The survey measured consumer awareness of mattress recycling, retailer take-back, how to dispose of a mattress so it can be recycled, knowledge of "free" recycling, and awareness of the program's name (these comprise our five Key Performance Indices or "KPIs" listed in Table 41).

When comparing the 2024 results to the same KPI measurements taken in the Spring of 2023, we found that two measurements were statistically similar in 2024 and 2023 (i.e., within +/-3%): knowledge of retailer takeback and knowledge of how to dispose a mattress for recycling. The other three KPI measurements showed a slight, but statistically significant, decline: knowledge of mattress recycling, that it is free and the awareness of the Bye Bye Mattress Program.

Given the continued decreased interest in mattress purchasing and lower than expected mattress sales, MRC is not surprised that KPIs also reflect a downward trend in the last five years.

Respondents that could recall Bye Bye Mattress by name (N=113) reported learning about the program through the following sources (MRC asked respondents to select all that apply): advertising (43%), a friend or relative (39%), local recycling center (29%), mattress retailer (24%), social media (22%), news (19%), mailed information (19%), landlord or property manager (16%), city or local government (13%), and online search (7%). When compared to 2023, the categories with statistically significant changes included advertising (30% decrease), news (11% decrease), and friend or relative (11% decrease).

Of the survey respondents who recalled hearing or seeing an advertisement (N=49), almost two-thirds recalled a television spot (61%) and more than half remembered a social media post (53%). Online ad recall ranked third (27%), followed by radio (24%), in-store signage or materials (16%), outdoor/billboard (16%) and print ads (14%).

MRC will continue to use these channels to build awareness of Bye Bye Mattress and continue to work with local leaders, city staff, mattress retailers, landlords and property managers to promote the program.

Other portions of the survey are structured to give MRC a method for measuring consumers' mattress purchasing, disposal and storage behaviors, as well as motivators and barriers to recycling. MRC uses this behavioral data to identify opportunities for improving consumer communications.

In 2024, there were no significant changes in consumer purchasing behavior, nor the methods they use to acquire mattresses. Similar to 2023, most consumers purchased from brick-and-mortar retailers (64%), another quarter purchased from online-only companies (25%) and the remainder acquired through non-retail sources such as hand-me-downs, yard sales, classifieds, etc. (8%).

Disposal rates were similar in 2024 to those in 2023 (20% up from 18%), and consumers still preferred seeking a way to pick up their unwanted mattress before resorting to a drop-off/self-haul option. The top three disposal methods remained the same: retailer

take back (22%), using city services to have it picked up at the curb (18%), and giving it away (11%). Another 7% hired a junk removal service to take it away and 11% placed their mattresses in the trash. Meanwhile, dropping it off at a recycling center, an event, or at a landfill comprised only 16% of disposals.

Some behavioral shifts did occur in 2024. Retailer take-backs were down from 2023 (7% decrease) as was junk removal service usage (6% decrease). Slight increases were detected in methods that pointed toward reuse such as giving it away, donating it or selling it (8% increase).

What motivates or prevents consumers from recycling their mattress is also relatively unchanged from 2023. The top three motivators remain "protecting the environment" (selected by 48% as most important), "doing the right thing" (selected by 14%) and "convenience - it's easy to do" (selected by 10%). Perceived barriers continue to be lack of knowledge and not having a vehicle.

MRC's consumer survey strategy in 2025 will include a comprehensive, statewide behavioral/awareness study to gauge success against the May 2024 survey. Smaller surveys may be conducted to monitor the effectiveness of campaigns in new target markets.

General Advertising Campaign Effectiveness

To accurately measure the effectiveness of advertising, MRC compares KPI performance before and after advertising in the specific markets targeted in its advertising media plan. Accordingly, MRC conducted research in February 2024 (N=580) to establish "pre-campaign" performance in 846 targeted zip codes, and then extracted results from the annual survey detailed above, only in the same zip codes, to assess "post-campaign" results for the Spring ad campaign. MRC conducted an additional survey in December 2024 (N=702) to assess "post campaign" results for the Fall ad campaign. The following trends were established only in the original 846 zip codes that were consistently targeted all year long (N=484).

Since mattress disposals strongly correlate with mattress purchases, MRC also asks consumers who have purchased or acquired a mattress recently about their recycling knowledge and awareness. When segmenting respondents into targeted markets that had purchased or acquired a mattress in the last year, we note that KPIs increase significantly, indicating that MRC's outreach is resonating and reaching the most likely users of the program.

MRC will continue to measure advertising effectiveness in this manner while still conducting statewide research for strategic analysis and for trending purposes.

Spanish-Speaking Consumers

MRC continues to monitor awareness among Spanish-speaking consumers because we offer outreach material and produce advertisements in this language. In each 2023 MRC continues to monitor awareness among Spanish-speaking consumers. In each survey phase, MRC asked whether the respondent spoke Spanish and segmented those responses for standalone analysis. Most 2024 KPIs remained statistically similar to 2023 levels among Spanish speakers throughout the year. The one KPI that increased significantly throughout the latter part of the year was the knowledge that mattress recycling is free (9% increase in the last half of the year; 6% for the entire year).

In general, Spanish speakers that lived in a zip code targeted by MRC's advertising campaigns displayed awareness at statistically similar levels to the general population living in those targeted zip codes (Table 44).

Based on these results, MRC will continue to incorporate Spanish-language outlets in advertising campaigns, offer a Spanish-language Public Service Announcement, provide dual-language outreach materials and collaborate with Latino community leaders, elected officials and nonprofit/community-based groups to keep Spanish-speakers informed.

Industry Relations

In 2024, MRC invited all 1,524 registered participants in North America (retailers, institutional sellers, manufacturers, distributors and renovators) to complete its annual survey. 243 participants responded for a 16% response rate. Most of those respondents were registered participants in California (N=187).

Of the California respondents (i.e., they were in California or did business within the state), 89% (167) were retailers/institutional sellers, 2% (4) were renovators and 16% (29) were manufacturers/distributors.

Questions varied based on the respondents' role(s) in the industry. Generally, the survey assessed take-back measures, knowledge of obligations, satisfaction with MRC's program, customer service and resources. Major takeaways from the California respondent results are categorized below.

Retailers

Of the California retailers, 33% said that some of their sales were online. Most (78%) sold from store locations--mostly department, furniture and mattress stores.

Most retailers (64%) said they provided information explaining the recycling program and/or fee to their customers "every time." Only a few (6%) said they didn't provide any materials regarding the program. The remaining respondents (30%) provided materials for some sales or upon request.

Most provided program information using MRC's posters and/or cards. Over half of the respondents requested and received an additional supply of these educational materials.

Over half of retailers (57%) said they regularly take back customers' mattresses. Another 25% said they did so "sometimes" and 19% do not take back mattresses. Among those who take back mattresses, 35% said they might be interested in recycling old mattresses with MRC. And 9% expressed interest in becoming a consolidation site for retailers in their area.

The ByeByeMattress.com website was used by 40% of respondents to locate a drop-off facility to recycle the mattresses taken back from customers. And 12% of retailers use third-party transporters to take back customer mattresses.

Slightly more than a quarter of retailers (28%) said they had been inspected by CalRecycle. CalRecycle may have inspected another 40%, but the respondents weren't sure. Only about a third (31%) definitively said they hadn't. While 43% of respondents said they were interested in more information to help them prepare for a CalRecycle inspection.

Of retailers selling mattresses online into California, about half (47%) provide take-back instructions to consumers after the sale is completed. Others said their customers could choose no-cost take-back during the checkout process; a few said their customers had to find the information themselves in the FAQs on their websites.

Overall, about two thirds of retailers (62%) were extremely/somewhat satisfied with the MRC program; 11%, dissatisfied; the remaining 27%, neutral.

Manufacturers

Among the 23 manufacturers surveyed, 61% said they took specific measures to communicate their green/sustainable products and practices to their customers. Communications vehicles included sales materials (71%), manufacturer websites (57%) and/or product documentation (50%).

About half of the manufacturers surveyed (52%) were interested in participating in, or receiving more information about, the program. Information was provided to interested parties.

Three-quarters of the manufacturers (74%) said they were somewhat or fully familiar with the regulatory agencies overseeing the recycling program. Conversely, 26% were not.

Overall, about two-thirds of manufacturers (64%) were extremely/somewhat satisfied with the MRC program; only one individual (5%) was dissatisfied; the remaining respondents (32%) were neutral.

Renovators

Less than a handful (4) responded, two were interested in recycling old mattresses with MRC, and two were interested in becoming a public collection site with MRC. Information was provided as requested.

Three out of four renovators were familiar with their annual CalRecycle reporting requirements.

Three out of four were also extremely/somewhat satisfied with the MRC program; one was dissatisfied

Customer Service

Of all 65% had utilized MRC's Customer Service department in the past. The majority (84%) were satisfied with their experiences; 21% were neutral; 5% were dissatisfied.

Of all respondents, 78% had utilized MRC's education resources in the past; 64% were satisfied with the resources they had received; 30% were neutral; 6% were dissatisfied.

MRC continues fine-tuning its live support and educational resources through coaching and materials enhancements.

Retailers, December 31, 2024

"Retailer" means a person who sells mattresses in the state or offers to a consumer a mattress in the state through any means, including, but not limited to, by remote offering, including sales outlets or catalogs, electronically through the internet, by telephone, or through the mail.

"Sale" or "sell" means the transfer of title of a mattress for consideration, including by a manufacturer, a distributor, or a retailer for eventual consumption to a consumer in the state, including remote sales conducted through sales outlets, catalogs, or the internet or any other similar electronic means. For purposes of this chapter, a long-term lease of not less than 12 months is the same as a sale.

Appendix C: Program Operations Materials

CALIFORNIA MATTRESS RECYCLING STANDARDS

The Mattress Recycling Standards (Standards) define the minimum requirements to be an approved Recycler for the Mattress Recycling Council (MRC). Under these Standards, mattresses must be managed and processed in a manner that adequately safeguards the environment, industry employees and consumers. The Standard also includes data tracking and reporting requirements.

The MRC reserves the right at its discretion to review and revise these Standards.

For purposes of these Standards, the term "mattress" should be interpreted to include both mattresses and foundations (or box-springs).

Background

The MRC is a non-profit organization formed by the International Sleep Products Association (ISPA) to develop and implement mattress recycling programs in states with laws requiring recycling of discarded mattresses.

Recyclers must comply with these Standards, contract terms and conditions and all legislative and regulatory requirements. Recyclers must have transparent operations, clear and documented recycling procedures and accurate tracking of all mattresses and components (including non-recyclable waste). All Recyclers will be audited under these Standards.

Disclaimer

The MRC does not intend for these Standards to constitute or provide legal guidance of any kind. The Recycler must be aware of and abide by all local, state, or federal laws and regulations applicable to the management of post-consumer mattresses or the business operation of the Recycler. In the event that these Standards are inconsistent with any such laws or regulations, the laws or regulations take precedence, and the Recycler must inform the MRC of such inconsistency.

1. General Requirements

Each Recycler shall:

- 1.1.Possess a current and valid business license and meet all applicable local, state and federal requirements for providing the type of recycling services required by the MRC.
- 1.2. Possess valid state approved permits, plans, and approvals, as applicable.

- 1.3. Comply, and be in good-standing, with all applicable federal, state, and local regulations including but not limited to:
 - Department of Transportation (DOT) if providing any transportation services
 - Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) and applicable local and state health and safety regulations
 - Local and state fire department regulations, fire and building codes and other applicable building and occupancy safety requirements
- 1.4. Possess Commercial General Liability Insurance, including coverage for bodily injury, property damage, complete operations and contractual liability with combined single limits of not less than \$1 million per occurrence and \$2 million aggregate. Recycler's policy must be endorsed to name MRC, its directors, officers, employees, agents, assigns, as Additional Insureds. Recycler must carry its own Business Auto and Workers Compensation policies. Recycler shall require all third parties that it uses to provide any services under its contract with MRC to comply with the same insurance requirements specified in these Standards.
- 1.5. List the MRC as an additional insured party.
- 1.6. Possess and maintain in good standing workers compensation and unemployment insurance coverage through a state program or through private insurance policy or sufficient self-insurance coverage.
- 1.7. Maintain all records for a minimum of 4 years, including but not limited to shipping documents (both for goods received and shipped), processing, material disposal and sales records.
- 1.8. Develop and keep current a written plan that assures:
 - 1.8.1. proper closure of the Recycler's facility or site in the event of sale, closure, abandonment, bankruptcy, any form of dissolution of the Recycler, or for any other reason;
 - 1.8.2. against abandonment of any mattresses, mattress materials, or other products or materials processed by the Recycler in the event of closure; and
 - 1.8.3. proper remediation of any contamination to the Recycler's facility or site in accordance with all applicable local, state and federal laws and regulations.

As part of that plan, the Recycler must obtain a bond or other financial instrument sufficient to pay for the closure activities described in the plan in the event that the Recycler itself is financially unable to perform all or some of such activities. The Recycler shall make such plan and bond or other financial instrument available for inspection by the MRC upon request.

1.9. Maintain a process to provide written notice of closure to the MRC with a minimum of 90-days advance notice.

- 1.10. Maintain a process to provide written notice to the MRC of any incidents that required the assistance of first responders within 24 hours of the occurrence. Provide written notice of any corresponding regulatory orders, fines or other governmental or administrative actions taken within 48 hours of receiving such orders or fines.
- 1.11. Maintain a documented process to record and track accidents, injuries or violations and any corresponding corrective and/or preventive actions taken.
- 1.12. Maintain a documented process to identify and communicate physical, mechanical, biological or pathogenic hazards and severity of such hazard to employees, and any corresponding corrective and/or preventive actions taken.
- 1.13. Maintain a documented process to identify and communicate potential fire hazards and severity of such hazards to employees, and any corresponding corrective and/or preventive actions taken.

2. Material Processing

Each Recycler shall implement and maintain a documented plan for deconstructing mattresses, which shall at a minimum require the Recycler to:

- 2.1. Fully disassemble the mattresses.
- 2.2. Recycle at least 75% by weight of the mattresses it processes by selling such material in appropriate markets for use in making new materials or products.
- 2.3. Minimize the quantity of material disposed of through landfills, incineration, or other non-recycling avenues.
- 2.4. Maintain a written policy describing how each mattress type and material (including pocket coils) will be processed.
- 2.5. Process all mattresses within 30 days of receipt at facility.
- 2.6. List criteria applied in determining when a given mattress cannot be processed.

3. Material Tracking

Each Recycler shall implement and maintain a documented plan to track and control mattresses entering their processing facilities and the flow of recyclable and non-recyclable materials generated through mattress deconstruction. The plan shall at minimum require the following:

- 3.1. Weigh all in-bound mattresses.
- 3.2. Maintain in-house or use third party annually calibrated and certified scale to weigh all in-bound and outbound materials on-site or document all out-bound shipments using third party calibrated and certified scales.
- 3.3. Maintain daily records of all receipts of used mattresses, mattress processing, sales or other dispositions of recycled or non-recyclable materials, and inventories.

- 3.4. Provide the MRC records for all parties providing discarded mattresses to Recycler in exchange for a collector incentive, including quantities received from and incentives paid to each party, and link such information to the inventory records required in 3.3.
- 3.5. Provide the MRC a list of all purchasers of recycled materials, and notify the MRC of any changes to that list at least 10 business days in advance (the MRC will treat this information as confidential). Recycler must obtain written approval from MRC for new facilities.
- 3.6. Train employees on how to prepare and maintain all necessary records and other documentation related to the receipt, processing, inventory and disposition of mattress and mattress materials.
- 3.7. Provide certificates of recycling for all material received and processed.

4. Downstream Due Diligence

Each Recycler shall have processes in place to identify, audit and approve all purchasers of recycled materials. The processes shall at a minimum require:

4.1. Annual desk audits to verify each purchaser's compliance with all applicable local, state and federal environmental and other requirements, and review of each purchaser's operating permits, environmental compliance permits, business licenses, insurance and certifications.

5. Bed Bug Management

Each Recycler shall implement and maintain a documented plan to identify and mitigate bed bug infestation in the facility and among employees. Components of the plan shall, at minimum, address the following provisions:

- 5.1. Document that all employees attended bed-bug identification and mitigation training.
- 5.2. Post bed bug identification posters in prominent work place location to encourage proactive identification and isolation of contaminated mattresses.
- 5.3. Clearly identify how infested mattresses will be isolated and either decontaminated or disposed.
- 5.4. Track the number and if possible, source of contaminated units.






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About the Guidelines

Staff at all participating collection sites must be knowledgeable regarding these guidelines before accepting mattresses. For simplicity, these guidelines will refer to mattresses and box springs and futons as mattresses. These guidelines describe the program and what is required to participate. MRC reserves the right to update, change, modify, amend, add or remove terms or otherwise alter these guidelines at any time with or without prior notice.

About the Mattress Recycling Council

In 2013, California enacted Senate Bill 254 as amended which requires mattress manufacturers to create a recycling program for mattresses discarded in the state. The bedding industry established the Mattress Recycling Council (MRC) to develop and operate the mattress recycling program known as Bye Bye Mattress.

What MRC Provides

MRC provides the following to participating collection sites:

- A collection container to store mattresses that is appropriate for the number of mattresses that the collection site expects to generate and the site's available space
- Transportation from the collection site to a contracted recycler
- No-cost mattress recycling services

PROGRAM MATERIALS

INCLUDED PRODUCTS

Mattresses: Defined as any sleep surface covered with ticking or fabric that contains resilient material such as steel innersprings, foam, fiber or other filling or upholstery materials, used alone or in combination, regardless of size or shape. This definition includes foam mattresses.

Futons: See mattress definition above. Futon mattresses must be detachable from the frame or base to be accepted. Futon mattresses that do not detach from the frame or base are not included.

Box springs also commonly called foundations: A ticking or fabric-covered structure used to support a mattress or sleep surface and may be comprised of a frame, foam, springs or other structure, or other materials, used alone or in combination, regardless of whether the product is stationary or adjustable.



All items accepted for recycling by MRC must have been used and discarded in the state of California.

PROGRAM MATERIALS

MATTRESS INSPECTION AND EXAMINATION

Collection site staff should screen incoming mattresses to determine whether they are suitable for recycling and should remove mattresses that are:

- Excessively wet or frozen
- Severely twisted, punctured or crushed
- Infested with bed bugs or other living organisms
- Exceptionally soiled or moldy

Mattresses not suitable for recycling should be disposed of through your existing solid waste stream or your nearby solid waste facility.

Bed Bug Identification

Mattresses and box springs infested with bed bugs are unacceptable for recycling and should be disposed of through your existing solid waste stream or your nearby solid waste facility. Staff at collection sites should evaluate program materials for evidence of bed bug infestation. Bed bugs are tan to brown in color, but may appear redder if they have fed.

Adult Bed Bugs are dorsally flat insects, broadly oval and the size of an apple or melon seed (1/4").

Nymphs look like adults in shape but are smaller.

Eggs are white and barrel-shaped.

Signs of bed bug activity may be more obvious than the insects themselves. Look for clusters of dark spots or smudges on mattresses (fecal spots), especially along seams. Eggs, shed skins and all life stages of bed bugs may also be present in these 'soiled' areas.

Unacceptable Quality

Shown here are examples to illustrate severe damage, heavy soiling and infestation.

Other Conditions:

- Out-of-state mattresses
- Severely damaged or soiled mattresses
- Mattress that have been stripped of padding components.
- Pillows and cushions
- Fold-out sofa beds and futon frames or bases
- Loose mattress pads, toppers
- Loose bedding, blankets, or sheets
- Water beds
- Fire damaged units









MATERIALS COLLECTION & HANDLING

Each collection site will have unique operational considerations. Participating sites must make their own decisions about how to best manage their operations in the safest manner possible in accordance with applicable laws. At a minimum, each participating site must meet these requirements:

MATTRESSES

Each collection site must maintain general liability insurance of at least \$1,000,000 per occurrence and workers compensation coverage, as required by statute.

Staff at each collection site must be trained and knowledgeable regarding these guidelines before accepting mattresses for recycling.

Collection sites must keep mattresses dry by storing in weatherproof containers or under cover to maximize their recyclability. In addition, all collection sites must:

- Make every effort to place mattresses in MRC-designated storage containers immediately upon acceptance
- Store units off the ground and make every effort to keep container doors closed
- Keep mattresses intact and not intentionally crush or puncture them
- Efficiently stack mattresses to maximize the number of units loaded in each storage container
- Provide oversight to keep unacceptable items out of MRC-designated storage containers
- Remove any non-program materials from MRC-designated storage containers before transport to MRC recyclers
- Practice good housekeeping standards and keep storage containers and program materials in a neat and orderly condition

SITE ACCESS

Collection sites must allow MRC on-site access to confirm compliance with these guidelines.

MATERIALS COLLECTION & HANDLING

LOADING MATTRESSES IN STORAGE CONTAINERS

Expected number of mattresses that should fit in various container sizes:

20-foot sea container	30-45
28-foot trailer	60-95
40-foot sea container	75-95

48-foot trailer	110-180
53-foot trailer	125-190

Acceptable Loading

- **1.** Begin each stack with a queen or full size box spring. This acts as a base pallet to create a secure stack and makes unloading of mattresses quick and efficient.
- **2. Mattresses should be stacked horizontally** to the top of the trailer to maximize space.
- **3.** In small quantities, king size mattresses can be placed vertically next to a stack of horizontal mattresses. If there are more than 10 king size units, stack horizontally.



Unacceptable Loading

IMPORTANT: Do not load units vertically or in an unsafe manner.

TRANSPORTATION & PROCESSING

TRANSPORTERS


MRC will assign each collection site a transporter to provide a storage container and transportation services.

- MRC-contracted transporters must maintain commercial general liability and automobile insurance coverage of at least \$1,000,000 per occurrence
- Each collection site must notify transporter at least two business days before a storage container is full of mattresses
- Each collection site must request a haul through MyMRC
- On the scheduled pick up day, the collection site must make the collection container readily accessible to the transporter

A collection site may choose to provide its own storage container(s) and transportation. These locations must schedule appointments with the recycler on MyMRC to select a drop-off time.

RECYCLERS

Recyclers under contract with MRC will meet established recycling standards and accurately account for all mattresses received, the mattress components recycled (e.g., foam, steel, wood, fiber, etc.) and any residual disposal. Collection sites will be assigned an MRC recycler to best service your facility.



RECORDKEEPING

MyMRC:

MyMRC is a secure, online portal for collection sites, transporters, and recyclers. Upon activation, those assigned a user account will receive an email with their username and password.

MyMRC serves as a central location for all involved in the collection, transportation, and recycling of mattresses to more efficiently coordinate logistics and access real-time data. Once logged in, there is a personalized experience:

Collection Sites will use MyMRC to request pickups, cancel pickups, report feedback to MRC, and access detailed reports about the units collected on site.

Transporters will use MyMRC to manage pickup requests (accepting, rejecting or diverting them), make docking appointments with recyclers, and report feedback to MRC regarding completed pickups or issues experienced with a haul. Detailed reporting and dashboards will be available as well.


Annual Reporting to CalRecycle:

Per the law, mattress recyclers, renovators, and solid waste facilities, as defined by Public Resources Code section 42986, must submit an annual report to CalRecycle by May 1 each year.

The annual reports must meet the requirements listed in Title 14, California Code of Regulations (CCR) sections 18965-18967, which includes contact information and quantitative information. Annual reports are used by CalRecycle and MRC to assess the program and establish and update the mattress recycling goals for the state. To pull a record of your site's annual collection data, you can navigate to the "Hauls" tab in MyMRC. Under this tab, you will be able to pull the needed mattress collection counts and weights for Cal Recycle or other internal/external reporting.



PROGRAM WITHDRAWAL & TERMINATION

A collection site's participation in MRC's Bye Bye Mattress program in California is voluntary. Either party may withdraw from participation in accordance with the terms in your contract. Written notice to the other party is required. MRC reserves the right to remove any collection site not in compliance with these guidelines from further participation in the program. To withdraw from MRC's Bye Bye Mattress program, please reach out to your Program Coordinator (see page 3 for contact details).



ABOUT THE PROGRAM

Mattress Recycling Council

The Mattress Recycling Council (MRC) is a nonprofit organization formed by the bedding industry to operate the Bye Bye Mattress recycling program in states that have enacted mattress recycling laws – California, Connecticut and Rhode Island.

In each of these states households and businesses now have no-cost options to recycle mattresses. Businesses may recycle through the Commercial Volume Program by dropping off units directly at a participating location or eligible entities can arrange transportation with MRC. Households may directly recycle through a local collection site or event or indirectly through a residential bulky item curbside collection program or retailer that takes back old units when delivering new ones.

Bye Bye Mattress is made possible when consumers purchase a mattress or box spring. Fees vary by state and each state fee funds that state's program. The fee is primarily used to establish collection sites and events, transport mattresses from those locations to recyclers and cover the cost to disassemble the mattresses. Portions of the fee are also used for combatting illegal dumping, researching improvements to the recycling process and identifying new uses for materials, as well as conducting public education and outreach.

Commercial Volume Program

MRC provides California businesses and organizations the following opportunities to recycle mattresses at no cost.

PICKUP ELIGIBILITY AND PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS

MRC provides no-cost transportation and recycling of mattresses to eligible entities (ie: retailers, health care facilities, educational facilities, military bases, and lodging establishments) with at least 100 units to discard. All units must have been used and discarded in California and MRC requires 14 days notice to secure transportation.

Eligibility

RETAILERS

- Must be registered with MRC, remitting the recycling fees and compliant with all provisions of California's Used Mattress Recovery and Recycling Act.
- Must have accumulated a minimum of 100 units. Partnering with other local businesses, organizations or allowing public drop-off to reach the minimum is permitted.
- Those collecting at least 100 units monthly may request a permanent trailer.

OTHER COVERED ENTITIES

Hotels & Lodging Facilities, Universities & Educational Facilities, Military Bases, Healthcare

 Must have accumulated a minimum of 100 units. Partnering with other local businesses, organizations or allowing public drop-off to reach the minimum is permitted.

Participation

To receive MRC's assistance with transporting and recycling mattresses, the eligible entity must:

- Complete a registration form and return it no later than 14 days in advance of the desired pickup date.
- Agree to follow these guidelines.
- Provide a collection area that is capable of allowing access to a 53-foot trailer.
- Provide a minimum of two staff members to assist with loading units into the provided trailer.

Mattresses: Defined as any sleep surface covered with ticking or fabric that contains resilient material such as steel innersprings, foam, fiber or other filling or upholstery materials, used alone or in combination, regardless of size or shape. This definition includes foam mattresses.

All items accepted for recycling by MRC must have been used and discarded in the state of California.

Other Conditions:

- Out-of-state mattresses
- Severely damaged or soiled mattresses
- Mattress that have been stripped of padding components.
- Pillows and cushions
- Fold-out sofa beds and futon frames or bases
- Loose mattress pads, toppers
- Loose bedding, blankets, or sheets
- Water beds
- Fire damaged units







MATERIALS COLLECTION & HANDLING

Each facility's collection site will have unique operational considerations. Participating facilities must make their own decisions about how to best manage their operations in the safest manner possible in accordance with applicable laws. At a minimum, each facility's collection site must meet these requirements:

MINIMUM PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

SITE

Each collection site must be secure with adequate space and staffing to handle and store acceptable mattresses.

PERMITS

Each collection site must have knowledge of and comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws. These may include, but are not limited to, zoning requirements, state permit requirements and OSHA or other workplace requirements. Please contact your Local Enforcement Agency (LEA) to confirm whether your site is in compliance with all applicable notifications or requirements for accepting mattresses for

recycling at your site. In many cases, this will be your county or local Public Health Department.

INSURANCE

Each collection site must maintain general liability insurance of at least \$1,000,000 per occurrence.

TRAINING

Staff at each collection site must be trained and knowledgeable regarding these guidelines before accepting mattresses for recycling.

STORING & LOADING MATTRESSES

Collection sites must keep mattresses dry by storing in weatherproof containers or under cover to maximize their recyclability. In addition, all collection sites must:

Make every effort to place mattresses in MRC-designated storage containers

See page 10 for photos and guidelines

- immediately upon acceptance
 Keep mattresses intact and not intentionally crush or puncture them
- Efficiently stack mattresses to maximize the number of units loaded in each storage container
- Provide oversight to keep unacceptable items out of MRC-designated storage containers
- Remove any non-program materials from MRC-designated storage containers before transport to MRC recyclers
- Practice good housekeeping standards and keep storage containers and program materials in a neat and orderly condition

SITE ACCESS

Collection sites must allow MRC access to confirm compliance with these guidelines.

LOADING INFORMATION

LOADING MATTRESSES IN STORAGE CONTAINERS

Acceptable Loading

- **1.** Begin each stack with a queen or full size box spring. This acts as a base pallet to create a secure stack and makes unloading of mattresses quick and efficient.
- **2. Mattresses should be stacked horizontally** to the top of the trailer to maximize space.
- **3.** In small quantities, king size mattresses can be placed vertically next to a stack of horizontal mattresses.
- 4. If there are more than 10 king size units, stack horizontally.



Unacceptable Loading

IMPORTANT: Do not load units vertically or in an unsafe manner.

TRANSPORTATION & PROCESSING

TRANSPORTERS


MRC will assign each collection site a transporter to provide a storage container and transport services.

- MRC-contracted transporters will provide participating facilities with evidence of automobile insurance coverage of at least \$1,000,000 per occurrence.
- Each facility should notify transporter at least two business days before a storage container is full of mattresses if a permanent container is on site.
- The assigned transporter will pick up full containers within two business days
 of notification and drop off an empty container at the same time.
- On the scheduled pick up day, the facility must make the collection container readily accessible to the transporter.
- At the time of pick-up, facility staff must be present to sign a three-part Bill of Lading (BOL) supplied by the transporter that details the quantity of mattresses in the container and must provide appropriate copies of the BOL to the transporter.

A facility may choose to provide its own storage containers and transportation at its own cost. View a current list of locations that accept commercial volume at byebyemattress.com/programs-by-state/ca-commercial-sites/.

RECYCLERS

Recyclers under contract with MRC will meet established recycling standards and accurately account for all mattresses received, the mattress components recycled (e.g., foam, steel, wood, fiber, etc.) and any residual disposal. MRC will assign a recycler to best service your facility.



RECORDKEEPING

Bill of Lading:

A Bill of Lading (BOL) will be provided by the transporter. Before a full container leaves the site, the BOL must be completed and signed by facility staff.

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PROGRAM WITHDRAWAL & TERMINATION

An entity's participation in MRC's Commercial Volume Program is voluntary. Either party may withdraw from participation with 10 days written notice to the other party. MRC reserves the right to remove any entity not in compliance with these guidelines from further participation in the program.



Appendix D: GIS Methodology

Customer Analytics: MRC Convenience Analysis— Spring 2025 Technical Details



Summary

The Mattress Recycling Council (MRC) requested that Customer Analytics determine how many and what percent of the population in California has convenient access to recycle mattresses in California using the 2024 Collection Network. A combination of standard and spatial analyses was performed to determine convenience rates by geographic and consumer attributes.

A related analysis on the convenience for retailers to recycle used mattress was also requested. It shares many similarities to the consumer analysis and inputs from the consumer work were used to calculate convenience rates for retailers using consumer convenience as a proxy.

Details

To perform the analysis, MRC and Customer Analytics had to define:

- · Level of geographic detail the data can support
- What population data would be analyzed: Total, In Environmental Justice Communities, Rural
- Eligible collection network entities
- Convenience

Geography

The working geography for this analysis is 2020 Census Block Groups. Apart from census blocks, this is the smallest level of geographic detail for which data from government sources are available. It is also the smallest unit of geography for which information on dwelling type is available. This information is necessary for the analysis of certain types of collection programs.

The state of California has just over 25,000 Census Block Groups, which have an average population 1,500 people. Census Block Groups are subdivisions of Census Tracts, which are subdivisions of Counties. In other words, Block Groups roll up to Tracts which roll up to Counties. Each Census Block Group has a unique, 12-character ID.

The first 11 digits of that ID are the Census Tract the Block Group falls inside. The first 5 characters of the ID are the County. This allows us to transfer attributes of Counties or Tracts on to Census Block Groups directly.

Population

Small area population data was obtained from the US Census Bureau's American Community Survey (ACS). Customer Analytics downloaded block group and census tract level data for BR25033: Total Population in Occupied Housing Units by Tenure by Units in Structure from the 2019 to 2023 5-year ACS via the Census Bureau's FTP site. These data were summarized into the population living in single family dwellings and multifamily dwellings. The population living in households with less than 5 units is considered single family, 5 or more units is multifamily. This was required to support bulky item collection programs that only service single family dwellings described later.

Environmental Justice

One of the populations that MRC asked Customer Analytics to analyze separately is the population in Environmental Justice Communities ("EJ"). California's EnviroScreen 4.0 (October 2021 release) data was used to determine how many people in a Census Block Group are in EJ Communities. EJ Communities are those Census Tracts CalEnviroScreen defines as Disadvantaged Communities. Disadvantaged Communities are "the top 25% scoring areas from CalEnviroScreen along with other areas with high amounts of pollution and low populations." As previously noted, Census Block Groups roll up into Census Tracts, which allows us to apply the EJ Community status from Tracts to Block Groups. Once applied, an estimate for the population in EJ Communities for both single and multifamily populations were created.

The table below displays the total population and population by EJ Community status.

Rural

Part of the requested convenience analysis is to analyze convenience for the rural population of California. MRC requested that Customer Analytics define a rural county to be consistent with Cal. Pub. Res. Code § 40184, which in general defines a rural county as one that disposes of less than 200,000 tons of waste. See the Rural County List located in this appendix for the list of counties that are considered rural for the purposes of this analysis. The county's status as being Urban or Rural is then applied to the Census Block Groups within it, allowing various reports to be summarized by this status.

Retailers

Retailer convenience is determined by the same process used to measure consumer convenience, using consumer convenience as a proxy for retailer convenience.

There are two changes applicable only to retailer convenience analysis:

- Only those collection network facilities that accept units from commercial entities are included.
- The population in rural areas are considered to have convenient access if the distance to a site is less than 40 miles, while in urban areas it must be within 20 miles.

Collection Network Entities

The Mattress Recycling Council provided Customer Analytics a list of the entities that provide mattress recycling in California. This network of entities is composed of sites wherein consumers transport mattresses directly as well as bulky item programs where the mattress is picked up directly from the consumer's home.

The sites include permanent collection sites, recyclers and events. In all cases, the sites were marked as servicing consumers, commercial customers, or both. For residential convenience analysis, only those collection sites that service consumers or both consumers and commercial customers are considered.

The bulky item programs are classified in two different ways. The first type are those programs that participate with MRC's recycling program. The other type are other bulky item pick-up programs available to consumers that do not participate in MRC's program. For standard convenience analysis, only those that participate with MRC's recycling program are included.

In addition to segmenting between "participating" or "generally available" programs, bulky item programs are also classified by the consumers they service. All bulky item programs service single family dwellings, but some do not service multifamily dwellings. Both types are included in convenience analysis, but the multifamily population is excluded if the area is only serviced by a bulky item program that exclusively services single family dwellings and is not covered by a collection site.

Exclusively for the retailer convenience analysis Commercial Volume Program (CVP) consolidation locations were provided to Customer Analytics. These are fixed locations that are used to centralize pick-up for numerous retail chains in the State of California. Any retailer convenience analysis included these sites in addition to the permanent sites and recyclers that service commercial customers.

Collection Network Spatial Coverage

The two types of collection network entities require two approaches to determine the areas that they service.

Sites

MRC requested that Customer Analytics consider a collection site to service a consumer if they are within a 15-mile straight line distance of the site for consumer analysis. As individual consumer to site data are not available, the proximity of the Census Block Group is used to determine if the population within that Block Group is considered serviced or not using the population centroid of each Block Group. Customer Analytics uses the Haversine distance formula when calculating the distance between two points.

The population centroid is superior to the geographic centroid as it is more representative of the population living in that Block Group. This is particularly important in Block Groups with uninhabitable area such as bodies of water, forests, and deserts.

For a limited number of Collection Sites, there are residency requirements that limit who is eligible to recycle a mattress to residents of a city or one or more counties. A consumer must reside in those eligible geographies and meet the distance criteria to be considered to have convenient access.

Bulky Item

The bulky item programs service a consumer if they live within the area serviced by the bulky item collection program. Each bulky item program's service area is defined by ZIP code, municipal boundary, unincorporated areas within a county, or a description of their service area. Each Census Block Group in California was coded as being in or outside of the service area of one or more bulky item programs. Census Block Groups were identified using a ZIP Code to Census Block Group crosswalk developed by Customer Analytics. Through spatial joins in ArcMap, Census Block Groups were identified as being in a place or in the unincorporated areas of a county, when applicable, mapped to bulky item programs covering those areas. Description-based service areas were converted to boundary files, which were used to spatially select the Census Block Groups that fall within the area.

Customer Analytics: MRC Illegal Mattress Dumping Analysis — Spring 2025 Technical Details

Summary

The Mattress Recycling Council ("MRC") requested that Customer Analytics use multivariate statistical analyses to determine the following from the 2024 illegal dumping data:

- How preventative measures/opportunities for no-cost management of discarded mattresses affect illegal dumping.
- How demographic/socio-economic characteristics affect illegal dumping within a ZIP code.

As noted in the report, the data suggest that communities near select collection sites (i.e. Retailers; as well as Non-Profit and "Other", namely Local Businesses and Public Agencies, within 15 miles; and Renovators within its host zip code) and recyclers are associated with less dumping. While we were unable to statistically determine a relationship between dumping and collection events, it is possible that events do have an impact on dumping but that the 2024 data are not able to pick up this relationship. Likewise, we are yet to detect the effect of Bulky Item Programs on dumping.

ZIP codes with high concentrations of poverty, renters and multifamily dwelling types (e.g., apartment complexes) are associated with higher dumping rates. ZIP codes with higher concentrations of elderly persons are associated with less dumping. We should be careful to note that it is possible that persons outside of these areas may have dumped mattresses into these areas.

Data Source Details

Illegal Dumping

Illegal Mattress Dumping by member, ZIP code and month were provided by MRC. As the finest geography available with mattress dumping was the ZIP code, the data compiled to perform this analysis was narrowed down to the ZIP code level (by month). Data provided by differing types of boundaries (i.e., "places" and "tracts") were allocated to ZIP codes based on overlapping shares of populations within these boundaries.

Demographic and Socio-Economic Characteristics

CalEnviroScreen ("CES") 4.0 (October 2021) data were used as the source of Environmental Justice ("EJ") Communities¹, Pollution, Poverty, Total Population and % Elderly (Aged 65+) figures. CES's Pollution Burden Score was derived from their collection of numerous pollution exposure scores (such as ozone, pesticides, hazardous waste,

¹ "Environmental Justice" Communities, referred to as Disadvantaged Communities in the CES data.

etc.).² CES defines poverty as anyone living in a household with a household income that is up to two times the federal poverty level. CES's poverty data are sourced from the 2016 to 2020 ACS. Total Population as well as % Elderly were drawn from CES's spreadsheet which also draw from the 2016 to 2020 ACS. As these data are provided at the tract level, we produce a weighted average of these scores by the ZIP code where each tract's contribution to the average is weighted by the population within the tract.

Additional demographic characteristics, namely percentage of renting households or percentage of households in multifamily units, were derived from Customer Analytics' internal estimates which are derived from 2019 to 2023 ACS data.

MRC requested that Customer Analytics define a rural county to be consistent with Cal. Pub. Res. Code § 40184, which in general defines a rural county as one that disposes of less than 200,000 tons of waste annually. See the Rural County List included in this appendix for the list of counties that are considered rural for the purposes of this analysis. The county's status as being Urban or Rural is then applied to ZIP codes within the county.

Collection Network Entities

The MRC provided Customer Analytics a list of locations that accept mattresses for recycling as part of MRC's program for mattress recycling in California. This network of entities is comprised of sites wherein consumers transport mattresses directly to a site for recycling. The sites include permanent collection sites, recyclers and events. Also under consideration are bulky item programs, where the mattress is picked up directly from the consumer's home.

Model Details

A linear regression model was used to determine which factors were related to higher per capita dumping. To preserve reasonable distributions, we applied logarithmic transformations on the dumps per capita as the dependent variable for the main analyses.

We considered the Pollution Burden Score, % EJ, Poverty Score, % Elderly, % Renter, Rural ZIP Code (yes/no) and % MultiFamily Units in our analysis as these variables may capture some of the ZIP code's defining environmental and demographic characteristics. The presence of events, collection sites, recyclers and bulky item programs accessible to a given ZIP code were also considered to determine which of these programs potentially affect dumping behavior. Month variables (January, February, ..., December) were included to account for seasonality. Finally, the number of months for which a ZIP code reported dumps (1, 2, ..., 12) was taken into consideration, as the results may be affected by differential reporting rates by the level of cooperation of the ZIP code.







Customer Questions about the Mattress Recycling Fee



This list of frequently asked questions (FAQs) is here to help. Please share with your staff.

1. Why do I have to pay the recycling fee and what is it for?

State law requires retailers to collect a recycling fee on each mattress and box spring that is sold. The fee funds the state's mattress recycling program and provides for collection, transportation and recycling of old mattresses and box springs. The amount of the fee is the same statewide and is not controlled by individual retailers. More than 75 percent of a mattress can be recycled into new consumer and industrial products. The recycling program diverts valuable materials from landfill and helps keep bulky waste like mattresses and box springs out of the waste stream.

2. Who is the Mattress Recycling Council?

The Mattress Recycling Council (MRC) is a nonprofit organization that operates recycling programs known as Bye Bye Mattress in states that have passed mattress recycling laws. MRC was founded by the bedding industry and recycles more than 1.7 million mattresses each year. For more information about MRC, go to www.MattressRecyclingCouncil.org. To learn how to recycle your mattress or to find a collection location or event near you, visit www.ByeByeMattress.com.

3. If I don't plan to discard a mattress now, why do I have to pay this fee?

Even if you aren't discarding a mattress right now, mattresses don't last forever and will eventually be discarded. State law requires retailers to collect this fee on any mattress or box spring sale to fund the state's mattress recycling program. This program provides a network of participating cities, towns, retailers, recyclers and other organizations where old mattresses are collected for recycling at no additional cost to you. The fee also supports efforts to combat illegal dumping of mattresses and help keep our community clean.

4. If I decide to take my old mattress to a recycler myself, do I still pay the fee?

Yes, state law requires retailers to collect this fee on any mattress and box spring sale at the time of purchase to fund the mattress recycling program. You may receive a modest financial incentive if you drop off your used mattress or box spring at a designated recycling location. Visit www.ByeByeMattress.com to find the location nearest you.

5. I didn't pay this fee when I bought my old mattress, so will it be accepted for recycling?

Yes, the Bye Bye Mattress program will accept your old mattress no matter when it was originally purchased. To be recycled, units must be clean and dry. Normal wear and tear

is expected. Units infested with bed bugs or that are heavily soiled or damaged cannot be recycled.

6. My old mattress was "unacceptable" for recycling. Can you refund my recycling fee?

No, state law requires retailers to collect this fee on any mattress and box spring sale to fund the mattress recycling program. The law does not force retailers to accept every mattress for recycling out of concern for employee health and safety. Store policy, in addition to the guidelines of the recycling program, determine what we will and won't accept. If your mattress is unacceptable for recycling, contact your city or town to learn what disposal options are available.

7. What are the benefits of mattress recycling?

Mattress recycling programs offer many benefits for the community, state and environment, including:

- Less reliance on incinerators and landfills by diverting mattresses from the waste stream
- Reduces the number of illegally dumped mattresses
- Conserves resources by making used steel, foam and other materials available for use in new products
- Creates recycling jobs

8. What happens to my old mattress or box spring when it gets recycled?

Recycled mattresses are cut open and the layers are separated and organized by type. Wood is recycled and used as a fuel source or shredded to produce landscaping mulch. Foam, fiber and other soft commodities are compressed and turned into carpet underlayment or animal bed padding. Metal and box springs are extracted, sent to recyclers and used to make new appliances and building materials.

9. Will the Mattress Recycling Council or Bye Bye Mattress program pick up my old mattress from my home?

If your store takes back old mattresses:

No, but our store offers this service at time of delivery of your new mattress. (If your store recycles with the program, please let the customer know. Otherwise direct them to drop off their mattress at one of our free collection points listed on www.ByeByeMattress.com.)

If your store does not take back old mattresses, your response should be:

Mattresses are collected from a vast network of free collection sites throughout the state. These are typically public works yards or transfer stations. Your city/ town may also collect bulky items at curbside as part of your trash service. Visit www.ByeByeMattress.com to see what options are available. The Mattress Recycling

Council or the Bye Bye Mattress program does not pick up mattresses from customer's homes.

California Retailer Take Back Requirement

In California, mattress retailers are required by law to offer to take back old mattresses at no extra cost when delivering new ones. This applies to any method of delivery (in-house, third-party and even common carriers like USPS, UPS, FedEx). Your customer may be aware of this or mention having heard or seen this in an ad.

Please make information available on your website, in the purchasing process or in your shipping/delivery communications about how the pickup of an old mattress will work. Also consider sharing this information with those providing customer service.

We have audited the financial statements of the Mattress Recycling Council California LLC (a subsidiary of the Mattress Recycling Council) for the year ended December 31, 2024, and have issued our report thereon dated June 23, 2025. Professional standards require that we provide you with information about our responsibilities under generally accepted auditing standards and *Government Auditing Standards* as well as certain information related to the planned scope and timing of our audit. We have communicated such information in our engagement letter dated December 16, 2024. Professional standards also require that we communicate to you the following information related to our audit.

Significant Audit Findings

Qualitative Aspects of Accounting Practices

Management is responsible for the selection and use of appropriate accounting policies. The significant accounting policies used by the Organization are described in **NOTE A** to the financial statements. No new accounting policies were adopted and the application of existing policies was not changed during 2024. The application of existing policies was not changed during the fiscal year ended December 31, 2024. We noted no transactions entered into by the Organization during the year for which there is a lack of authoritative guidance or consensus. All significant transactions have been recognized in the financial statements in the proper period.

Accounting estimates are an integral part of the financial statements prepared by Management and are based on Management's knowledge and experience about past and current events and assumptions about future events. Certain accounting estimates are particularly sensitive because of their significance to the financial statements and because of the possibility that future events affecting them may differ significantly from those expected. We evaluated the key factors and assumptions used to develop Management's estimates and believe that they are reasonable in relation to the financial statements taken as a whole.

Certain financial statement disclosures are particularly sensitive because of their significance to the financial statement users. The most sensitive disclosures affecting the financial statements were:

The disclosures of related party transaction in **NOTE J** the liquidity disclosures in **NOTE K** and the restatement of the prior period disclosure in **NOTE M**.

The financial statement disclosures are neutral, consistent, and clear.

Difficulties Encountered in Performing the Audit

We encountered no significant difficulties in dealing with management in performing and completing our audit.

Corrected and Uncorrected Misstatements

We are pleased to report that no such disagreements arose during the course of our audit.

Management Representations

We have requested certain representations from management that are included in the management representation letter dated June 23, 2025.

Management Consultations with Other Independent Accountants

In some cases, management may decide to consult with other accountants about auditing and accounting matters, similar to obtaining a "second opinion" on certain situations. If a consultation involves application of an accounting principle to the Organization's financial statements or a determination of the type of auditor's opinion that may be expressed on those statements, our professional standards require the consulting accountant to check with us to determine that the consultant has all the relevant facts. To our knowledge, there were no such consultations with other accountants.

Other Audit Findings or Issues

Syclan Tetters of Corydon, P.A.

We generally discuss a variety of matters, including the application of accounting principles and auditing standards, with management each year prior to retention as the Council's auditors. However, these discussions occurred in the normal course of our professional relationship and our responses were not a condition to our retention.

Opinion

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS December 31, 2023 and 2024

NOTE A - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This summary of significant accounting policies of the **Mattress Recycling Council** – **California LLC** ("MRC – CA") is presented to assist in understanding MRC – CA's financial statements. The financial statements and notes are representations of MRC – CA's management who is responsible for their integrity and objectivity. These accounting policies conform to generally accepted accounting principles and have been consistently applied in the preparation of the financial statements.

Purpose of the California Recycling Operations:

The California (CA) Used Mattress Recovery and Recycling Act, as amended ("the Act") requires manufacturers of mattresses sold in CA to develop, finance, and implement a convenient and cost-effective program to recover and recycle used mattresses generated in CA. The Act is administered by MRC – CA. MRC – CA funds its operations through a \$10.50 per unit recycling fee collected from consumers when they purchase a mattress or box spring (see NOTE N). MRC – CA is required to perform a financial statement audit under accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America and the generally accepted *Government Auditing Standards* issued by the Comptroller General of the United States of America to satisfy the state of California's certified audited financial statement requirement in accordance with the State of California Section 42990 of the Public Resources Code.

MRC – CA is one of three operating wholly owned subsidiaries of the Mattress Recycling Council, Inc. ("MRC"). MRC also operates recycling programs in the states of Connecticut and Rhode Island. In addition, MRC has formed a new subsidiary in Oregon during 2022, which is a non-operating LLC as of December 31, 2024 (see **NOTE G**). MRC is a not-forprofit corporation incorporated on November 14, 2013 under the laws of the State of Delaware and organized and operated for purposes consistent with recognition of exempt status under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3), including, without limitation, to work to establish an environmentally sound and cost-effective program for recycling of sleep products. MRC is a subsidiary (under current accounting standards) of the International Sleep Products Association ("ISPA") due to common control.

MRC – CA's significant accounting policies are as follows:

Basis of Accounting and Separately Stated Financial Statements of MRC - CA:

The financial statements of MRC – CA have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting and, accordingly, reflect all significant receivables, advances, prepaid expenses, payables, accruals and other liabilities.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS December 31, 2023 and 2024

NOTE A - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Basis of Accounting and Separately Stated Financial Statements of MRC – CA: (continued)

On an annual basis, MRC – CA's financial statements are included in the consolidated group financial statements of MRC. These financial statements of MRC – CA have been issued as a subsidiary of MRC for the years ended December 31, 2023 and 2024. MRC – CA's December 31, 2023 and 2024 separately stated financial statements are prepared due to the request of the Board of Directors of MRC and the State of California. See **NOTE J** for related party transaction disclosures.

Basis of Presentation:

As a wholly owned subsidiary of MRC, a 501 (c)(3) not-for-profit organization, the financial statements of MRC-CA have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting. MRC – CA reports information regarding its financial position and activities according to two classes of net assets: net assets without donor restriction and net assets with donor restriction.

<u>Net Assets Without Donor Restriction</u> - Net assets that are not subject to or are no longer subject to third party-imposed stipulations. The board designated reserves are included in net assets without restrictions.

<u>Net Assets With Donor Restriction</u> - Net assets whose use is limited by third party-imposed time and/or purpose restrictions. MRC – CA has no net assets with donor restriction as of December 31, 2023 or 2024.

Revenues are reported as increases in net assets without donor restriction unless use of the related assets is limited by third party-imposed restrictions. Expenses are reported as decreases in net assets without donor restriction. Gains and losses on investments and other assets or liabilities are reported as increases or decreases in net assets without donor restrictions unless their use is restricted by explicit third-party stipulation or by law. Expirations of restrictions on the net assets (i.e., the third party stipulated purpose has been fulfilled and/or the stipulated time period has elapsed) are reported as reclassifications between the applicable classes of net assets. MRC – CA has adopted a policy to classify restricted revenues as without donor restrictions to the extent that donor restrictions were met in the year the revenue was received.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS December 31, 2023 and 2024

NOTE A - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Basis of Presentation: (continued)

MRC – CA established a financial reserve policy to provide for short-term and long-term financial needs. It is the policy of MRC – CA to include in its unrestricted net assets, approximately three months of its annual operating expenses. Once MRC – CA has met the unrestricted net asset objective, MRC – CA seeks to maintain a total reserve target of approximately 60% of its annual operating expenses.

Income Tax Status:

MRC is exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. However, income from activities not directly related to MRC's tax-exempt purpose is subject to taxation as unrelated business income. MRC – CA is considered a disregarded entity for federal income tax purposes. MRC – CA's activity and mission are consistent with those of its Parent company, MRC. The subsidiary's financial operations are reported on a consolidated basis with MRC's tax-exempt Federal Form 990 filing. MRC – CA is subject to franchise tax in the state of California. No taxes were owed as of December 31, 2024.

MRC has adopted the authoritative guidance relating to uncertainty in income taxes included in ASC Topic *Income Taxes*. These provisions provide consistent guidance for the accounting for uncertainty in income taxes recognized in an entity's financial statements and prescribe a threshold of "more likely than not" for recognition and de-recognition of tax positions taken or expected to be taken in a tax return. MRC performed an evaluation of uncertain tax positions for the year period ended December 31, 2024, and determined that there were no material matters that would require recognition in the financial statements or that may have an effect on its tax-exempt status. As of December 31, 2024, the statute of limitations for MRC's income tax return for the years ended December 31, 2021, 2022, and 2023 remain open with the Federal, state, and local authorities. It is MRC's policy to recognize interest and/or penalties related to uncertain tax positions, if any, in income tax expense.

Cash and Cash Equivalents:

For purposes of the statement of cash flows, MRC – CA considers all unrestricted highly liquid investments with an initial maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS December 31, 2023 and 2024

NOTE A - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Accounts Receivable:

Accounts receivable are stated at the amount management expects to collect from outstanding balances. Management provides for probable uncollectible amounts through a charge to earnings and a credit to valuation allowance based on its assessment of the current status of individual accounts. Balances which are still outstanding after management has used reasonable collection efforts are written off through a charge to the valuation allowance and a credit to accounts receivable. For the years ended December 31, 2023 and 2024, the balance of the allowance for doubtful accounts was \$152,327 and \$148,985, respectively.

Revenue Recognition:

Mattress retailers pay MRC – CA a per unit mattress recycling fee based on the number of mattresses and box springs sold within the state of California on a monthly basis, and report their monthly unit sales to MRC – CA. The recycling fee is mandated by the state of California. MRC – CA recognizes mattress recycling fee revenue in the period a mattress is sold by a retailer.

Property, Equipment, Depreciation and Amortization:

MRC – CA capitalizes all expenditures for property and equipment in excess of \$1,000. Purchased property and equipment are carried at cost. Depreciation is computed using the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the assets.

Use of Estimates:

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the consolidated financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS December 31, 2023 and 2024

NOTE A - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Investments:

MRC – CA has adopted Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 958 Not-for-Profit Entities (formerly Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 124, *Accounting for Certain Investments Held by Not-for-Profit Organizations*). Under FASB ASC 958-320, investments in marketable equity securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in marketable debt securities are valued at their fair values in the statements of financial position. Realized and unrealized gains and losses are included in the change in net assets.

Functional Allocation of Expenses:

The costs of providing the various programs and other activities have been summarized on a functional basis in the statement of activities and in the statements of functional expenses. Accordingly, certain shared costs have been allocated among the three operating state programs (CA, CT, and RI) based on supporting services benefiting each program. Shared general and administrative expenses include those expenses that are not directly identifiable with any other specific function but that provide for the overall support of MRC, including expenses related to contracts with third-party vendors. Total shared costs are allocated to the respective operating states on a monthly basis. For the years ended December 31, 2023 and 2024, approximately 90% of the shared expenses not directly identifiable with any other specific function but that provide overall support of MRC were allocated to MRC – CA, which is based on relative state population of CA as it relates to CT and RI.

Operations:

In the financial statements, revenues earned and expenses incurred in conducting the programs and services of MRC – CA are presented as operating activities. Non-operating activities include investment return, gains or losses on the sale or disposal of property and equipment, if applicable, and other non-operating items.

Reclassifications:

Certain accounts in the prior year's financial statements have been reclassified for comparative purposes to conform with the presentation of the current year financial statements.

NOTE C - INVESTMENTS

At both December 31, 2023 and 2024, MRC – CA's investments consisted of approximately 80% and 79% conservative fixed income products, respectively, and the remaining 20% and 21% are invested in U.S. and International ETFs and mutual funds, respectively. All investments are exposed to various risks, such as market and credit. Due to the level of risk associated with investments and level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investments, there is always a possibility that changes in risks in the near term could materially affect investment balances and the amounts reported in the financial statements. MRC – CA has an investment policy statement that is reviewed by the MRC Board annually which addresses these risks. The portfolios are reviewed on a quarterly basis and changes are made as needed, within the scope of the policy.

NOTE E - NET ASSETS

As of December 31, 2023, and 2024, total net assets without donor restrictions available for general operations of MRC – CA amounted to \$31,570,751 (restated - **NOTE M**) and \$20,004,927, respectively. MRC – CA's Board has a reserve policy to establish a board designated financial reserve to operate CA's recycling program over a multi-year period. As of December 31, 2023, and 2024, the Board has designated \$20,666,231 and \$8,185,807 of its \$31,570,751 and \$20,004,927 total net assets, respectively, as a financial reserve which is consistent with the requirements under the (CA) Used Mattress Recovery and Recycling Act.

The remaining net assets in the amount of \$10,904,520 and \$11,819,120 are undesignated as of December 31, 2023 and 2024, respectively. Undesignated net assets equal approximately three months of annual budgeted expenses for the upcoming year.

NOTE G - COMMITMENTS AND CONTINGENCIES

Product Care Association Consulting Fees:

MRC has outsourced its registration, billing and collection functions to Product Care Association (PCA), a third-party vendor which operates out of Canada. PCA manages the seller registrations, collects and reviews the monthly sales reports from various mattress retailers/sellers, invoices these sellers and collects the fee income on behalf of MRC. During the years ended December 31, 2023 and 2024, the total expenses incurred related to PCA consulting fees were \$259,366 and \$408,325 respectively, and MRC – CA's proportionate allocation of those expenses was \$232,193 and \$278,099, respectively, which is included in administration expense (management, staffing and general expenses) on the Statement of Activities.

Concentration of Service Provider:

For the years ended December 31, 2023 and 2024, five recyclers accounted for approximately 68% and 70% of MRC – CA's total recycling costs, respectively, and approximately 80% of the units recycled, respectively.

Note Payable – line of credit:

In May 2022, MRC entered into a line of credit agreement with M&T Bank. The principal amount on the line is \$1,000,000 and calls for a variable interest rate of 2.42 % above the greater of the Prime Rate or 3.25%. The line of credit is secured by collateral of the assets of MRC.

There were no draws on the line of credit in 2023 or 2024, therefore there is no interest expense related to the line of credit in 2023 or 2024. The line of credit was closed in January 2025 (see **NOTE N**).

NOTE G - COMMITMENTS AND CONTINGENCIES (continued)

New State Program:

On March 24, 2022, the State of Oregon approved a law that requires a mattress recycling program be implemented in the state. Mattress Recycling Council (MRC) will implement and run the Oregon state recycling program, and on June 24, 2022, Mattress Recycling Council Oregon LLC (MRC – OR) was formed as a subsidiary of MRC. As of December 31, 2024, MRC – OR is a development stage non-operating LLC. The Oregon state recycling program is expected to begin on January 1, 2025 (see **NOTE N**). The formation of this program in Oregon had no financial impact on MRC – CA in 2023 or 2024.

NOTE H - CONCENTRATION OF CREDIT RISK

MRC – CA maintains its cash and cash equivalents balances in three U.S. financial institutions. The balances are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) and the Securities Investor Protection Corporation (SIPC). The FDIC insures up to \$250,000 and the SIPC insures up to \$500,000 (including up to \$250,000 for cash) as of December 31, 2024. MRC – CA's investment firm also maintains additional insurance coverage through an outside insurer which provides excess protection of up to \$400 million per account. At December 31, 2024, MRC – CA's uninsured cash balance was \$0 and uninsured investment balance was \$0.

NOTE I - FAIR VALUE OF FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

Generally accepted accounting principles define fair value, establish a framework for measuring fair value, and establish a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

A fair value measurement assumes that the transaction to sell the asset or transfer the liability occurs in the principal market for the asset or liability or, in the absence of a principal market, the most advantageous market. Valuation techniques that are consistent with the market, income or cost approach are used to measure fair value.

The fair value hierarchy prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value into three broad levels:

<u>Level 1</u> – These inputs are quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that MRC – CA has the ability to access.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS December 31, 2023 and 2024

NOTE I - FAIR VALUE OF FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS (continued)

<u>Level 2</u> — These are inputs (other than quoted prices included within level 1) that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly. These inputs may include quoted prices for the identical instrument on an inactive market, prices for similar instruments, interest rates, default rates and other similar data.

<u>Level 3</u> – These are unobservable inputs for the asset or liability and rely on management's own assumptions about the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability. The unobservable inputs should be developed based on the best information available in the circumstances and may include MRC - CA's own data.

MRC – CA estimates that the fair value of all financial instruments at December 31, 2023 and 2024 does not differ materially from the aggregate carrying values of its financial instruments recorded in the accompanying Statement of Financial Position.

NOTE J - RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS (MRC)

MRC – CA is one of three operating wholly owned subsidiaries of the Mattress Recycling Council, Inc. ("MRC"). MRC also operates recycling programs in the states of Connecticut and Rhode Island. MRC is a not-for-profit organization incorporated on November 14, 2013 under the laws of the State of Delaware and organized and operated for purposes consistent with recognition of exempt status under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3), including, without limitation, to work to establish an environmentally sound and cost-effective program for recycling of sleep products. MRC is a subsidiary (under current accounting standards) of the International Sleep Products Association ("ISPA") due to common control.

These financial statements include the intra-entity accounts and transactions between MRC – CA and MRC. Due from MRC includes participant funds for the recycling program collected by MRC on behalf of MRC – CA. The following transactions below are included in these separately stated financial statements, but are eliminated in the consolidated MRC financial statements:

Operating Agreement with MRC:

For the years ended December 31, 2023 and 2024, MRC – CA was required to pay a monthly service fee in the amount of \$309,500 and \$375,000, respectively, which represents the anticipated costs incurred by MRC for administrative, financial and operational support services to the LLC. At the end of each quarter a reconciliation is prepared for a "true up" of actual costs MRC – CA incurred versus the monthly fee charged, and any surplus or deficits are reimbursed by the respective party.

For the years ended December 31, 2023 and 2024, MRC – CA incurred expenses of \$4,328,710 and \$4,605,526 related to this agreement for administrative and management fee expense including MRC – CA's portion of shared staff expenses and staff expense for in-state personnel. MRC recorded the associated management fee revenue in the same amount. The administrative and management fee expense charged by MRC has not been eliminated in these financial statements as of December 31, 2023 and 2024.

NOTE K - LIQUIDITY AND AVAILABILITY OF FINANCIAL ASSETS

MRC – CA has financial assets as of December 31, 2024, consisting of cash and cash equivalents of \$5,915,289, unrestricted investments of \$7,084,321, net accounts receivable of \$3,509,277, other accounts receivable of \$1,979, due from MRC of \$1,048,501, and investments for financial reserve of \$8,185,807, which total \$25,745,174. Included in these financial assets is the board designated investments in the amount of \$8,185,807, set aside for the financial reserve in order to comply with state regulations in CA. These board designated financial assets are not available for general use.

MRC – CA considers all expenditures related to its ongoing recycling programs, as well as the services undertaken to support these programs to be general expenditures. As part of MRC – CA's liquidity management, it has a policy to structure its financial assets to be available as its general expenditures, liabilities and other obligations come due. In addition, MRC – CA invests cash in excess of daily requirements in investments which include conservative fixed income products, U.S. and International ETFs and mutual funds.

In addition to financial assets available to meet general expenditures over the next 12 months, MRC – CA has a financial reserve to assist with operational liquidity if needed.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS December 31, 2023 and 2024

NOTE L - RECENT ACCOUNTING PRONOUNCEMENTS

In June 2016, the FASB issued guidance (FASB ASC 326) which significantly changed how entities will measure credit losses for most financial assets and certain other instruments that aren't measured at fair value through net income. The most significant change in this standard is a shift from the incurred loss model to the expected loss model. Under the standard, disclosures are required to provide users of the financial statements with useful information in analyzing an entity's exposure to credit risk and the measurement of credit losses. MRC – CA adopted the standard effective January 1, 2023. As of December 31, 2023 and 2024, MRC-CA did not have any financial assets that were subject to the guidance in FASB ASC 326.

NOTE M - RESTATEMENT OF THE PRIOR PERIOD

During the year ended December 31, 2024, a necessary adjustment was identified to the MRC-CA's previously issued financial statements. During 2024, a mattress retailer informed MRC-CA that they remitted to MRC-CA \$693,407 in recycling fees for the month of July 2016, and that it should have remitted \$412,555 for the July 2016 remittance. The retailer requested MRC-CA to refund the difference of \$280,522. MRC-CA and the retailer settled on a payment of \$210,210. The agreed amount was subsequently refunded in 2024 to the retailer. The refund of the overcharges was recorded as an adjustment to previously stated financial statements and affected the previously stated accounts as discussed below:

CA Recycling Fee:


The State of California approved MRC – CA's proposal to increase the recycling fee per unit from \$10.50 per unit to \$16.00 per unit. The \$16.00 per unit fee will be effective January 1, 2025.

New State Program:

The Oregon state recycling program began on January 1, 2025, and is funded by a \$22.50 per unit recycling fee on the sale of each mattress and foundation sold in Oregon.

Line of Credit:

Report on Internal Control Over Financial Reporting

In planning and performing our audit of the financial statements, we considered MRC – CA's internal control over financial reporting (internal control) as a basis for designing audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances for the purpose of expressing our opinion on the financial statements, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of MRC – CA's internal control. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of MRC – CA's internal control.

A deficiency in internal control exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct, misstatements on a timely basis. A material weakness is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control, such that there is a reasonable possibility that a material misstatement of the entity's financial statements will not be prevented, or detected and corrected on a timely basis. A significant deficiency is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control that is less severe than a material weakness, yet important enough to merit attention by those charged with governance.

Our consideration of internal control was for the limited purpose described in the first paragraph of this section and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control that might be material weaknesses or significant deficiencies and therefore, material weaknesses or significant deficiencies may exist that were not identified. Given these limitations, during our audit we did not identify any deficiencies in internal control that we consider to be material weaknesses. However, material weaknesses may exist that have not been identified.

Dear Mr. O'Donnell,

As you are aware, per 14 CA ADC § 18968, for inclusion in the Mattress Recycling Council (MRC) annual report, the CalRecycle-appointed Mattress Recycling Advisory Committee ("committee") must provide the MRC with comments. In particular, 30 days before the July 1 deadline for the MRC's annual report, the comments must summarize the "consultative process between the advisory committee and the mattress recycling organization relating to the ongoing implementation of the plan, as well as any other information deemed pertinent by the advisory committee to maximize the recovery and recycling of used mattresses in the state."

The following is our summary of the Consultative Process:

Through regular meetings, as well as email and telephone consultation or in-person contacts, members of the Mattress Recycling Advisory Committee provide input to staff and management of the MRC/MRO. These exchanges are brought to the full committee as agenda items in instances where a resolution is requested or a motion is needed for an official recommendation or action. Additionally, at its regular meetings, the committee includes informational items, updates, discussion items and motions for proposed actions, including the MRC/MRO in the discussion for the purpose of consultation. The Committee was impressed with regular updates from the MRC at the Committee meetings, especially the education components.

The following is "other information deemed pertinent by the advisory committee to maximize the recovery and recycling of used mattresses in the state."

Appointments to the Committee:

The committee needs CalRecycle to appoint new committee members when vacancies open. To accomplish the committee's legislative and regulatory duties and to provide the MRC with expert advice from a variety of perspectives, the committee needs more members. In 2014, the committee included 13 members. With a new resignation yesterday (due to a job reassignment), the committee currently has only five members. The Vice Chair of the committee also recently experienced an employment-related change, and CalRecycle did not respond to requests by the committee member and the committee to authorize her to stay on the committee through either a

transfer of the membership or a reappointment. Please communicate to CalRecycle the need for CalRecycle to fill vacancies on the committee.

Recycling Rate:

To carry out its consultative duties mandated by legislation and regulation, the Advisory Committee requires adequate data for analysis. The most basic metric for measurement of mattress program progress is the annual mattress recycling rate. As in prior years, the committee continues to seek information regarding this rate. In 2024, the committee became more specific about this need for data and took actions to request assistance from the MRC and CalRecycle.

In a 1/11/24 letter to CalRecycle Director Rachel Wagoner, the committee advised CalRecycle and the MRC of perceived flaws in measurement of the mattress recycling rate. In response, a 5/24/24 Request for Action, approved by CalRecycle 6/28/24, stated "additional time would be necessary to understand how waste characterization studies could be used to improve the recycling rate calculation" and recommended use of a formula based on counts of recycling, renovation, and disposal. In an action at its 10/1/24 meeting, the Advisory Committee sent a follow up letter, noting the committee does not object to the formula, provided accurate numbers could be determined for recycling, renovation, and disposal. However, the committee noted that data used for the current rate calculation does not seem to provide this accuracy. As noted in the follow up letter, the 2023 rate calculation totals 1,977,808 mattresses, but 3,383,382 mattresses were sold in California in 2023. The population of California is not growing quickly, and the number of mattresses per person is not likely to be greatly increasing each year, so the committee noted the difference indicates the data used for the recycling calculation seems to be inadequate.

At its 10/1/24 meeting, and in a subsequent letter to CalRecycle Director Zoe Heller, the committee requested CalRecycle's mattress recycling staff and the MRC work with the committee to gain a better understanding of the recycling rate, and to potentially develop alternative data sources.

The committee considered that many mattresses are reused after a first user passes it on to family, friends, or others. However, nearly everyone in California already has a mattress, so the average mattress sold into California likely displaces an existing mattress, regardless of how many times a mattress is reused. Additionally, both MRC staff and CalRecycle staff maintained that the longevity of mattresses made sales figures in one year a mismatch for recycling plus disposal in that same year. For example, according to MRC studies, the average mattress lasts more than 14 years. Also, enrollment in many colleges is increasing, and housing on campus is increasing as well. To address that concern, the committee examined data for multiple years. The results of that examination show that the large difference between the number of mattresses sold in 2023 and the combined total of mattresses recycled and disposed in 2023 is not an anomaly. In every year examined, the number of mattresses sold greatly exceeds official totals of mattresses recycled, refurbished, and landfilled.

Availability of Timely and Accessible Information

Another matter discussed by the committee in 2024 and formulated at its 10/1/24 meeting into a letter to CalRecycle Director Zoe Heller, related to additional information needed by the committee to meet legislative and regulatory duties, per PRC 42985-42994 and 14 CCR § 18968. Prior to the committee's annual report, the committee requested that CalRecycle provide the committee with the report usually included in CalRecycle's RFA considering approval of the annual report. This includes a summary of CalRecycle enforcement actions (number and types of enforcement actions). This would help the committee complete the "consultative process" required for programmatic review. Additionally, the committee requested CalRecycle provide a quarterly summary of CalRecycle costs for this enforcement so the committee can review the MRC's approximately \$700,000 in annual payments to CalRecycle. The committee requested a summary of charges by category that CalRecycle sends to the MRC each quarter. While much of this information may be available through interpretation of publicly available documents, timely and facilitated review by the committee would improve the committee's capability for program evaluation.

Illegal Dumping

The committee would like to acknowledge the good work of the MRC in many areas, and in particular in addressing illegal dumping. Previous reports have covered this topic sufficiently, and we look forward to this year's report as well. The efforts and challenges are significant, and additional work in this regard is appreciated.

The independent financial audit shall include:
