



California Mattress Recycling Program for the Lodging Industry

In 2013, California enacted The Used Mattress Recovery and Recycling Act which requires the mattress industry to create a recycling program for mattresses and box springs used and discarded in the state.

The new law does not require hotels that generate used mattresses to recycle them.

Hotels located in the state may deliver mattress discards to an MRC contracted recycling facility for no-cost recycling.

The Mattress Recycling Council (MRC) is a non-profit organization established by the mattress industry and certified by CalRecycle to plan and manage the California mattress recycling program known as Bye Bye Mattress.

As of December 30, 2015, retailers and other businesses selling mattresses began collecting a recycling fee on each mattress and box spring that is sold to California consumers and large volume users. These fees are remitted to MRC and used to recycle mattresses and combat illegal dumping.

Benefits of Participating

Participating hotels no longer incur mattress recycling costs. MRC uses collected recycling fees to pay for the recycling of the mattresses throughout California.

Recycling mattresses conserves natural resources and benefits the environment. Program participants divert mattresses from landfills and allows materials like fiber, foam, steel and wood to be used in other consumer products.

Participation Requirements

- Keep mattresses dry
- Schedule delivery time with the MRC contracted recyclers
- Transport mattresses to recycler
- Complete required paperwork upon arrival

Which items are accepted and not accepted by the program?

Most mattresses and box springs discarded in California are eligible for the recycling program. Mattresses from out of state sources are ineligible.

We are unable to accept:

- Severely damaged, wet, twisted, frozen or soiled mattresses or box springs
- Items infested with bed bugs
- Mattress pads or toppers
- Sleeping bags
- Pillows
- Car beds
- Juvenile products such as carriages, baskets, bassinets, dressing tables, strollers, and playpens or their pads
- Infant carriers, lounge pads, or crib bumpers
- Water beds or camping-style air mattresses
- Fold-out sofa beds
- Futons and furniture

Am I required to recycle mattresses through your program?

No. You may continue to discard mattresses through your established relationships.
